## 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Wrap Up – News Trends & Stories Part II

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**C. Austin Fitts:** Ladies and gentlemen, welcome to The Solari Report. This is Part II of News Trends & Stories with Dr. Joseph Farrell. We had a great conversation last week on Financial Markets & Economy & Geopolitics and we did the Trump Report Card. If you haven't heard it, I strongly recommend you do.

I particularly want you to hear a very long treatment that Joseph and I did on the AI Invasion. My contention is the 'Rape of Russia' is coming to America in the form of an attack at the molecular level that will look very different from the 'Rape of Russia'. I would encourage you to listen to it. We build these websites dynamically as we go through the different parts of the rollout during the month of the entire Wrap Up. The News Trends & Stories piece is done, and I encourage you to see it.

Joseph and I were very daring because we recorded this early – before the end of the quarter. There was so much and I wanted to get this to you as quickly as possible, particularly the part on the AI Invasion.



Now we are ready to launch into the second part. It's usually ten stories, but this time it's nine because I took one from Geopolitics.

We are going to be covering Culture, Science & Technology, the Space Race, and Food & Health. So, Joseph, welcome back to The Solari Report.

**Dr. Joseph Farrell:** Thank you for having me.

**Fitts: Story #1: Can Chinese 'Rule of Law' attract Financial Liquidity?**

This is the #1 story in Culture.

**Farrell:** My guess is: No, not in its current form. We talked about that during the first part of this Wrap Up.

I think that Mr. Xi – and probably much of the party leadership – recognizes that they can't go on as they are, precisely because nobody trusts them. In fact, I have a friend who has told me that in Indonesia they would probably trust the Russians before they would trust the Chinese.

**Fitts:** That's saying a great deal.



**Farrell:** I think this goes back to what we were talking about with the culture agenda that I think is coming down the pike in China. They have to create a different kind of culture that has some moral basis that is not rooted in party ideology and is something that can take hold of the average Chinese. I think that is what they are confronted with, and that is what they are going to try to do. I don't know exactly how.

I don't see it happening now because there is no rule of law. What you have is, essentially, a very unrepresentative government that is ruled by decree rather than by law. It's ruled by ideology rather than law and that never works.

I question whether it is 'rule of law' and I think that is really why people don't trust the Chinese. Is it 'rule of law'? No, it isn't.

**Fitts:** When I was in Hong Kong, the message was that if we got rid of the estate tax, plenty of money was going to be coming this way because they are looking for a safe haven. I think that is one of the reasons there was such an attack by the Americans on Switzerland and the other safe havens. America is trying to make itself out to be the safe haven of choice, and the reality of our rule of law at this point leaves much to be desired compared to Switzerland.

**Farrell:** Speaking of Switzerland, I think I sent you the story that there is a movement now in Switzerland to nationalize the money lending power and take it away from the banks altogether.

**Fitts:** They had the referendum that lost last week, but just getting it on the ballot put the fear of God into a lot of people, and I think it's a message to the central bank: "No more funny business".



**Farrell:** And China is going to have to do the same thing. I think the other reason there is a fundamental lack of trust in them is precisely their finances and their financial institutions. They are playing fast and loose, as we know.

**Fitts:** *The Economist* has been that hitting hard. I'm quoting *The Economist* a good deal in this Wrap Up, but *The Economist* has been hitting hard on China as a surveillance state, and I think that one reason may be that the Anglo-American Alliance wants to make sure that it holds that brand as the premier rule of law in the financial liquidity world. But I think that China is a police state.

**Farrell:** Oh, it obviously is. We are a police state, too, but we are pretending that we are not. That bodes some long-term problems for us as well. We are losing trust all around, also.

In China's case, you have the whole history of the communist movement in that country that is standing against them, and they know that. That is why I think that there is some sort of fundamental change that is going to come down the pike, but it is going to be long-term.

**Fitts:** Back to, "You heard it here first," I remember a couple of years ago when you insisted that I knew the role of culture and where this was going. I didn't begin to understand it any way the way that you did. You really focused me on it, and everything that you said has all come to pass.

**Farrell:** How so?



**Fitts:** This is where the competition is going, and this is where all the key financial centers are falling down on the job. They are feeling the tension of, “How do you keep the cash flows going but return virtue to the process?”

The reality is that the people who stole all the money can't return virtue to the process.

**Farrell:** They can't do it because it's partly a cultural phenomenon. In some cases, I don't think they have even been exposed to the idea of virtue. You have an entire class of financial narcissists as well.

Everybody is saying that Trump's election – Giuseppe Conte in Italy, Sebastian Kurz in Austria, Geert Wilders in the Netherlands, Marine Le Pen in France – are populist revolts. They are not populist revolts; they are cultural revolts. Until people wake up and understand that, they are not going to understand the phenomenon.

I think that the revolts are visceral. In other words, I think that there may be some that are consciously focused on the idea; they are fighting to be able to listen to Beethoven without paying a jizya – Sharia law tax – or something similar. But I think that for many people it's visceral right now. I'm hoping that will change.

If people wake up to the fact that it's the culture that is under assault from their own domestic political leadership and financial class and the policies that they are pursuing, the better off they will be.



Culture is something that spans the political spectrum, and in this country, whether it's Democrats or Republicans, culture expands that spectrum. That is particularly true in Europe.

I don't see this issue going away. I just wish that people would start waking up and understanding that is what we are in.

**Fitts:** How much of the problem here is that artificial intelligence really has trouble incorporating culture?

**Farrell:** It can't.

**Fitts:** Particularly because the people who are designing and writing the algorithms don't have any.

**Farrell:** Exactly and that is the problem.

**Farrell: Story #13: Family Wealth: Asia For; the West Against.**

Since World War II we've watched a concerted effort by the Western leadership to destroy family, family loyalty, and family wealth. Part of the control and concentration of capital and cash flow is that you centralize all the wealth instead of allow the family to control it. Part of this is small business turning into big business.

The West is really in the process of eroding and destroying the family. Asia is all family organized. You trust the family and nobody outside of the family.



We recently had a great Solari Report on the Abacus Bank story from New York; the Chinese bank that was targeted by the prosecutors after the bailouts. It was the only bank that was prosecuted. They took him to court with over 150 charges, and they won all of them in a jury trial. It was quite an amazing story, but it was the story of a Chinese family. You really see the focus on family.

In the process of doing the research on the Asian Consumer, I called a very dear and brilliant friend of mine who is half Chinese and half European. I said, “What did the Chinese in America feel about all these various things happening?”

She said, “Look, you need to understand that nobody cares about any of that. We care about our family and building family wealth. We’re too busy; we don’t have time for any of this – not the LGBT issue or transgender bathrooms or the swamp drama. All that is not even on the people’s radar. It’s not real.”

**Farrell:** It’s not real, and to those cultures that are more traditionally grounded, it’s just another example of the insanity – if not of the West, at least of America.

**Fitts:** When I was in Australia and New Zealand, their reaction to the swamp drama was, “America is over.”

**Farrell:** I get that a lot from people, and I sense it myself . The cultural aspect of this has become downright insane. If we are preoccupied about bathrooms, there is no better way of saying, “It’s over. It’s just nuts.”



**Fitts:** To a certain extent, are we talking about a media phenomenon that is coming from a small group of people, as opposed to the general population?

**Farrell:** You're talking about a weaponized community, and I use the term 'community' very loosely. The assumption that is made when you use that word in association with transgender and 'LGBTXYZ' and the complete alphabet soup is that they are all left-wing socialist progressives, and they are not. But you are dealing with something that has been created that has been weaponized.

I think it's a cultural thing because I think that this is coming out of the influence of Antonio Gramsci and his cultural Marxism. I think it's coming out of the Frankfurt school – Theodor Adorno and Herbert Marcuse – that were imported into this country after World War II at the University of Columbia. I think that this is where it's coming from, and they have somewhat taken over the 'quackademy'. This is a national security issue that we are going back to.

We are stupid; Americans as a people are stupid.

**Fitts:** The report that I am getting is that the big difference in culture is: Are you family-centric, or, basically, computer-centric, or TV-centric?

The other is: What the Americans are communicating is the extent to which the Asians feel and see themselves as vastly superior to the Americans. The Americans are essentially stupid patsies.



I think that this disdain for the Americans is going to turn into a very significant thing. What is interesting is that I've heard this from approximately 20 different states in talking to people, and also the messages that the Asians have no interest in integrating into the community and they have no interest in multiculturalism. They are very anti-culturalism, and this is not being discussed.

What we are discussing are things that are nowhere near as important as this, and this is a major event in almost every major city in America.

**Farrell:** This is another aspect of what I mean when I say 'own the culture'. By owning the culture, I don't mean becoming involved in these issues. I mean, "Turn them off. Ignore them."

**Fitts:** The information that I'm getting is that the Asians are doing a very good job of ignoring the message and building wealth.

In other words, the Americans are focused on the TV, and the Asians are focused on the pocketbook. They are buying real estate and fixing up real estate and getting their children in college. They are totally focused on building the pie for themselves.

**Farrell:** We used to call it 'the Protestant work ethic'.

**Fitts:** Except for one thing. The other impression that I'm getting – and this is not only the Asians; it's everybody – is that the younger generation is so mindlessly focused on money and so material that they are rather lost.



**Farrell:** The way that I look at it, money is not the end; it is the means. If you are focused on making money, then you have no culture. You have no goals and you have no cultural purpose or anything like that. We have to get back in this country the idea of vocation.

If you are a believer in God, you believe that there is a purpose for your life and it doesn't necessarily have to be as a clergyman. All vocations have a certain sanctity, and they are worth doing well.

**Fitts:** At our dinner table when I was a child, everybody was very competitive. Both my mother and father's families were very competitive. Everything was about who had done the most for the human race.

On my father's side, my grandfather had started the Fitts-White Clinic in Jackson, Tennessee, and then he and his partner decided they weren't educated enough, so they shut it down and went to the Mayo clinic. They did another residency, and then they brought penicillin back to Tennessee. We had a family member in the state legislature, and they succeeded in getting the laws passed so that they could bring in penicillin, and they introduced penicillin to Tennessee.

My father would say, "Do you know how many lives your grandfather saved? What have you done today?"

Then when my father came home from World War II where he had worked in the MASH operation. They had taken the University of Pennsylvania hospital and moved it to Burma in the Burma China theatre, and he did trauma in a MASH unit.



When he came back, he redesigned how the emergency centers in the country should work. He was a Rockefeller Scholar at the University of Pennsylvania. That plan was rolled out at emergency rooms across the country, and he became the head of the Society of Trauma. The whole idea was, “How many lives have I saved?” It was a competition.

My grandfather – and I don’t agree with him now, but he was a Dean of the Wharton School, and then Dean of Social Sciences at the Rockefeller Foundation –was responsible for the Green Revolution. He thought that it had saved a lot of lives and fed many people. He was ousted by the Dulles brothers and was promoting decentralization, and the Dulles brothers got him removed from the Rockefeller Foundation.

I could go on and on. My uncle started the first transplant center in South Carolina. Everything was about, “What have you done to change the world? Are you a ‘Who’s Who’ in America? What is your contribution?”

If you had come to that table and said, “I make a lot of money,” most people would have looked at you and thought, “What a putz! Get him out of here! Grow up! This is a table for adults.”

Who is the merchant in *The Merchant of Venice* – Shylock? They would say, “Go play Shylock elsewhere.”

I was always interested in making money. I was always the child who had the lemonade stand and was hustling to babysit. They thought that there was something about me that was a little shady.



So, this idea of having a culture where all you care about is how much money you have and who makes money is ‘nuts’. I once got into a really interesting situation on the Sallie Mae Board where the CEO and the CFO were just talking about making money, making money, making money. It was a strategic planning session, and I didn’t say a word.

It got to me at the end of the day, and the CEO said, “Austin, I think that everybody should talk at these meetings and you haven’t said a word.”

I said, “You know, Larry, the reason I haven’t said a word is because I don’t know how to relate to a goal of making money. I think at Ford they want to make great cars and make money doing it. At a software company, I think that Steve Jobs wants to make great software and make money doing it. Making money is a performance evaluation that helps tell you whether you are doing a good job at achieving your goals, but it’s not a goal.”

If I told everybody in my company at Hamilton, “Your job is to go make money,” they wouldn’t know what to do. It’s a performance metric; it’s not a goal.

He tore into me and ripped me apart. I’ve never seen a CEO at a board meeting tear a board member apart like that. He finished with me, and then the Vice Chairman of JP Morgan – they had all these bankers on the board, and I tell this story in my article, *William Diefenderfer: The Financial Hitman of Student Loans* – said, “Larry, Austin has tried to tell you what we have been trying to tell you all day. We are so appreciative of her willingness to be more forthright because we have been subtle. What you need to understand is that we all agree with her, and you need to listen to her.”



I could have fallen off my chair; the CEO almost fell off his chair; the CFO almost fell off his chair.

Of course, this was all before they changed the rules so they could make more money doing student loans that defaulted people as opposed to succeeding. So, it was that crew; they were quite a ‘piece of work’.

Sallie Mae was supported by Federal credit, but you can’t have a real business, let alone a family or an individual, when the goal is a performance metric, except maybe organized crime.

**Farrell:** It’s doing the simple things to reinject some of that.

When I took the dog for a walk, I noticed that my neighbors to the west were having a cookout. There were many people in the front yard having a cookout, and the children were playing. That is what we need to do.

**Fitts:** I think the people who ignore the drama and build family wealth are the people who are going to build the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

**Farrell:** Yes, and it’s important to remember that wealth is not money.

**Fitts:** Right; absolutely. If you want to know what I mean by that, watch *The Abacus* story if you haven’t already, which is a fabulous documentary. It was nominated for an Oscar. It didn’t win it, but it was made by the same person who made *Hoop Dreams* and it’s fabulous.

#### **Story #14: Promoting Women: The Rise of the Asian Consumer.**

One thing that is clear when you look at statistics on the rise of the Asian consumer is that this is going to be a trend that is so big because -



you're talking about 800 million people coming into the middle class. That is almost three times the size of America.

**Farrell:** We've already seen Saudi Arabia making the initial moves to make their women consumers. This is what is going to be driving the undoing of that fundamentalist version of Islam that we have been struggling with.

**Fitts:** I believe this month is when women can start driving cars in Saudi Arabia.

**Farrell:** It is this month. I don't know what changes there have been in their property laws or things like that, but this is an inevitability. They need half of their population being producers and consumers, and they haven't had it.

**Fitts:** The statistics that I was looking at were that 70% of the purchases in the Asian middle class are by women. I think that one of the goals behind running Hillary Clinton and having Hillary Clinton be President was a consumer branding strategy.

**Farrell:** It was optics to do this.

**Fitts:** America wants to win the Asian female consumer. There is no doubt about that.

I've watched for 50+ years – my whole lifetime – the procentralization team roll the local team by offering 'a better deal to women and minorities'.



It made me extremely annoyed when Jon Corzine did this during election when he was Senator. He said, “You should vote for Democrats because we’re for women and minorities, and those local white boys are selling you out.”

I wrote a complete article about, “Well, Jon, you and your partners when you were laundering the drug money in Mena, Arkansas were not helping the Popsicle Index. My cousin, Bob, is protecting me from your drug gang. So, I’m going to stick with the parochial ‘local boys’.”

We seem to have seen a bit of softening of the ‘promoting women’ branding message.

**Farrell:** I think there is a number of phenomenon behind that. I think the perception is out there that the promotion of women was anti-men, and I think there was a backlash about that – at least in this country. I can’t speak for outside of this country.

You occasionally see these news reports with Tucker Carlson, for example.

**Fitts:** He is so amusing.

**Farrell:** He did a series about the anti-men agenda where he was talking about what was happening to men in society. I think that backfired because it was really packaged wrongly. The optics were all wrong, especially with Hillary.

**Fitts:** Right. If they had had a really fabulous woman, it would have looked totally different.



**Farrell:** What they needed was a Margaret Thatcher.

**Fitts:** Exactly. They needed a ‘shopkeeper’s daughter’. That’s the moral of the story: Get a Thatcher.

Anything else under ‘Promoting Women: The rise of the Asian consumer’? One thing that is very interesting that I wanted to mention was that when you study the rise of the Asian consumer, you realize that the rise of the American consumer very much worked around bigger houses, cars, and the suburbs. The rise of the Asian consumer is a story about megacities, driverless cars, and homes with very small square footage because China has 1.4 billion people in a country that is slightly smaller than the US.

We’re talking about the ‘rise of the Asian consumer’ that has to buy something other than a house and a car, so you are talking about entertainment, education, and much more of the invisible assets – software, gadgets, and games.

This notion of you talking about culture, culture and creativity, and imagination, and movies, and games – the percentage of consumption in the ‘rise of the Asian consumer’ has to be much more nonmaterial and digital. That is going to be very interesting. That is why you saying about Xi Jinping looking at religion and philosophy is so important.

If you can’t create a major economic boom on the religion culture side.

**Farrell:** They need the human productivity, not the AI. This is precisely why I think they are targeting cultural issues as part of their strategic planning.



They have to in a certain sense and I think that eventually, everybody is going to have to.

**Fitts:** I don't know if you've ever read the PRC constitution, but it's race-based. It is basically for the Han race. So how do you build financial liquidity and build a great global brand if you are racist?

**Farrell:** It's another trust issue. It will eventually have to be addressed; they simply cannot avoid it. There are some parallels even with Japan in that respect.

**Fitts:** You're right and Japan has struggled with it.

**Story #15: Inhumanism: Censorship & the AI Invasion.** I spent a good deal of time talking to Richard Dolan about fake news, using the fake news to really come back and censor, and to censor in a very inhuman way. That is what the AI invasion does. It comes after you sneakily. They don't just ban the book; they ban the subject, and you can't see it.

If you ban me openly, I can fight you. But if you are playing all these sneaky, tricky games at the subatomic level, there is nothing that I can fight.

**Farrell:** It's back to commas, dots, and typewriters.

**Fitts:** The question that I get a lot from subscribers is: How do we fight the inhumanism?



**Farrell:** I'm going to be repeating myself here. First of all, watch your language. The major part of mind manipulation comes through language. Look at hypnosis. By the mere power of words and suggestion, you are planting thoughts and actions into people. You have to watch your language.

I'm picking on this issue. When they are pressing gender neutral pronouns, watch that you don't use them. Watch that you are not following an agenda.

**Fitts:** Don't refer to an Alexis machine as 'she'.

**Farrell:** Use 'mankind' instead of 'humankind'. It's the 'Office of Personnel' not 'Human Resources'. The language is telling you something about the cosmology, and the spirituality, and philosophy behind it. It's 'morals' not 'ethics' and 'virtues' not 'values'. Restore the traditional language because when you do that, you are restoring the cosmology behind it. Then you expand this idea into the arts. Don't patronize the ugly. Don't patronize art galleries that are selling Jackson Pollock. (I'm picking on him.) Support the beautiful.

I think I told you this a few reports ago. I have a magazine subscription to *Fine Arts Connoisseur* and one of the issues covered an art contest in China, and they put pictures of sketches, drawings, and so on by these Chinese art students, and it was like looking at the notebooks of da Vinci. They were training them in all the crafts of the high tradition of the Western visual arts, and it was stunning and I was 'blown away'.



I had to ask, “Why China?” This is not part of their artistic culture. They have a very different representational art.

This is what I mean by owning the culture. You have to sit down and do a detailed inventory of where you are aiding and abetting the agenda, even if unconsciously, by going along with all this claptrap. Then once you start doing this, I guarantee you this will work if you start watching your language and how you present these concepts. If you start using the traditional language, it will change your outlook on the world and you will be able to spot – almost immediately – when you are being fed an agenda.

This is all important, and these are small steps, but that is what it takes. You have to start with small steps and then go to the big ones.

**Fitts:** I also think that any time you can remove from your life any personal organization that behaves this way, just do.

**Farrell:** What is the clue to those people? Listen to their language. That will tell you much right there about where they’re coming from or what type of philosophy has been injected into them – be it from education or the media or what have you. Listen to their language.

**Fitts:** I get into so many conversations when I’m travelling with people who suddenly attack me with what sounds like a programmed line. When they do it, I immediately try to shift the conversation because it’s a trap. It’s a trap where no communication can occur.



What I am interested in doing is having a very productive human dialogue. So, I will immediately shift to try to get out of the trap and back to something where we can have a real human conversation.

**Farrell:** ‘Dialogue’ is another one of those buzzwords from Marxism. “You dialogue with me, and you compromise your position.” That is really what that is.

People tell me, “I want to have a dialogue with you,” and I will just bluntly tell them, “I’m not interested.”

**Fitts:** When I try to shapeshift the conversation, I am trying to get back to an intimate space where we can learn. What just happened was a programmed line that shuts off learning. It’s like a trap door that shuts the learning down, and I’m trying to move back to someplace where I can get to a learning model.

**Farrell:** That is dialogue in the classical sense, ‘through the word’. In that sense, that is a very good word. It has become such a buzzword in today’s society. Everything in language has become coopted by all sorts of agendas. It’s very difficult now to avoid buzzwords, but I think if people start concentrating on that, it will become apparent what has been occurring –right in front of our eyes or right under our nose – with many of these things.

Start there. Start taking the small steps, and then expand from there once that habit of thinking becomes habitual. Then you can expand to other areas of your life.



**Fitts:** One of the things that I've seen in my life is that there are thousands of moments when I avoid trouble because I can see it coming. My challenge is how to communicate to the subscribers the ability to do the same thing.

One way I can avoid trouble is I can see it, and one of the reasons I can see it is because I understand reality. I can understand reality because I don't engage in material omissions, with the rare exception where I don't think it's a material omission, but where I am sworn to confidentiality or I have concerns about other people's confidentiality – whether I'm sworn to confidentiality or not.

I'm trying to protect people from getting hurt, but I don't engage in material omissions. I think most of the independent media does. I don't think that you do, but I think that many do.

If you look at who my allies are, they are my allies because they don't engage in material omissions.

**Farrell:** The idea of the independent media engaging in material omissions, I think that is primarily a cultural phenomenon. It's because most people have not been trained adequately in academic standards of citation and reference and giving credit to sources. I really think that is a huge part of what you see happening in the alternative media.

If I open up a book that someone recommends to me and I flip through the entire thing and there's not a footnote in it, I don't automatically reject it, but it immediately raises questions in my mind: Why can't this person cite the actual source they are using?



**Fitts:** I'm guilty of that because I'm an investment banker; I'm not an academic.

**Farrell:** Everybody does it to a certain extent. The problem is that you have all these articles here. You are citing sources here for what you are arguing in each point on this outline.

What I'm getting at is that we are dealing now with a culture of people who are just 'spitting stuff' out, and there is nothing by way of any reference to it.

**Fitts:** You're right and I always try to put references in. My challenge with the financial system is that when I come to the conclusion that Planet Earth is a REIT and we are paying it dividends, that comes from thousands and thousands and thousands of data points, and I'm trying to make a pattern that explains them all.

It's interesting. Harry Blazer has basically read and gone through every data point. He has drilled down, and it has taken him thousands of hours. Now he understands what I'm saying, but he had to learn so many different stories and data points.

**Farrell:** When you are dealing with a media culture that is not used to doing that, we don't have a tradition left anymore of a real, honest, investigative journalism. That is because it requires that type of drill-down, get into the details, and cite your references.

**Fitts:** I think a big push is coming to censor. I just look at what I'm dealing with, and I think that the push is coming.



I think that we need to push back. The reason you need to push back is because you need a map of what is going on to protect yourself.

**Farrell:** The pushback can be as simple as watching the language. That is a form of pushback. There is a professor, Jordan Peterson, in Canada who has created a firestorm. He is pushing back on this gender-neutral language business, and has created a firestorm – only one person over words.

**Fitts:** It's good. Now we're moving into Science & Technology.

**Story #16: 5G, Cybersecurity & the AI Invasion.** We keep coming back to the AI invasion. 5G is coming, and it's going to make a very significant impact on our health, on our connection to multimedia content, and the ability to deliver holograms with false flags. It's going to take false flags to a whole new level. Combine that with artificial intelligence, and who knows where this goes?

You've seen that wonderful hologram of the whale jumping out of the gym floor. It's quite amazing.

**Farrell:** Let's go further here with AI, and cybersecurity, and fake news, and censorship. AI is getting to the point where you can actually make things up, and put it out there, and have it seem plausible. I think that this has been beta tested because you can go online and look up peer reviews, and there have been papers submitted to scientific journals that have been accepted and published that were written by an AI, and they sounded completely plausible. It's a bunch of academic 'gobbledygook'.



I recall the old professor – the fake professor – who would go on Johnny Carson and talk a stream of academic nonsense, and everybody was laughing. It's a very serious thing when you get to the point where you have a piece of paper in front of you or an article on something that is supposedly scientific, and it's all been generated by a computer.

If you can do it with science, then you can do it with news, you can do it with market reports, and you can do it with books, and so on.

This is a big concern. It's going to happen, and they are going to wed it to all the holographic techniques.

**Fitts:** We read and hear and see much about cybersecurity. The reality is all these systems were designed intentionally to not be secure. So, cybersecurity, in my opinion, is not possible.

I've been working on a cybersecurity plan for Solari Advisors. Basically, our goal is, within a reasonably short period of time, to have any confidential information offline with an air gap on the theory that these systems can't be secured.

**Farrell:** They are not secure. I've taken to the extreme of writing my books offline because I had the bitter experience with *Roswell and the Reich*-writing that book- when that book came out, Annie Jacobson's book came out right after that, which completely obfuscates the whole story, and there is not a footnote in the book. It's all whistleblowers and 'this, that, and the other'.

This has happened more than once. People keep asking me, "What are you writing about?" and I simply don't say anything.



**Fitts:** You say to me that you're not going to tell me, and I say, "Fine. No problem. I just need to know when to review it and promote it."

**Farrell:** It's not that I don't trust people; it's just that I don't trust these cyber systems.

**Fitts:** They are totally untrustworthy, and they were designed to be totally untrustworthy. It's a control system.

I didn't say this when we discussed censorship, but I want to be prepared because I think the time has come to syndicate our efforts to protect each other.

**Farrell:** I think not only that, and I'm very serious about this: People have to have the analog technologies – typewriters, mimeograph machines (the old purple machines).

**Fitts:** Six months ago, I ordered a new typewriter from Romania, and I still haven't gotten it. I'm going to be in Romania next month and I'm tempted to call the factory and say, "Look, I'll just pick it up."

**Story #17: The Ionized Sky & the AI Invasion.** We won't talk about the space fence because Elana Freeland and Harry did a wonderful interview on that. You have to listen to it and I strongly recommend her book, *Under an Ionized Sky*.

**Farrell:** I'm reading it now.

**Fitts:** What do you think?



**Farrell:** I'm not into it very far. I read her first book and I liked it immensely and I think that she has 'nailed' a lot of things.

**Fitts:** Talk about footnotes – she has many footnotes.

**Farrell:** That is one of the first things I noticed about her books. She is researching and presenting where she is getting the material so that the reader can genuinely evaluate things. That is the hallmark of good research. It's not that people have to agree with you; it's rather that they are being given a basis on which to formulate their own ideas and opinions about it.

**Fitts:** I think that she has done some remarkable research.

There is the good news on space, and there is the bad news on space. It's part of making all the atmosphere, and all the animals, and all the living things on the planet accessible to AI. I want to just keep discussing this point.

You are putting particles into everything – the trees, the plants, the cattle, the dogs, the cats, the people, everything. You are putting metallic particles into everybody and everything that I believe can ultimately be accessed by software. You're making everything part of the net.

**Farrell:** At a minimum what you are doing is increasing the efficiency of any living organism as a biological transmitter and receiver. Once you do that, you are making yourself much more susceptible to the Borg – to electromagnetic manipulation and so on.



This is real and I can't emphasize this strongly enough. If you doubt me, go online and start pulling up mind control patents that are public.

**Fitts:** I'm very much hoping that the Truthstream Media's documentary comes out this year. They are doing a documentary on the history of mind control, and they've done a great deal of deep diving on the patents.

I got a message this week from a wonderful ally. When she listened to my Money & Markets she said, "Oh, my heart hurts."

I don't want to talk about the space fence and the ionized sky to hurt people's hearts, but I do want them to understand that there is an effort to create a reality. I don't know if that effort is created as a result of our leadership being afraid of a geophysical event. I don't know if it's being done because our leaders are really alien and they are invading. I don't know if it's because our leadership is 'nuts'.

I believe that there is a logical reason they are doing it; definitely a reason.

**Farrell:** We'll get back to that because I have something to share.

**Fitts:** The way that we can turn this in a more positive direction, among other things, requires looking it squarely in the eye and not being afraid of it.

Listen to the Solari Report and read *Under an Ionized Sky*.



**Story #18: The Falling Cost of Renewable Energy.** The price of energy is plummeting, and the battery technology is getting better. We have reason to believe that within a reasonable period of time fossil fuels are going to be gone. I don't know when, but it will happen.

**Farrell:** I think that it is going to be sooner than many people think. I suspect that the generation after ours may see it. If not that generation, then at least the millennials will see the beginnings of it.

**Fitts:** AI development is moving fast. Prices this year are going up for a variety of reasons, but the trend and direction of technology is taking that energy price much lower, and it's dramatic. I would be more worried about the squeeze on the balance sheet from higher interest rates and higher energy prices if it wasn't for that.

Now moving into Space. **Story #19: The Space Race.** Tell us about what is happening in space.

**Farrell:** We've been speculating they are in a hurry, and you mentioned geophysical change. You don't know whether it's because some of our leaders are genuinely alien. It's increasingly looking possible. They are behaving and promoting all of these inhuman agendas – geo-farming the earth and all of this.

I don't know if you recall the comet that had the strange Hawaiian name, Oumuamua. It was a long, slender object. Richard Hoagland made me aware of this when we were talking prior to one of his shows that we were going to do. The name apparently means 'messenger' in Hawaiian. It was on a course through the solar system –



– if I remember the details correctly, and there is always a chance that I don’t– close to Earth.

The mere physical shape – and I saw the picture of this and it didn’t look like a comet. This is not a big ball of ice hurtling through space. This is a long, slender, cylindrical object that looks like a cigar hurtling through space, and they named it ‘messenger’.

Then suddenly we heard, “It’s not on any such course.” Hoagland went online and found a picture of the comet after the course apparently had been corrected. There was an infrared glow on the front of this, and I’ve seen the picture. His speculation was that this was something coming in as a message in a bottle, and that somebody fired a nuke at it and hit it, and the infrared was the signature nuke, and that averted the object.

**Fitts:** Where would it have landed if it hadn’t been averted?

**Farrell:** I don’t think that it was on an impact course, but it was coming close. What I find interesting there and plausible about his speculation and his hypothesis is that I remember the Chelyabinsk meteor that occurred in Russia a few years ago, and a month before that, Prime Minister Medvedev was talking about the necessity for an Earth international cooperation to build an asteroid defense system. If nobody wanted to cooperate, then Russia would have to go ahead and build one themselves.

“How are we going to take them out?”



We're going to take them out with our nuclear weapons and other means," and he never specified what 'other' meant.

I thought that was very interesting. It may be that they are working on some celestial timetable because it seems very apparent they are in a big hurry about space.

**Fitts:** On one hand you could say, "Look, everybody knows that the person who is dominant with space weapons dominates the earth," but the reality is that if you look at the level of cooperation that is going on behind the scenes, they are cooperating.

That would argue more for a risk coming from the solar system.

**Farrell:** They are cooperating, yet they are not. If you follow the space stories; I've been watching this since Hoagland published his *Monuments of Mars* book long ago. He was interviewed on Larry King. That's how long I've been watching this whole thing.

It's very odd. They are cooperating at some level, but at the same time you find the European space agency will release these pictures of planetary bodies – particularly Mars – without comment, and there is something all over it. It's not geophysical form matter and they will do this without comment. The Japanese released a couple of pictures after their moon probe that they sent there, and the Indians did the same thing. They are releasing this without comment.

**Fitts:** I think that there is a very high probability there is a civilization on the moon and on Mars.



**Farrell:** I think there is a high probability that there was; I can't speak about now. My point here about raising the fact that they are releasing these strange pictures without comment is I think they are sending messages to the USA. What they are saying is, "We know what you saw and what you found."

The Russians, in particular, have been doing this on the QT for quite some time. I think there is something about space that the people in the know are aware of or suspect, and this is part of the big reason for the hurry into space. In my opinion and speculation, it's not merely about building out international redundancy for financial clearing; it's not merely about locking down the planet. It's about something else that they are suspecting.

**Fitts:** One of the things that most disturbs me is that I look at the trends, and there is an old story that I republished on The Solari Report this week from the *Huffington Post* about the fact that global IQs are falling. So, we have oxygen falling, we have the dynamism of the electromagnetic field falling, and we have IQs falling, and I suspect that there is a connection.

If you are the leadership and are looking at that, I would definitely say we need to diversify our planets. We should not bet the ranch on one planet because all planets become stars, right?

**Farrell:** No. Stars can go nova. There are certain planets that could and are viewed as quasi-stars; Jupiter and Saturn being examples, the big gas giants. I think they are in a hurry to get out there.



Whether it's because they think this planet is dying and we need to abandon the cattle down here and get ourselves off this planet – I don't know what the agenda is.

I suspect it goes back to what I said at the Secret Space Conference in Bastrop; there is some sort of cosmic Versailles that is in place, and they may have violated it. That is what they are afraid of.

**Fitts:** Really? They didn't violate it with respect to mandated vaccines.

**Farrell:** Viewed a certain way, the spraying operation is perfecting the slaves and perfecting the capital. It's collateralizing everybody, and that frightens me, too.

**Fitts:** What I see is them putting into place is the infrastructure they need to bring back a more overt form of the whipping machine. I've always said that my problem with this group of people is they believe in slavery, and they are now creating the conditions to return slavery on an enormous scale.

Anything else you would like to mention about space? I will say this. I love seeing a President who thinks that space is important and exciting and communicates that. Somebody did a poll recently showing that the majority of Americans agreed that the International Space Station was a good investment. That is a good sign.

**Farrell:** But why does Trump go to Miramar and give that strange speech where his wording was very close to, "We need another Space Corps"? Say what?



**Fitts:** You get the feeling that he slips up and lets too much out, and we love it. The military is going, “Oh, God!”

**Farrell:** Oh, no. I think that was a deliberate slip-up, I really do.

**Fitts:** It could have been.

Next is Food & Health. Now that we have metallic nanoparticles raining down on us from everywhere.

**Story #20: Disappearing Disclosure & the AI Invasion.** One of the things that we see is disappearing disclosure. Amazon has pulled the labelling and Bayer has basically provided shelter.

Here is an interesting thing. One of the most inspiring things I’ve ever seen is the extent to which the hatred that Monsanto inspired destroyed their brand. It killed the company, and they had to sell out to the Germans. Now the Germans have killed the name, and they are going to try to resuscitate it. Bayer has a beautiful name, and everybody loves Bayer aspirin, right?

**Farrell:** Yes, but Bayer was also one of the major corporations that went into a small entity called IG Farben. So as far as I’m concerned, the rebranding could probably have been a little better. I don’t call it ‘IG Farben-Santo’ for no reason.

**Fitts:** Bayer becomes quite an agricultural juggernaut now.

**Farrell:** Oh, it’s huge! I keep telling people that if you look at the companies that make up IG Farben, who do you have?



You have Bayer, BASF, and all of these big German chemical companies that are still here. So, what is going on?

**Fitts:** The meta-structure can just pull anybody in.

**Farrell:** The meta-structure is there, and since we are talking about Merkel, where did her big financial backing come from? It was from these big chemical companies.

**Fitts:** GMO Geopolitics: Putin is definitely winning.

**Farrell:** Yes, he definitely is. I saw that one coming ten years ago. If you look at Putin – and I had a member of my website do a really interesting blog about what the real Russia collusion is – and the speeches that he has made over the years, he is challenging, point by point, all the favorite dogmas of the Western globalists.

**Fitts:** Remember I said with globalization, the goal was to use food to replace oil as backing the world currency, and this effort to get GMO adopted globally would fail. It was a currency play, and it would fail. I just want to recognize the Indians because it was hundreds of thousands of Indian farmers who stopped it and it failed.

**Farrell:** It failed there, and it has failed in Russia. What puzzles me here is that no one is looking at Russian agriculture. During the days of the Soviet Union when they had more land and much greater potential agricultural productivity under the Soviet Union, they couldn't make it work.



Now that they have less land and are no longer the Soviet Union, their agriculture is booming. I think part of the reason it's booming is that Russia has said absolutely no to GMOs. So, they have positioned themselves to answer the organic movement for organic food, and I think this is really what is at the core of the Russian sanctions. They don't want Russian food coming here.

**Fitts:** Here is the question: Is the global spraying happening in Russian airspace?

**Farrell:** That is a good question, and I do not know. The problem there is that if you are engaging in a geoengineering program, it doesn't matter what any other sovereign nation decides because that is eventually going to spread to their country as well.

**Fitts:** I'll tell you that when you are in Australia and New Zealand, it's nothing compared to what it is here. You go to the San Francisco Bay Area, and feel like you are walking through a fire. It's so foggy from the spray, and everybody is sick. The complaints of sickness and autoimmune disease is so high. Everybody is so sick, and nobody knows why.

It's interesting. There is a reporter who teaches at Columbia Journalism School who wrote a book called *Nomadland*, which I've started to read. It's about Americans who came through the financial crisis and decided they couldn't afford the real estate, they couldn't afford their home, so they live in vans, and RVs, and their cars.

One of the things that she writes about is describing a woman who is staying with her daughter, and everybody is sick. The children are sick, —



the parents are sick, and if you look at all the different physical ailments that they are dealing with, nobody can survive that. But it's devastating for the family finances.

**Farrell:** And it helps big pharma in the process.

**Fitts:** The interesting thing is that because I basically was kicked out of the establishment, I had to find a way to be my own doctor. I had to use every natural economic tactic there was, and I really believe that it saved my life. If I had kept participating in the Western system, it would have ended differently.

One of the reasons I'm so healthy is because I never go to the doctor, so I never get talked into believing that I have something that requires some expensive drug or therapy that is going to kill me.

**Farrell:** If you look at the medical business in this country, it's designed to keep people sick. That's how they maximize and optimize their profits.

Why bother curing cancer when you can make large amount of money from chemotherapy and surgeries and all of this? It's 'nuts, totally nuts'.

**Fitts:** I find that health really combines with this ability to avoid trouble. I feel so lucky most of the time. There is just a whole world of trouble that I avoid. Part of it is by avoiding the health system and I see things coming, and I can navigate.

I'm 67 years old, and I'm running all over the world. I told you the story of when I landed in Brussels a year ago, and I tried to buy a senior ticket on the train.



The man got really mad at me. I was just sitting there with my backpack in chinos, and he said, “You’re not a senior. You Americans are so greedy,” and he became really upset.

I pulled out my passport and showed him my age. He said, “Holy cow! You’re 66! Okay, you look good.”

**Farrell:** I absolutely think that entire medical ‘health industry’ in this country is the reason we are watching the strange suicides of so many natural doctors or doctors who are challenging through vaccine studies, or cancer research, or whatever the established line. I think they don’t want any alternative out there.

**Fitts:** To control people, you need them to be afraid. If they are healthy, then they are not afraid. If they are healthy, then they can find a way to stay in a higher consciousness and build a pathway in a positive way.

This is about coherence and about who creates our future. Healthy people create their own future. Healthy people don’t give up their love.

Those are our top 20 stories. Before we go on to ‘Go Local and Unanswered Questions’, do you have anything else about the top stories?

**Farrell:** Not right now.

**Fitts:** We’ve had this column, ‘Food for the Soul’ and you inspired me to do it. It was one of my efforts to improve our coverage of culture. It turned out to be one of my favorite things on The Solari Report.



People love it because you suddenly stop covering the AI invasion and start looking at this wonderful celebration and exhibit of da Vinci's etchings.

The person who writes it is marvelous. If you haven't checked out Food for the Soul, go do it.

Next is 'Go Local'. I do want to point out that New Mexico turned down smart meters.

**Farrell:** Good for New Mexico!

**Fitts:** We put links up in our News Trends & Stories, so you can find more about the person in the group who did it. We used to have an expression on Wall Street, 'unrelenting, unceasing, unremitting pressure'. This man is an intellectual juggernaut, and just overwhelmed the public utility commission with all the data and statistics. He went out and gathered the facts.

The reality is that smart meters raise prices and has all sorts of health issues, and it's 'bad, bad, bad'. It doesn't increase efficiency at all and they were able to do it.

I see many things happening at the local level that are positive, and I think the question is: How do you create systems locally that have integrity? Our systems don't have integrity. Unless we are able to function locally without the one-way mirror, the AI invasion continues to control.

**Farrell:** More power to New Mexico. Good for you!



**Fitts:** I think that one thing that is going to happen is the EMF radiation will cause a wave of cancer and illness. Ultimately, the same pushback that got Monsanto is going to get the telecommunications companies.

Unanswered Questions. What is on your list?

**Farrell:** Two things: The Robert F. Kennedy assassination and his son coming out and saying that he doesn't think that Sirhan Sirhan killed his father. If there is any case in American history for a Manchurian patsy, it's Sirhan Sirhan. All the signs are there – the famous girl in the polka-dot dress. I have always thought that was a post-hypnotic suggested trigger for him. His behavior before and after and ever since, his susceptibility to hypnosis – both from prosecution and defense psychiatrists and other psychiatrists looking at him and analyzing him at a distance. It's all pointing in that direction.

If people are not aware of that case and the mind control implications, they need to start reading up on the assassination of Robert Kennedy.

**Fitts:** One of the things that I think is significant is when John Jr. started to go public about his own father's assassination, he died in a plane accident.

Robert Kennedy Jr. has been very brave on vaccines, and now he is talking about his dad's assassination, and he is still alive and that is a change.



**Farrell:** That is a change. It either indicates that he has something and they're afraid and they don't know where it is, or he has some protection or it could be both.

**Fitts:** It could be both, but I also think that he has been very effective about how he has done all this. I think that he is a very effective man.

The other thing that I wanted to ask you about is: What in the world is going on at the Vatican? The Vatican was a major presence at Bilderberg.

**Farrell:** Yes, I wrote that down. I don't know how to do this without going all around "Harvey's Barn". I'm going to try to give you a CliffsNotes version.

Years ago, I wrote a book. You have that four-volume study called *God, History, and Dialectic*. In the very last chapter of this – and I wrote this about 20+ years ago – I predicted that the Roman Catholic Church, the Vatican, would be caught up in globalism simply by dint of the nature of papal claims themselves. You have to remember that the papacy – even at Vatican II where they were changing their spots – and if you read the documents of Vatican II, the only time that you can find a traditional language expression of a Roman Catholic doctrine is precisely the papacy.

It was a papal-led revolution, and those claims – lest people forget, which were more or less codified at Vatican I back in 1870 and 1871 – are not only that the Pope, when speaking on faith or morals 'ex cathedra', speaks 'ex consensu ecclesiae' (when he speaks without the consent of the church) but also, in that counsel, they defined papal jurisdiction or claims as being both immediate and universal.



In other words, the claim of a superiority over any temporal power is still there, and the immediate jurisdiction means that, if necessary (or if he wants to), the Pope can completely bypass the complete machinery of the Roman Catholic bureaucracy and go directly to any individual and intervene with an excommunication or whatever. In other words, the claims are sweeping.

If you are trying to set up a global system, there is only one religion that is making claims in law like that, and that is the papacy. So, I think they are being caught up in globalism by dint of their own claims.

In addition to this, you have – as far as I can tell – with Francis, something completely different than what I initially thought he was. I initially thought he was a caretaker Pope. I now think those stories that Soros, Clinton, Obama, and whoever wants to regime change in the papacy may have some traction. Listening to this man; turn the clock back. If Francis had been saying these things 100 years ago in the Roman Catholic Church, there would have been an absolute revolt. There is a bit of a revolt, but it is not anywhere near what it would have been.

**Fitts:** The last Pope was taken out by a huge documentary and media effort that came out of L.A. That was after the L.A. diocese had gone broke. So, there was a revolt out of L.A., and it came directly from Hollywood. That was very much the Clinton/Obama group.

**Farrell:** Absolutely. I think what you are seeing with the papacy being included in the Bilderberg meeting is they now have – if I can quote a 19<sup>th</sup> century Mason – “A Pope according to their wants,” and there is going to be a big push coming from this Pope or his allies in the curia to completely remake their own Catholic Church.



**Fitts:** This is all part of the reset. So, you have the Vatican resetting at the same time that you have the global financial system resetting. The Americans are pulling all the capital back behind fortress America.

**Farrell:** What I predict that is going to happen are women priests and bishops approved, which from the standpoint of traditional doctrine, is an absolute impossibility. But what they are going to do is turn around, and if that happens in their own Catholic Church, – particularly in this country or in Europe – then any ecclesiastical body that stands for traditional doctrine is going to face tax penalties and face other types of penalties. I can see it coming down.

**Fitts:** AI invasion is very useful to stopping opposition in these ways.

**Farrell:** Exactly and that is what they are doing.

**Fitts:** They're not going to come at you friendly and say, "Oh, you can't disagree with this." Suddenly, you are going to have a tax audit. Suddenly, the parking tickets and speeding tickets will come 'flying out', and it will look like a simple coincidence.

**Farrell:** What will happen is that traditional churches will be driven completely underground like they were in the Soviet Union, and it's also going to put a lot of pressure – ecumenically, so to speak – on the Orthodox churches. I strongly suspect that you are going to see the patriarch of Constantinople, which is under the thumb of Vatican finances, going along with this. There is already a big rift between Constantinople and Moscow.

**Fitts:** So, in fact, the way to have a church is not to have a legal entity.



**Farrell:** Precisely.

**Fitts:** They can't own anything or have a legal entity.

**Farrell:** Number one, you can no longer be a 501(c)(3). Number two, disavow any connection with the state in performance of marriages or similar things. In other words, right now it's set up so that a clergyman acts as an agent of the state for marriage licenses and so on. Get rid of that; throw that out the window.

It's coming down the pike, and I'm just scratching the surface of the things that I can see happening. But I think that the other reason is: Go back to *Babylon's Banksters*. That connection of the money power with the temple, what do you do if you are trying to roll out a global currency and give it moral sanction and quell everybody's fears about the revelation scenario?

You get the premier spokesman for Christianity – which is what most people think of the papacy – to go along with it and to sanction it. That is what I think the agenda is. This is part of the rollout of some sort of global currency system.

**Fitts:** It's all part of this reset. Truthstream did a very interesting video about the fact that the Bilderberg meeting happened at the same time as the G7, which happened at the same time as the Native Defense Ministers, and it was quite remarkable.

**Farrell:** It was not accidental, and this was the Cardinal Secretary of State that was invited.



**Fitts:** So, something is definitely up.

**Farrell:** Oh, yes and I think it is currency-related. I said this years ago to a friend of mine: “You watch. They are going to turn the papacy to give a moral sanction for some sort of global currency or partial global currency”.

**Fitts:** But here is the thing: Digital currencies are not ready to go.

**Farrell:** No, they are not.

**Fitts:** And the satellites aren’t up. Part of why they are trying to build out the global satellite is because you need every human being on the digital systems to do this. You can do it without that, but this makes it easier.

**Farrell:** They’re bringing the papacy in because they have to coordinate the long-term plans. Let’s go back to what Father Malachi Martin said in his books, particularly in the novel, *Vatican*, that with the pontificate of Leo XIII (I think it was him), the Vatican made an agreement, and he put it exactly this way, “With the high masonic powers of Europe to gain entry into financial systems of the West.”

**Fitts:** The next Unanswered Question I want to discuss is Hawaii. We are seeing terrible dislocation of families, and homes, and farms as a result of the lava. Are we in for a period of increased volcanic and other natural disasters? And is it natural, or is it induced?



**Farrell:** That is my big question. The climate scientist, I'm sure, are saying that it is geophysical change. Look at Antarctica. There has been unbelievable melting of the ice cap there. But my question is: Is this really natural?

When we can engineer the weather and when we are capable – as I think we are – of engineering earthquakes or other geophysical events, then the whole idea of climate change being manmade is true, but not quite in the sense that we are being told.

Hawaii is unusual to me because of the timing of it. This comes after that fake missile alert, which I don't think was fake. I go back to Fukushima and what happened there with that earthquake and tsunami. This was coming in the same timeframe as certain political events. You've commented about Indonesia before and that tsunami.

**Fitts:** That I'm sure was induced, or somebody knew a week ahead of time that it was going to happen.

**Farrell:** Exactly. I don't think that our predictive power is that advanced yet. I'm thinking that this Hawaii eruption is a convenient way to get rid of a lot of people's homes, or it could be something else. Two can play the weather warfare game, and it may not be 'our team' doing this if it is indeed manmade.

**Fitts:** That is my concern.



**Farrell:** I think I mentioned last quarter that China was planning to turn all of Tibet into a weather engineering region. If we can do it and the Russians can do it, then the Chinese can do it. So, I have some suspicions about this whole thing.

You've noted that Kilauea's magnetic field points in the opposite direction. Is that either a precursor of a global magnetic pole shift that some have been predicting? Or is this the result of the volcano itself? Or is it the result of some signature of an engineered event? I don't know, but there is much to this whole thing, which is very strange.

If we were looking at an increase of volcanism, I would think that you would find the entire Pacific Rim lighting up, and we're not seeing that. That is what makes me rather suspicious, and it's only suspicion and nothing more than that.

**Fitts:** Let me bring up 9/11 because I've been amazed at the extent to which 9/11 truth continues to percolate.

The documentation and evidence that it was a false flag is so overwhelming and compelling. It won't go away.

**Farrell:** I wish people would give a bit more traction to my idea that it's not only a false flag, but it's a penetrated false flag.

**Fitts:** I agree.



**Farrell:** There is too much going on there, and it is very, very strange. The connections of Mohammed Otto with all these Germans and the connection of the Bin Laden family to a Nazi banker and all this very strange information. I do think that at a certain level it's a false flag and it was designed that way.

**Fitts:** It's a false flag or it's a penetrated false flag and either way, it's a false flag. What has been really remarkable about 9/11 is the extent to which the official story has been ripped to shreds in multiple ways many times by people all over the planet. That information has been collected and documented and, actually, it's very impressive.

**Farrell:** It is, and I think that this is why they are trying to get rid of internet freedom. They are not able to conduct any sort of covert operation anymore without it being picked to death within the first hour. If there is some strange event like the Las Vegas shootings, within an hour of the shooting there were people pointing out discrepancies and inconsistencies in the major media reporting of the event, and it only grew worse over time.

In other words, they can't pull off a Kennedy assassination and a Warren Commission Report anymore because there are too many people watching them.

**Fitts:** Although, I think that the 5G and holograms are going to help them. However, there is no doubt that you have now created a large audience of people, and researchers, and independent commentators who present a formidable intelligence.



**Farrell:** They do, and there are other things to be aware of. They not only present a formidable intelligence, but to a certain extent, they are so internationally spread that it is not possible – even if they lock down this country. They are going to get pushback from elsewhere on the full narrative, and 9/11 being a case in point. One of the major early critiques of the complete narrative was a French researcher by the name of Terry Masson.

To control the narrative, they have to lock down the planet, and that is going to be next to impossible. Russia is not going to play, China is not going to play, and this is the other thing about these independent researchers. You now find – which I find very interesting, and you’ve mentioned this about the missing trillions – RT pushing out these stories every now and then, dropping a little nugget of information.

**Fitts:** Their problem with RT is that they are dropping documented facts.

**Farrell:** I think that you are going to see other countries stepping up only to complicate the works in stories like this –quietly backing some of these independent researchers who are picking apart these stories as soon as they happen.

We’ve seen that happen with Sandy Hook, the Las Vegas shooting, and the Florida shooting. All these things are falling apart almost as quickly as they are being done. 9/11 was a bailiwick.



The other thing that is very crucial is it's now to the point there is such a significant segment of the population that when these stories happen, the immediate reaction of these people is complete skepticism. In other words, they are facing a governance crisis because the cynicism of these official government media-promoted narratives towards them is almost immediate, and it is growing and spreading.

They have to have their holography and have their internet lockdown and so on. And even then, look at *Pravda* in the Soviet Union or Goebbels in Nazi Germany. When things are going okay, then the narrative sticks. However, the moment something starts to happen that doesn't agree with the narrative, then people start losing faith in the narrative. I don't think they are going to be able to put that genie back into the bottle – AI or no AI. I think, in a certain sense, it's too late.

**Fitts:** I'm running into it in this audit. We've been dealing with an audit from the Tennessee Securities Division where, if you use the SEC pricing schedule, it's 2013 pricing. The cost of the audit so far – and it's not over yet – is more than our gross revenues for the year.

My experience with Tennessee bureaucracy is that they are always very competent. My problem is they recently signed a big contract with AT&T to be their IT provider. My problem is that in this next round I'm going with them, I asked, "Wait a minute. Who is going to have access to this data? Is AT&T going to have access because AT&T is a firm that is blocking me and doing other things to harm my business? There is a conspiracy."



I told you that we had an AT&T executive go in and take a look at their spam filter system, and he wrote back and said, “There is no block” and he sent me a screen shot of the system.

I said, “You have a secret block occurring there.”

The question is: If AT&T has access to all of this data – and this is data that I’m responsible for because I have client data – is AT&T going to put this into the data beast and use this to troll for people to do tax audits on? I don’t think that is legal.

The issue for me is an ethical one. What is my obligation to protect this data? I don’t want to protect it from regulators who have a reasonable legal reason to ask and to review it, but I also have an obligation not to let the data beast troll on a fishing expedition that could hurt people.

I have to draw the line because I have plenty of respect for Tennessee and I don’t have much respect for AT&T. AT&T was deeply involved in all the litigation, and I came to believe that AT&T had broken more than a few laws. That’s my belief.

I was working with an attorney recently, and said, “Look, I respect their power, but I don’t respect their legitimacy. They’re not legitimate. It’s not a legitimate system.”

There is something that is different. I remember going through the litigation, and it was very, very scary because there were a couple of times where I almost lost my life. They tried to frame me, and if they had succeeded, I would have gone to prison for many years.



However, there is something about now where I'm not afraid. The reason I'm not afraid is because, when you look at how morally bankrupt the AI invasion is, I have one concern and that is my soul. There is nothing that you can do to get me to compromise my soul.

I'm also going to do the best I can to live up to my moral, and ethical, and legal obligations even though they may not be. I'm talking about the 3<sup>rd</sup> party contractors.

It has reached a point where, frankly, if for the 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> time, they've tried to frame me, I don't believe they can. If they can, I'd still rather be on the A-Team than on their team. We're coming to a world where it's one or the other and there is no middle of the road.

You can't be a 'good girl' and stay in the middle of the road and think that you are going to be safe. This thing is demonic, and you have to choose.

I am so lucky. I look back at the last 20 years and think, "I am so lucky to be where I am because I do not want to be on the other team."

**Farrell:** I think increasingly that is what people are sensing at some intuitive level, even if they are not conscious of it. Things are so bad and so out of control, and their immediate reaction to all these narratives is skepticism and cynicism.

I've said many times in the vidchats on my website, "I view American history from the assassination of President Kennedy to 9/11 as one big arc.



What we've been dealing with since that event in 1963 is a coup that was waged against this country and its legitimate government and people”.

**Fitts:** The Tories got it back.

**Farrell:** The Tories got it back, and we've been dealing with that ever since. Increasingly, I think people are so skeptical and so cynical about anything they hear that the other team has lost its legitimacy. That's why they are moving so quickly.

**Fitts:** Monsanto went early, but it's the 'whole shebang'.

**Farrell:** Absolutely. It's the media, the brands, and every one of them.

**Fitts:** The brand is toast. The question is: How long until everybody knows that? I don't know. That may be why they are rushing to get everything back in fortress America.

**Farrell:** I think that is one of the key factors because they realize the brand is toast and they have to clamp things down. That is not going to work because, in the mere fact of doing so, that will wake people up.

I don't see that there is any way for these people to get out of the impasse they have put themselves in without – to be blunt – good old-fashioned repentance. They have boxed themselves in, and they have no new solutions. They have surrounded themselves with yes-men for so long who think exactly like they do, and they can't think of any other way. So, they have boxed themselves in.



I really don't see things changing as long as they keep going on as they are. They're only going to make more cynical people.

**Fitts:** I would love to have a vision of how the Anglo-American Alliance can be successful. I'm a believer that anything is possible. All things work together. It's just that given the way it's going, it's almost as though the whole leadership needs a 'knock on the head' before you can figure out what the pathway is.

**Farrell:** The entire leadership class is corrupt or corrupt-in-training. That is also a very dangerous situation to be in. The last time that we saw anything like this was the reformation, and that ended in 30 years of war. That, in turn, devastated Germany and set Germany on the militaristic course.

I really don't know, but I do think it is heartening that so many people now immediately question any official story. I don't care if it's Hillary or Trump; they are questioning the official story.

**Fitts:** That is why it's important to tap back into what I call 'the Scottish Enlightenment' – the spirit that created the Constitution in the first place. It really was a miracle what happened there.

I had a wonderful conversation when I was in Sydney with a delightful subscriber. He said, "We need to inherit, not just the divine intelligence that is present, but that of the ancestors."



These gifts that we have gotten and these legacies reflect the divine intelligence that our ancestors accessed, and we can have the benefit of all that accumulated divine intelligence.

**Farrell:** Absolutely. You cannot cut yourself off from culture, and that means that you cannot cut yourself off from tradition. This is an absolute must and it's not an option.

I've said this before: "We now have a political class that is so illiterate that these people who are pressing for a Constitutional Convention, I think, My God! Are you serious?"

There is not a James Madison or a Thomas Jefferson in the entire political class that can handle something like that because they are not even grounded in any of that tradition at all.

**Fitts:** I also think they haven't had the opportunity to work at the fundamental root of the economy, or the legal, or financial structure; they haven't really grappled with the true economics bottom-up of issues like freedom and justice.

The one thing that I wanted to get back to is something that we discuss every time we talk about Unanswered Questions, and that is that we do not know who governs and manages this planet.

What I've said for many, many years – and you heard it here first – is all the different problems that people talk about, those aren't our problems. Our problem is that we have an invisible government and management structure.



We don't know who they are, and we don't know why they are acting the way they are acting. They have a map, and they are not sharing the map.

Whether it's the intelligence they are getting or who they are and what their goals are, I think that we are choking to death on the secrecy. We have many Solari Reports on secrecy. We had Richard Dolan on 'The Cost of Secrecy' and Amy Benjamin on 'The Many Faces of Secrecy'. I think that we have a culture that has a disease, and that disease is secrecy.

**Farrell:** I think it's important for people to understand that you're not talking about Lucifer or Satan being behind it all; you're talking about a group of people who are hidden who are organized and powerful, and that this is the way they rule. I am in agreement with you on that. I do think there is a spiritual component to all of this.

**Fitts:** I do, too, but I think that the cost of secrecy has become unacceptable. That's why I've done everything that I've done for 20 years. A civilization cannot function with this level of secrecy.

They seem to think that you can have a police state and can use AI and the AI invasion to have 'friendly fascism' that is Orwellianly disgusting, but I don't think it works.

**Farrell:** It doesn't work because those types of states always turn on each other. Let's take the example of Stalin and the purges in the 1930's.



What Stalin effectively did was purged so much of his generals in the Red Army that when the Germans struck in 1941, you had a bunch of incompetent people running the Red Army.

**Fitts:** That has happened a great deal to us in bureaucracies.

**Farrell:** You look at the same thing in Nazi Germany from 1943 on, and you have all these people – Himmler, Goering, Bormann – who are sniping at each other and grabbing for this and that part of the pie, and the entire government essentially, by the end of the war, has fallen apart. They just eat themselves alive, and are committing all these insane decisions.

I don't see how they can make this secrecy thing work; it never does. I'm not saying that governments shouldn't have secrets; I'm not saying that at all, but the scale of it is over the top.

**Fitts:** The interview that we did with Amy Benjamin was so popular. I think it was one of the most popular interviews we have ever done. The reason is that she went to extraordinary lengths to create a very well-organized academic mainstream framework for the secrecy. It was a peer-reviewed paper published by William & Mary. That's how I found it and Wilkerson put me onto it. It's something that you can give to your mother-in-law. Do you know what I mean? It's so mainstream respectable and she has 'nailed it'. It's a bulletproof case that the secrecy is extraordinary, and she has created a framework for how you can have such an enormous gap between reality and official reality and explain it to your mother-in-law in a way that makes sense.



I think it was very popular because people saw a way that they could talk with anybody about it. It's very compelling and makes the case that the secrecy is absurd.

**Farrell:** It's absurd and it's killing us.

**Fitts:** Not all of us. Some of the corporations are doing quite nicely. If the taxpayer finances the data beast and then you get to use the data beast to make money, you're 'sitting pretty'.

**Farrell:** True, but even the corporations are composed of people. Sooner or later that works against you.

**Fitts:** Right, and to our shock and amazement, what did we see this quarter? The Google employees revolt and say, "No work using AI to drones."

I don't know if you've seen the video, *Slaughterbots*, on autonomous weapons, but you need to watch it. I'm going to use it as one of the documentaries for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Wrap Up. Basically, imagine little drones of this size flying around, and if you don't behave, you're dead.

A big Unanswered Question is: Who is in control?

**Farrell:** I don't think that it is any one group; I think there are competing groups and you have behind the scenes international organizations. I've always thought this. You have 'Fascist International' or 'Nazi International' or 'whatever', you have various terrorist organizations, you have underground criminal networks, and I definitely think that you have so-called 'Secret Societies'.



I think there are elements within Masonry that are very dangerous – not all of them, obviously, but I think that there are such elements.

You are dealing with so many different groups of people, and I go back to my model. You are essentially dealing with a global mafia. They will sit around the table and smoke their cigars and sip their brandy and kiss each other's rings, and out on the streets they're competing.

**Fitts:** They can always cooperate and take it from us.

Next is Inspiration.

I have to bring it up, although I know that you don't want me to discuss it. We are waiting for the organ and I have to give a report. It's become a point of great frustration for you I know. I'm somebody who, when it comes, am still going to be inspired.

**Farrell:** I will, too but I'm concerned, not so much about the 'when' but the 'if'.

**Fitts:** Oh, I'm confident that it will be here.

**Farrell:** I hope so. It's difficult because I haven't played an organ regularly for about 30 years, and had a nightmare recently of trying to play a piece that I used to play, and I was all in the 'cracks' and my feet wouldn't work and nothing worked, and it wasn't the instrument; it was me.

I was just thinking, "I can't even play a scale."



**Fitts:** You will and just need to begin. So, the organ needs to come, and we should ask everybody to invite prayer for Chris Martin, the organ-maker.

**Farrell:** I have a feeling that they are needing an abundance of them.

**Fitts:** It's interesting. When you listen to what they are struggling with, they are struggling the way every small business is struggling.

**Farrell:** They're struggling how the entire country is struggling. They are struggling with so much shadow work and paperwork and it's unbelievable.

**Fitts:** And they are in an area with very high shadow work and very high inflation. They are in one of the highest inflation areas in the country.

I would like ask you what your greatest inspiration was of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter.

**Farrell:** My inspiration was Shiloh, my little adopted pooch. The adoption people think that she is about two years old, so she is a doggie teenager. She is very sweet, but we think that she was abused. When I first got her, she was very afraid of leashes, and still cringes if you come at her too fast or with your hand outstretched. So, we think that she may have been abused.

She was shipped around to many shelters, so she has some abandonment issues. But she is very, very sweet.



**Fitts:** She is very sweet and I think that after she gets used to the idea she is going to be sticking around here, she'll come around. She is very sweet, and loves you already.

**Farrell:** Oh, yes, she follows me everywhere. If I get up to go to the living room, she follows me there. If I walk into the other office to get a book, she follows me into the office and follows me back again. She usually lays somewhere on the kitchen floor under the table while I'm working.

She gets very scared, but she is the biggest inspiration for me.

**Fitts:** I have to talk a little about the trip to Australia and Uluru. It was so wonderful to be in a country where everybody is happy including in Sydney. Of course, Australia is just a beautiful country – physically beautiful.

We were in Uluru for 10 days, and it's a lovely resort. We had two groups, and two things happened. Whenever I see the subscribers meet each other and spend time together-each group spent five days with 20 other positive, open-minded people who understand reality-it reminds me of the Secret Space Program conferences.

When you tried to explain to 'Yurone and Robert' what happens when you have a high quality of research, and there is no interruption by disinformation and people can start to gain momentum, and something happens. There is this magical field aura that happens. Suddenly, you're getting an exponential learning speed. That is what I saw in Uluru both times.



You have this exponential event that happens. It wasn't so much, "We can be really smart," but instead it was, "Wow! We could live in a human civilization, and it feels wonderful." There was this magic to it, and it was so amazing to watch.

People who arrived from the states really agitated and in a condition of anxiety and agité, within two to three days and until the time they left, they were so glowing within the beauty of what it means to live in a high civilization. It was quite marvelous.

**Farrell:** I'm not doubting that. In this country we don't have exposure to high culture, to things of transcendent beauty. People in this country are starved for it.

I remember as a boy my parents used to play a card game called Pitch every Friday night with some friends of theirs in Sioux Falls, and they would alternate houses. They would come to our house one Friday, and then another family would host the next Friday. It wasn't about playing cards; it was about the conversation that was happening while you were playing cards. You were discussing everything.

My first memories of the difficulties with the Warren Report and the Kennedy assassination were sitting at the table and listening to my mom and dad.

**Fitts:** At our house it was Bridge.



**Farrell:** It was something that drew you together and got you talking. Look at what has happened. We do not have conversations anymore. We don't have social get-togethers, instead we have coffee houses and such.

**Fitts:** We do at Solari.

**Farrell:** Yes, but there is no informal social gathering.

I mentioned earlier that the neighbors next door had a cookout, and there were numerous cars on the lawn, and everybody was on chairs. They were sitting around talking, kids were playing, and they were talking about Trump. They solved the world's problems. We don't do that anymore.

**Fitts:** But your neighbors just did it.

**Farrell:** The neighbors just did it, but by and large, it doesn't happen often enough. We don't do enough of it.

**Fitts:** We don't do what we used to do, and we need to do more.

**Farrell:** We are focused on computer games rather than a game of cards, or Cribbage, or Bridge, or whatever. We have to do more of that.

**Fitts:** We need to find neighbors who aren't weaponized.

**Farrell:** That is the other problem: Finding people in the area who you have some connection with. Social media has ruined this.



**Fitts:** We recently had tea in San Francisco. We try to get together in places where people can meet each other, and we try to do it in person. We don't want to do it online; we want people to be able to meet each other in person.

I am going to try to convince you to come to Asheville on September 22<sup>nd</sup> with Dr. Skidmore, and I'm hoping Greg Hunter is coming. I hope Jon Rappoport and his wife are coming. The idea is to get people in the North Carolina area to get together and meet each other.

There were two other things that happened in Uluru. One was in the first group, Richard Dolan and his true love, Tracy Garbutt, got married. They had technically gotten married for immigration purposes, but they hadn't had their ceremony – which to them was the real deal.

In fact, they got married on the mound overlooking Uluru, and it's very appropriate because here is the leading ufologist in the world getting married in Uluru. It was so appropriate. They asked me to officiate, and they asked the group if they would mind being the witnesses.

For some reason, it cemented our whole group together because it was a very intimate, very special ceremony. Tracey and Richard are so in love, and it was a very loving event.

Then we all went to dinner and celebrated and that was very special. There are pictures of it on the website.



The final thing that was the most special was I had a wonderful subscriber who said, “When we go, everybody is going to get a download, and each person is going to get a different download, which will be particular for them.”

Uluru is the kind of place where you are so close to the Milky Way and the stars, and you are in a place where the stories go back 60,000-70,000 years. You think in terms of millions of years.

The Attila rock formation is 750 million years old. You think in millions of years forward and back, and it expands your mind because it expands your time consciousness.

I’ve always had a tremendously powerful intuitive connection to the rock formation Attila. Uluru/Ayers Rock is what everybody thinks of and knows, but when I first saw Attila, it was, “I’m home.” It’s a bit like standing in front of the Stone of Destiny in Scotland. It’s these moments when suddenly, you can feel a deep genetic connection or a connection through the streams and the field. I can’t explain it, but you have a very powerful, intimate connection with this place and whatever was going on there.

Jason Bawden-Smith hired a helicopter. On the next to the last day that we were there, Richard, Tracey, Jason, and I flew to the top of Attila and landed on Attila and had an hour that we could walk around and be on Attila. I have to tell you that I thought it was the first time in my life that I really understood who I was. It was an amazing, amazing experience.



In the Aborigine stories, the frost people were said to live in and around Attila, and the Aborigines were afraid of them. But when the Seven Sisters ran away and went back to the Pleiades (the stars), they went to Attila. It looks like a landing pad.

I was on the top of Attila for an hour, and I can't tell you how many literal downloads I got. I felt so spiritually in alignment with all creation. I really felt like I knew who I was. For the first time, I felt like I had found myself. It was a fantastic feeling and almost a feeling of complete coherence.

When I came back to the United States and marched right into the agité, I didn't lose it; it was lasting.

**Farrell:** Coming back to the United States from places like that, you can see it. You can see the state that the country is in.

**Fitts:** You can see how we've become and this has happened to me. You can see how you can fall into a lower mind where you're dealing with minutia. I deal every day with fantastic minutia – whether it relates to systems, or shadow work, or hacking, or regulation and taxes, and the audit. So, I am dealing with massive amounts of shadow work. You have to be careful not to let it bring you into thinking in a timeline of ten years back and ten years forward instead of 750 million years back and 750 million years forward.

I'm a great believer that you have to do an excellent work at the detail of whatever you're dealing with. I believe excellence comes from a bottom-up excellence in dealing with detail. It's a terrible mistake to say, "I'm an executive. I don't want to deal with the detail."



I don't feel that way at all. But the question is: How can you deal with the AI invasion but not fall into a lower mind and not let it pull you down into a short-term timeframe backward or forward?

Whether it's individually or as a people, we have a destiny. That destiny is thousands of years in the future – if not millions of years in the future – and it comes from millions of years in the past. That is our legacy. We need the divine intelligence of all our ancestors, and you can't access that divine intelligence if you are in that lower short-term mind.

**Farrell:** The Latin expression is 'ad fontes', which is 'to the sources'.

**Fitts:** It's like an oasis or a well. I'm not talking about a well of this generation; I'm talking about a well of all the generations that we've come from. We need to drink at the well, and you can't drink from the well if you're in that teeny, tiny mind.

**Farrell:** I agree. You can't drink at the well if you are constantly bombarded with shadow work or if you think that good music only began in 1963. I'm putting in my little plug there!

**Fitts:** The reason I love the Pistis Sophia is because it's Jesus teaching to the apostles, and it's all about how to get out of the mud and come back into a higher mind. But it's also the reason I love organ music. One of the greatest things that happened recently was you made me aware of this fantastic Swiss performance of the Goldberg Variations by organ, and it just absolutely shocked me. I've heard the Goldberg Variations over 1,000 times on the piano.



**Farrell:** That is ‘the carpentry’, as I call it and it’s hammering and pounding.

**Fitts:** When you hear it played by the organ, it’s absolutely celestial. What I realized is, “No wonder they’ve killed the organ! If everybody is in church every Sunday having their mind pulled up into the celestial realms, how are they ever going to debase the culture? You can’t.”

**Farrell:** I have some thoughts on those lines that will be forthcoming eventually.

**Fitts:** We can’t wait!

**Farrell:** It’s a different instrument, and I wish that pianists knew that you don’t know how to play the organ just because you can play piano exercises. I’ve heard so many pianists, and they absolutely butcher the instrument.

**Fitts:** It’s clear from listening to this wonderful Swiss performer. I’ll put up a link in the Subscriber Links. I first heard it on YouTube and then I bought the CD. What you realize is that the Goldberg Variations absolutely was composed to be played on the organ.

**Farrell:** It was composed by an organ composer. You stop and look at the great composers who had exposure to the instrument – not just JS Bach; Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach did; Joseph Haydn did; Mozart did. Mozart didn’t write much organ music, but what he did was amazing.



**Fitts:** I have to tell you that I am on my way to Europe. I am flying to Vienna, and then I fly to Sofia. Thomas Meyer and his family and I and a whole group that he has organized are going to see the Full Ring – Wagner’s Ring – four nights in a row.

**Farrell:** I’ll take the highlights version

**Fitts:** Oh, no! I want to see the complete thing.

**Farrell:** Saint-Saëns was an organist and Beethoven was not, but Brahms was. So, you have many people who were familiar with the instrument. It’s a different ‘ball of wax’ altogether, and I keep reminding people that it is the oldest keyboard instrument in history. It’s about 1,000 years old.

**Fitts:** I will tell you that the Goldberg Variations on organ was very inspiring to me, and it taught me a great deal about why that instrument has been pulled out of many churches. I was very inspired last year when I was in Iceland where they have a cathedral at the top of Reykjavik that has a beautiful organ, and it was quite a spectacular service to attend.

The last thing I have to say is that one of the most inspiring things that happened this year was when Robert Dupper and I interviewed Thomas Meyer when I was in the Netherlands. So, we drove to Basel and interviewed Thomas and I asked him, “How are we going to find each other?”

What has to happen here as the AI invasion comes down globally, the people who can invent a positive, human future have to find each other.



To a certain extent, we have to let the AI invasion roll over. But while it is rolling over, we have to build and create the seeds of a human future.

He said, “We have to pierce the tunnels of loneliness.”

Since he said that, I feel like I’ve been getting one inspiration after another – with Uluru being the big one – on how to pierce the tunnels of loneliness.

**Farrell:** I don’t have any solutions on that, but I do have another organ story.

My good friend Scott deHarte and his wife are in Paris right now. Before they went, I said, “Is there any chance that you would be able to go to Saint-Sulpice where Widor was the organist for so very long on that massive instrument there?”

They did and went there and took a picture of it for me. I said, “I feel like I’ve arrived. I’m in contact,” and I really do. I feel, “Okay, good. Somebody I know is actually there,” because I love Widor and his music.

**Fitts:** I’ve been listening to Widor since you put me onto him.

**Farrell:** He is massive.

**Fitts:** Ulrike and I are going to Chartres and Notre Dame. I’ve been reading Henry Adams’ book on Chartres, which I never heard of until Thomas told me about it when I told him I was going. It’s quite amazing.



**Farrell:** Chartres is interesting, and the organ in there is another big, colossal instrument. In fact, if you want a real treat, go to YouTube and look up ‘the final movement of Saint-Saëns’ 3<sup>rd</sup> symphony’, the so-called ‘Organ Symphony’ performed by Daniel Barenboim with the Chicago Symphony and Gaston Litaize is on the organ, but make sure that you ‘crank’ it.

That was the music I played in college when all the other people’s music was too much for me. So, I called it ‘The Furniture Mover’. I would put that on and crank the volume up, and everybody else would get quiet. I didn’t have to suffer the ‘jungle drumbeat’ anymore. That’s quite a piece of work.

**Fitts:** I think the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter turned out very different than I expected, only because I found the AI invasion so disturbing. I think that I am an earlier participant than most people.

Looking ahead to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter, I don’t know. I feel fearless.

**Farrell:** I don’t feel fearless, but I don’t have as many reservations as I did. I think that there will be some positive changes. Fear? No. Let’s just say that my apprehension level is considerably less than it was a year ago.

**Fitts:** Mine too.

**Farrell:** But there is still plenty out there that could come back and bite us. I’m reserved.



**Fitts:** What I would say is that we are in a place where, when you have this kind of fluid change, what happens is everyone's invention. There is no sideline. You're in the game, the game is afoot, and everyone counts, and what you do counts.

Amy Benjamin said a very popular line, and many people have quoted it back to me on the subscriber input. She said, "This is a time to pay attention, and what you do counts. Every action and every word and everything in the field counts."

So, it is about culture, and what you think, and what you say, and what you do counts. That is my message to every subscriber listening or reading this. You count. You are somebody, and what you do counts.

**Farrell:** And the words count.

**Fitts:** I think that what you do counts immensely.

**Farrell:** I hope so, I really do.

**Fitts:** Tell us a little about what is up at Giza Death Star these days. Tell us about how the penguins are doing. I love the title of your latest book.

**Farrell:** *Hess and the Penguins*; I think it's doing alright but I haven't seen the royalties yet. That won't come until July. When you write a book, the royalties go up, and then over time they fall. So, my royalties have been falling steadily for the last ten years, which has me a bit concerned but I think that book is doing alright.



Website-wise I could always use more paying subscribers. I'm doing a new book right now, which I've been meaning to do for several years. It was on my list, and I was doing it last year at the same time that I was starting to research the Hess book. Then I ran into something researching the Hess material that made me change the order, so I did the Hess book first in order to do this book.

I can tell people that this book is not about Nazis.

**Fitts:** I have to tell you that before I first started to work with you and I didn't do it all at once, but I accumulated every book you ever wrote on the theory that I couldn't afford not to have them in my library, but the day would come when I would read them all. Then, of course, when I got to meet you, I started to read them at a high speed.

I would just encourage everyone that if you don't have a Dr. Joseph Farrell library, you need to get one.

**Farrell:** Yes, and don't buy used, buy new books because I get the royalty.

**Fitts:** Although the used books pump your market.

**Farrell:** That is true. I'm actually toying with the idea of doing this book as a self-published book so that I get more money.

**Fitts:** I think that is a great idea.

**Farrell:** The problem is distribution and so on.



**Fitts:** They have all these services where they will do all that for you.

**Farrell:** They do, but you still end up paying. From what I've seen, they don't really do a good job; they're just taking money and saying that they are doing it. But I'm seriously thinking of doing that because it's ridiculous that I'm doing all this work and I'm getting 10% of the sales. It's absurd.

So, we'll see on that. I haven't made up my mind yet, but I'm fairly certain that I'm at least going to try to see what the formatting looks like. If the formatting is not acceptable, then I will probably go the traditional publisher route like I have in the past. I'm hoping that this book will be done this year. It's a huge subject, and there is so much data. It's really all about sifting the data and putting it on what I think is a proper foundation that I don't think that anybody else has done. It's going to be interesting.

**Fitts:** There is always this great mystery in my life. It's always exciting and 'juicy', and it is: "What is Joseph's next book really about, and what will the title be?" He doesn't tell me, so I get to find out when everyone else does.

**Farrell:** I drop 'gobs of hints' to people, but I don't say that I'm dropping a hint.

**Fitts:** For those of you who are not Giza Death Star members, you can become a member at [www.GizaDeathStar.com](http://www.GizaDeathStar.com) and you get the regular vidchats. When are the vidchats?



**Farrell:** Every two weeks. And people should not be turned off or frightened because we are talking about things that they have no idea of. Just hang in there and submit questions and that is what they are for.

**Fitts:** And your subscribers ask the best questions.

**Farrell:** Well, if we are not talking about what people want to talk about, send in questions and comments. I'll try to answer them – or at least pretend that I'm answering them – because they are listener-driven. I do not set the agenda. I'm simply there reading people's questions and giving what I think is an appropriate response, and that is it. But they do go on a long time. It's not one of these vidchat things found on many other major websites where they give you a half-hour or an hour; these things go on seven or eight hours.

**Fitts:** A great deal is going to happen between now and the end of September when I am going to be back. Remember the election is going to be upon us.

**Farrell:** That is why I think that something is going to 'pop' before the election. Somebody is going to pull something.

**Fitts:** Today, as we record this, it is June 16<sup>th</sup>. July is the Bohemian Grove. When you bring back this much money, many decisions need to be made.

**Farrell:** Many decisions need to be made, and it is going to be very interesting to see who is going to be there.



**Fitts:** It will be interesting to see who is going to be there, and then it will be interesting to see what decisions roll out into the budget because the budget has to be finalized by October 1<sup>st</sup>, when I will be back. We are going to be able to see what they did and why. So, we will see plenty and, of course, we will also be seeing the campaign tactics.

Will the 35,000 indictments come down?

**Farrell:** I absolutely think that some of them are; they have to. There has been ‘too much smoke and not enough fire’. If they don’t do something, they have shot themselves in the foot and have lost much of their support base. They have to do something. Whether or not it will be major enough so that the corporate media can’t ignore it, that is another matter. But I suspect that you are not dealing with a ‘bunch of dummies’, so I suspect that it will be. I could be proven wrong.

**Fitts:** It’s going to be a very interesting 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter, and we’re going to have a very interesting time at the end of September.
