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C. Austin Fitts: Ladies and gentlemen, welcome to the *2nd Quarter 2020 Wrap Up, Part II: News Trends & Stories* with Dr. Joseph Farrell. This is Catherine Austin Fitts. We had a great discussion earlier about **Economy & Financial Markets, and Geopolitics**. Now that health science is the new way to create police powers, everything is integrating. So today, we are going to be talking about **Culture, Food & Health, Space, and The Unanswered Questions**.

Joseph, welcome back to *The Solari Report*.

Dr. Joseph Farrell: Thanks for having me back.

Fitts: You warned us that the complete war was going to be cultural, and you were right.

Farrell: It's certainly looking that way.

Fitts: How many people every week tell you that you were right?

Farrell: Not many.

Fitts: Really?

Farrell: No, not many.

Fitts: It took me about a year of you trying to explain and teach me. It took me a while for me to figure it out.

Farrell: It does for most people because most people don't understand what I mean by 'owning the culture'. It's as simple as whatever institutions or cultural traditions interest you, dig into them and start making them or integrating them into your life. We are heading into a dark age. It's almost like the Middle Ages; we will have to be little monks in our scriptoria and preserve things because everything is under assault.

If they can go after Aunt Jemima and statues of Christ, they can go after Mozart and Rembrandt, and we don't want to lose those. If we lose those, we've lost everything.

Fitts: Let's dive in: **Story #11: Celebrating the Best of 2nd-Quarter Culture.**

It was remarkable. One of the things I saw as the museums and the arts were threatened, were people realizing what you are saying. "If I don't support and protect this, we are going to lose it."

It was because of your inspiration that we started '*Food for the Soul*' at *The Solari Report* with Nina Heyn. She writes a column twice a month, and is just a museum hound. This quarter we started a podcast. We were scheduled to see the Raphael exhibit in Italy, and Nina was scheduled to be in Chicago, San Francisco, London, and it all had to stop.

Now that my travel credits are a forced savings plan, we started to do the podcast and do what we could do online, but there were many great things to celebrate. Why don't you start?

Farrell: I think the biggest thing that this whole culture resistance has done is this: Can you imagine the rioters going after the New York Metropolitan Museum of Art? Just think about that.

Fitts: Not unless they want to die. I know at least a few thousand New Yorkers who would use their guns and kill them.

Farrell: That is literally what is at stake, and I make 'no bones' about it. I have said before that the politically correct crowd went after the libretto of Mozart's opera, *Idomeneo*, because that character is a black man. So, the politically correct crowd has actually changed the libretto to make it politically acceptable. I believe this is an attack on history because that opera was written about a century after the big Turkish attack on Vienna.

In other words, it's fresh in Mozart's mind that this was a real threat of a vastly different culture trying to take over the rump state of Austria. Had that gone the Turkish way, had the Polish King John Sobieski not come to the rescue, Europe would be a vastly different place today.

If you can imagine 100 years prior to Mozart's time, that would have been in the age of Handel, Bach, Scarlatti, Rembrandt, and everything that we associate with our high culture. So, that wouldn't have been there; it would have been gone.

We had better get a clue that this is what we are fighting for; it literally is what we are fighting for. All of things that have made this culture transcendent and beautiful. It's not perfect, but this is the other thing that I think people don't understand. You don't need a perfect culture; you simply need to recognize the goodness of it.

Everybody has their skeletons. Abraham Lincoln was one of the racist people there ever was. Does that mean we will tear down the Lincoln Memorial because of the results of his policies that were good?

Fitts: If you look at America, one of the things that happened to me – because I have been in the Netherlands for an extended period now-I've never been here this long for one period of time. I'm living in a culture now that doesn't enjoy the benefits of a reserve currency. That means that everything has to be economic.

It's very interesting. The Dutch had a global empire. The Dutch West Indies Company, in its time, the Dutch guilder, was a reserve currency for longer than the U.S. dollar has been a reserve currency. It was for a long time.

The Dutch invest and have a vast export/import business worldwide; they are very global. But the day after the restrictions were announced, every person around me was out cleaning the front of their house. They would say, "We were going to go to work today, but we just learned instead that we have to do the work at home. We were going to do that on the weekends before summer, but now we are going to accelerate it."

They were up as early and working just as hard. They had just reshuffled their schedules.

One of the things they knew was that they couldn't afford not to work hard.

Farrell: Right.

Fitts: If you look at America, there is so much subsidy now being thrown around in the political process and covert warfare because with the reserve currency, you can afford to waste trillions of dollars fighting. A culture that doesn't have the reserve currency can't do that.

I think that part of the tensions we talked about last time is that the world is financing this. They are watching it and saying, "Why should we finance this?"

I bring that back to culture because if you look at how much money the American people are spending on things that debase the culture, it is extraordinary.

Farrell: It's everywhere.

Fitts: And it's not Mr. Global; it's the consumer. It's the citizen who chooses to spend hundreds of billions, if not trillions, of dollars on things that debase the culture. We are doing this.

Farrell: I totally agree, we are. You mentioned the Netherlands, and it is interesting as an organism that they have preserved so many of those Baroque era pipe organs in the Netherlands.

Fitts: They are beautiful.

Farrell: They are fabulous instruments, but they have not kept them as museum pieces. They open them up to let children come in and 'fiddle around' on the pipe organ. So, they have created a whole crop of young musicians. You can see them on YouTube. There are youths 12 and 13 years old who have recorded videos of them playing Bach pieces or Buxtehude pieces and so on. They have not let that aspect of their culture atrophy and die. My hat is off to them for doing that.

Fitts: It comes down to us.

There are a couple of things I want to note. One of the congressmen I most admire is Congressman Massie from Kentucky. The House wanted to vote on the \$3 billion coronavirus bill with a voice vote without accounting and recording the vote or showing up in person, and he demanded that they show up and record a vote.

Farrell: Good for him!

Fitts: Trump attacked him badly, and that made life very difficult. He recently won his primary.

Farrell: Something is afoot culturally because Massie won, but in some congressional district in Buffalo, New York, the GOP won that seat with an unbelievable majority – way, way beyond their last win in that congressional district. It went from about 1,000 votes the last time to over 23,000 this time.

So, something is afoot if you look at some of these local elections that are happening right now. Whether that will translate culturally is another thing.

Fitts: Here is a concern after what Cuomo did to the small business: There has always been a great upstate/downstate divide in New York, and Cuomo is obviously a very downstate person. He is basically viewed as New York mafia. So if you look at what the downstate mafia just did to the upstate, I would think that the pushback will be big.

Farrell: I think it is going to be fairly big. If it shows up in the election is another thing. Here is my problem with the political analysis that comes out: If Trump wins, it is going to be because of that kind of pushback. It's not going to be Trump so much as local or state pushback.

I'm shuttering to see what the political analysis is going to do if he wins because it will get distorted massively from the actual reality on the ground. It is going to be the same if the Democrats win.

Fitts: One thing that was interesting to see is, for years I have told people, “Stop worrying about the Presidential election. Who is your sheriff? Start worrying about who your sheriff is.”

This is the first time that I’ve watched thousands of people understand what I’m saying. “Oh, right.”

For example, this whole idea of having to wear a mask is not a law and it’s not a county ordinance. There has been no legal process to require it. They are threatening to charge you a fine, but they have no legal authority to charge you a fine. It all comes down to, “who’s your sheriff”.

What you are seeing are sheriffs who culturally believe in freedom; this is what they believe. They believe in freedom. They see themselves as protecting people’s rights –property rights and their human rights. They see themselves as the guardian of people’s rights in that area. It’s a deep cultural impulse, and they are the ones who are pushing back.

Farrell: We are going to see this happen across the country. I can tell you where I’m at with the local chair of the County Health Department and the idea of making masks mandatory: The mayor is listening to it. I guarantee you that if they go through with that, they are out of office this fall. I’m not voting for either one of them. That has to happen across the board.

This is the other thing that bothers me about this mask-wearing mandate. Where are the Constitutional challenges to this?

Fitts: We have one attorney who has been looking into this and collecting information for the litigation. We haven’t been able to find many. It’s interesting because if you look at the science, there is no scientific basis for this. There is a great deal of material to suggest that requiring healthy people to wear masks in a non-medical situation is counterproductive.

Farrell: It’s very harmful. Just look at the basic science here, and then we will get back to the culture aspect. As far as I’ve heard, the virus survives in an oxygen-poor environment. So there you are; you are in your mask and you are breathing out carbon dioxide and breathing it back in and lowering the content

of oxygen in your blood. So you are actually becoming more susceptible to it. If you are more susceptible to it, then you are going to spread it. These masks aren't going to stop a virus from spreading. That is just plain common sense.

There is that problem, but the problem I've had is as I go to local businesses, everybody is in their masks. The employees in all these businesses are in their masks. So what I've done is very nicely say, "Have you got a piece of paper?"

They give me a piece of paper, and I write, "Dr. Judy Mikovits, YouTube," and hand the paper back to them. I say, "Do me a favor, look at this video, and it will raise questions for you – I hope."

I'm doing my own thing to try to use the crisis of the moment to educate people who are buying this whole mask narrative. I realize that 90% of the people I do this with in the checkout line or the bank are not going to go home and rush to YouTube and watch a video of Dr. Judy Mikovits. However, I do think that some of them are going to start questioning-the more, the better.

We can use this time to take every little opportunity that we can to make a cultural impact for some of these people so that they don't have to live their lives in this ratcheted up fear, which I refused to do.

Fitts: Our theme for the 2nd Quarter is '*Covid-19: The Best Resources*'. So, in all aspects of the Going Direct plan – whether it's masks or contact tracing – we try to identify the very best sources for you. I'm in the process of identifying the best sources for masks because I will be doing an interview with Dr. Sherri Tenny on the mask issue.

I know very intelligent, very well-educated people who always wear a mask, and they are very adamant that is the right thing to do. Whereas, I have other highly educated people, including doctors, who say that it is the most ridiculous thing they've ever heard.

Farrell: It is in my opinion also.

Fitts: If you look at the videos I've watched, the best sources are the following: Cahill is an excellent source; David Crow is an excellent source; J.B. Hand-

ley has a great piece called 'Lockdown Lunacy'; Swiss Propaganda Research is another one. I'm looking at peer reviewed studies, and there is no basis of this being true.

The other thing is that what the doctors tell me and what I've gotten from watching these videos is first, I don't know that there is a 'virus'. For all I know, there are 100 viruses. We all have coronavirus in us anyway. We'll get to that when we get to **Story #17**. The one thing that is killing people is hypoxia, and many different things can cause hypoxia.

Zach Bush did an incredible interview with Jeffrey Smith. He talked about cyanide poisoning being one of them, and there is a question of what is in the spraying. Hypoxia is definitely something caused by EMF radiation and potentially 5G, including combining with other things.

What hypoxia means is that you are not getting enough oxygen. Well, why would you do something that would lower your oxygen unless you wanted to die?

Farrell: This is my complete problem. I was talking with Justin (Woods-Solari staff) recently, and I mentioned to him the French study. There was a study done in France, and smokers are 17% less likely to get the virus. That is 'out of the blue'.

There is so much 'galloping' hypocrisy with this whole narrative to begin with because there is no concern in the American 'propatainment' media about all these rioters out there without their masks spreading COVID like 'crazy'.

In other words, this is the magic virus once again. It seems not to be affected by spread if you are rioting, looting, and toppling statues, but if you are holding Presidential rallies, then better have your mask on. It is so ridiculous.

Fitts: My favorite article on this topic is from the *New York Post*:

Lincoln County, Oregon, has exempted nonwhite people from a new order requiring that face coverings be worn in public – to prevent racial profiling.

Health officials announced last week residents must wear face coverings in public settings where they may come within 6 feet of another individual who is not from the same household.

But people of color do not have to follow the new rule if they have 'heightened concerns about racial profiling and harassment' over wearing the masks, officials said.

It's a magic virus, and it's a smart virus!

I was expecting that once it was okay for everybody to go out and protest, more people would realize that something was terribly wrong.

Farrell: I go back to the other big cultural bugaboo, particularly in the US(S)A – pardon my joke there: With our 'quackademic' system and our education system, we have created a whole group of people who simply are oblivious to reality and to any critical thought. That is part of it; they are willing to believe anything that they see on the 'boob tube', and no one is pointing any of this out.

Fitts: So, what happened to the pastors when they were told that the churches were not essential?

Farrell: I've been talking with a couple of people who I stay in contact with as to why the hierarchy of the Orthodox Church jurisdictions in this country just rolled over and played dead, and were putting up services online and so on. Well, the bottom line is that you cannot take communion online. That's a big problem. There was all of this, and I'm 'bowled' over at the lack of pushback; I'm totally bowled over by it; it bodes ill.

Fitts: I think that much of this is they have a system going, and they are calibrating the system. So, the software predicts how people will react. Then they recalibrate the system, which includes the mind control.

Farrell: From the beginning, I have said that part of the agenda or goals of this operation was to map the inflection points culturally where they were going

to encounter the most resistance. In that respect, I think that it has been wildly successful for them.

Fitts: We have an absolutely brilliant subscriber who I really appreciate very much. He is always coming up with these incredibly important stories. Two years ago, he said, “Nokia and Vodafone just did a deal to build a 4G network on the moon.”

I was like, “No way!” Sure enough, it was true. He had the press release from Vodafone. So, he is always coming up with these great stories.

He said to me about six months ago, “I appreciate that you’ve never read *Harry Potter*, but you have to- you have to understand *Harry Potter*.”

I tried reading the first book, and it was a dreadful experience. I couldn’t bear it. So on the second book, I said, “I’ll do the movie.” I watched the movie, and that was almost as unbearable, but I got through it. I have not made it to the third, but I somewhat got the MO. He was right; I needed to hear it.

If you read *Harry Potter*, all the parents in your family are Muggles; they are idiots; they are stupid. The elites are wizards and they have all these magical powers. If you are really lucky, you get to leave your family and go to school where it’s only children learning from wizards.

That is teeing up the world for contact tracing. That is what it appears to me, and this leads us to **Story #12**.

Story #12: Zombie Management 101 – Interacting with the Mind-Controlled and Fear-Porned.

The number one concern I hear from our subscribers is the fear of interacting with people who don’t understand what is going on and can’t see it – not because they are bad people, but because they are busy and they haven’t learned enough about all the different parts of the control grid to see it come together in this way. If you look at what is happening now, it’s an integrated ploy of many different things that have been prototyped all along. Whether it’s the different epidemics – you’ve watched that – or the different forms of control mecha-

nisms, or how they manage targeting, all of the component pieces, people like you and I have watched and known that this was going on. When this comes together, it's easier to understand.

So part of it is, they can't fathom it. But then you also have people who are totally mind-controlled, or they are paid to do something ridiculous. So, you have large numbers of actors wearing black who are apologizing for their white privilege.

How much do you think they get per hour to do that?

Farrell: I don't know. It would have to be significant because, in a certain sense, they are out there risking limb if not life. I'm suspecting that there has to be a very sizeable 'chunk of money' behind it.

We had this discussion in my vidchat with the very issue that you are raising with people who seemed to be oblivious to what is going on or something is not computing or are totally sold on the narrative. I think it is essential for us who are trying to push back that we realize our job is not to win each and every argument or discussion that we have with these people. Our job is simply to be there and plant the seed and plant the time bombs. When you get good at planting time bombs, those people will eventually come back and tell you, "Oh, the bomb just went off."

That may be months or years down the line. This has happened to me. I've had this happen where somebody will come back ten years later and say, "Remember when you said such-and-such?" Finally, something clicked.

We have to have that mentality. We are not there to win each and every argument or discussion; we are there to plant seeds, and we don't know when those things are going to go off, but they will go off. Just keep planting.

We are back to my story of sharing my piece of paper and saying, "Look at this." Most of those people probably aren't going to do it, but one or two may. That is all it takes. Once they see there is another side that is not being presented to them, then they begin to question why it is not being presented and who is

behind the cover-up, and so on. Then they, in their turn, start sowing the seeds. That is what we have to do.

Fitts: I'll say another thing, "Any seed you plant, the blossoms could save a life."

Farrell: Absolutely, it could save a family, or it could save your local school. We don't know. We are not the generals in charge of this operation; we are the sergeants and foxhole privates in all of this. That has to be our mentality. This is a full-on culture war, and we have to take every opportunity that we can to defend it and promote it. It's in the small things that are going to do it; not the big programs or political action committees or any of this because those things have failed, quite frankly.

Fitts: One of the reasons I wanted to do '**The Best Resources**' for our theme this *Wrap Up* was that we've been posting it regularly, but I wanted to put it all together and in one place so that the 'Johnny Appleseed's' would have their toolkit.

Farrell: That is essential, and that is another thing that everyone can do to a certain extent. They can all start making their own databases of all this information and spread it around. If you are concerned about tariffs or imports or whatever it happens to be – maybe it's the local school curriculum or whatever – start building the database and sharing it with like-minded people, and let it circulate.

Fitts: One of my concerns is that I am having subscribers, and people in our audience email me. Many times, they work for the state government or university. They say, "My employer requires me in the fall to have the flu shot, take any COVID vaccines, and be tested."

This is at the same time that they are turning 5G on. My concern is that these things could kill them.

Farrell: My concern is that, too.

Fitts: Also, one of the reasons they want contact tracing is that 5G and the vaccines are going to make so many people sick or kill them, and they want to blame it on this invisible perfect virus. Contact tracing makes a way of going in and interceding where they can protect their cover story.

Farrell: That is exactly it; this is the magic virus. My concern is similar to yours, but my other concern is, for example, Sidney Powell. You mentioned her in **Part I** with the Flynn case. She did that as far as I know, and did that pro bono.

Where are the lawyers willing to step forward and go after these policy decisions and bring them to court for their unconstitutionality? We need it done.

Fitts: If you go to www.Solari.com, there is a new box for the ‘*Take Action Crowdfund*’ and it will take you to a website. There are three pages; one takes you to the Children’s Health Defense who are litigating like ‘crazy’ on 5G, on vaccine mandates, and on all of this.

Farrell: I’m glad to hear that.

Fitts: I’m telling you to sign up and join them. I’ve done a couple of interviews with Mary Holland, who is their vice-chairman. Sign up and become a member. It’s \$10 to be a lifetime member. It doesn’t matter what you give, even if you only give a dollar. Politically it counts how many donors they have.

The second tab is for the Farm-to-Consumer Legal Defense Fund, which litigates over farming and protecting small farmers. The third tab is for donating money to *Solari*, and we are giving it to those two organizations, plus other people who are helping either with the independent media to support litigation or to litigation itself.

Farrell: Good for you!

Fitts: There is a quote at the front. This came from a discussion that I had with a wonderful subscriber who is also a member of Giza Death Star. They said, “Should I do precious metals or real estate?”

I said to them, “Honestly, if you don’t have an army, there is no point in having assets because you are going to lose your assets. So, what you need to do is start financing your army.”

That is the quote on the front of the ‘*Take Action*’ page, “If you don’t have an army, you won’t have assets.”

Farrell: I didn’t know that you were doing this, and I ‘tip my hat’ to you. I will look at it later because that is exactly the sort of thing that I am talking about that needs to be done. We are no longer in the position that we are able to simply talk about this; we have to start pushing back in a major way.

Fitts: I am now working with a series of different attorneys to do more written material on the legal issues on these things for *The Solari Report*, and I think that is important.

I received an email from someone starting a committee of ‘safety to work with their sheriff’s office’ on these issues. I am a member of the Tennessee Firearms Association and the Tennessee Sheriffs Association. The Tennessee Firearms Association is a fabulous association. There are many good groups locally, and there are many good groups like Children’s Health Defense and Farm-to-Consumer Legal Defense Fund. If you sign up as a member, if you promote their cause, if you can only afford to give them a dollar, give them a dollar. It makes a difference.

If we all just do what we can do, it can make an incredible difference.

I know it’s true for Giza Death Star, but for *Solari* we have all these subscribers who are sharing information and helping each other write to their city council. We have published a couple of their letters so that they can share it among each other. We can do this together; we don’t have to do it alone, but we have to take action.

Farrell: We do.

Fitts: I would say that the hardest thing for me on zombie management is that I keep seeing people in a trance. I watched a video recently of a policeman try-

ing to have an intelligent conversation with one of the protestors, and the protestor kept coming back with all these phrases and slogans, but it was clear that they didn't really have any ideology or philosophy; it was just programming.

I watched another video of a trainer teaching children how to scream at their parents, and basically abuse their parents. I had a parent write to me whose child did it to him. He said, "If my kids had been in a car wreck and died, I don't think that I could feel worse," because they treated him like he was a stranger or a foreigner, and they just projected hate at him.

I wrote him back and said, "Look, what you need to know is that your children are the victims here. They are being manipulated by very powerful technology and an operation. You are their parent, and it is your job to protect them and to help them, even though it hurts and it is painful."

I gave him a whole list of links of different things to study and read. He wrote back and said, "I knew that if I talked to you, I would feel better," because he had a pathway. He had a way of going about it as a parent. He loves his children, but he was watching his children's minds – if not their bodies – being kidnapped. Their minds are being kidnapped.

Farrell: This is another reason that people need to start looking at and scrutinizing their local school systems and the people running them.

Fitts: Why is anyone sending anybody to a public school? They are loading the 5G systems into the schools. So when they get back in September, they will have social distancing, they are going to have masks, they are going to have vaccines, and they will have 5G. It's not safe.

Farrell: In addition to that, they will not have sports programs and music programs. You can't have school orchestras if you have a mask on and you are trying to play the flute. This is totally 'nuts'.

I remember you mentioning the mother's protest in Sacramento a while ago. Do you remember that?

Fitts: That was Robert Kennedy's speech. If history is accurate, that will go down as one of the greatest speeches of this decade.

Farrell: That is what needs to happen. These people need to start showing up.

When all of this rioting started, I don't know if you saw this story: The rioting had spread to Spokane, Washington. Antifa or some group had announced that Coeur d'Alene, Idaho was next.

Fitts: I could have told them they weren't going to go to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho!

Farrell: People showed up on the streets in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho armed. I'm afraid it's fast approaching that point where these people are going to have to be shown that if you want to implement these programs, you have a fight on your hands because they will do it if there is no pushback.

Fitts: The *Movie of the Year* last year was *Yellowstone*. Have you watched *Yellowstone* yet?

Farrell: I have not watched it yet.

Fitts: *Yellowstone* is about an area in Montana where everybody is fighting to steal the land from the owners. There are two men named the Beck brothers who are the dirtiest and the most evil. Finally, the lead rancher says, "Okay, I've got to deal with them because law enforcement won't deal with them, and the sheriff won't deal with them. I've got to take it upon myself to get rid of the Beck brothers," and he does.

Right before the last scene – and I don't want to give the whole story away – one of the men who showed up to deal with the Beck brothers said to them, "Why do you do this?" It's the frog and the scorpion question. "Why do you always behave this badly?"

The Beck brothers said, "Because nobody ever fights back."

I said at the end of the year, 2020 was going to be the year that we would have to deal with the Beck brothers, and it turns out that was a remarkably accurate prediction now.

Farrell: It was an absolute spot-on prediction because we are seeing it happen.

Fitts: Right, and the Beck brothers play dirty.

One of the questions I received from a subscriber was, “Oh, are the Beck brothers an *entendre* for Bechtel?”

I thought that was pretty cute.

I got some very serious pushback from a couple of subscribers who said, “How could you possibly recommend that? It’s horribly violent. It’s disgracefully violent.”

I said to them, “America is disgracefully violent. The Beck brothers kill with impunity. That is their strength. Unless we deal with that, we are going to become slaves.”

Farrell: That is absolutely right. I go back to what we said in *Part I*: I think that this is the underlying fact that gun sales are so off the charts in the country right now in this COVID narrative. People are arming up.

Fitts: What that experience told me is that there is still a tremendous number of people who have been really blessed to live in a place where they felt totally safe – physically – and now they are going to lose that.

Farrell: Absolutely, they are.

Fitts: I want to mention a couple of the interesting things that happened in this. A Hollywood stuntman made a documentary called *Out of the Shadows* that basically outed the pedophilia in Hollywood. It was a very sophisticated, credible production; it was a very high-quality Hollywood production. I thought, “Hmnm. We are now getting serious people with serious resources who are

ready to deal with the real problems.” I think that is what I would call Zombie pushback; they have had it with this zombie thing.

Science & Technology

Story #13: Wireless Technology – 5G, Crowd Control, and EMF Radiation & Weaponry

One of the books I reviewed this quarter was *The Invisible Rainbow* by Arthur Firstenberg, which is an amazing book. I got halfway on the Kindle and finished it only to realize that the reason I was only halfway was that the other 50% of the book is footnotes. It is the only time I have ever seen a book with almost as many footnotes as yours.

Basically, what Firstenberg is able to prove beyond a shadow of a doubt is that whenever you have a big increase in electrification or EMF radiation, you get dramatic global influenza epidemics. It absolutely looks like COVID-19 is a cover story for whatever is going on.

Farrell: I’ve been thinking that all along that we are not dealing with a virus; the virus is the front for perhaps several different mechanisms that are at work here.

Fitts: Right, injections.

Farrell: Exactly. The injections and 5G and the electromagnetic radiation and the spraying and so on. I think that it’s a cover. The reason I think that is if we look at the way that the people involved in the operation have been talking about it, – and we can take Dr. (Grouchy) Fauci as an example. To my utter shock, Sean Hannity at Fox News has been playing along with this whole narrative.

Fitts: That’s disgusting!

Farrell: It’s ‘off the charts’. I have lost any minimum amount of respect that I had for him to begin with.

Fitts: He is a big real estate investor. He must be in on the Opportunity Zones.

Farrell: I don't know what is going on, but Fauci has been pushing this narrative in those conferences that the President was holding for a while that, "There will be no return to normal." I think that is a little indicator they plan to use this virus as the magic virus to cover up a multitude of different mechanisms and to cover up a multitude of different sins.

I see no reason whatsoever that there cannot be a return to normal, and that there should be a return to normal. This lockdown business and gradual phase-ins and all of that have to stop. Let people make their own health choices.

Fitts: Forest Maredy is the person who grew up playing the pipe organ. He wrote a book called *The Autism Vaccine*, which is one of the best books I've ever read on the whole vaccine debate. Then he wrote a book called *Unvaccinated* and a book called *Crooked*. His last book is *The Moth in the Iron Lung*, which is a biography of polio.

When you evaluate those four books, they are about the history of injecting heavy metals into the human body and the mess it makes of the neurological system.

Farrell: It makes a mess of the neurological system, the immune system, the gastrointestinal system, and virtually every major system that we depend on for life and human life. They are all under assault by those things.

Fitts: He goes through all these different diseases, and you realize – and I said this in the first quarter – that all these diseases are just made up baskets of symptoms from poisoning. What we have is poisoning, and we've just tried to define the different symptoms of those poisonings as if they are conditions – which they are not, they are only symptoms of poisoning.

If you look at the majority of poisonings, they are heavy metal poisonings. The worst part is when you put heavy metals into people's brains, they stop thinking clearly.

After you read all of Mearady's books, you realize there is no way that you are going to roll out 5G and a number of new injections that have brain-machine interface and nanoparticles, and all this 'crap', and you are not going to have massive diseases.

Farrell: You are going to have massive diseases and death. Let's be honest: I think that is part of their agenda. 'Baal' Gates is a depopulation guy, a Malthusian.

Fitts: We've had a new study that shows that since the lockdown began, 200 fewer children are dying every week.

Farrell: I wonder why!

Fitts: One of the reasons *Vaxxed II* is such an interesting documentary is that the people who made *Vaxxed* were very familiar with one or two vaccines. It wasn't until they went on the road with *Vaxxed II* that they discovered the breadth and width and depth of the problem on all vaccines, and they really got to know all the unvaccinated children. That is why they don't want unvaccinated children in school. If everybody sees how much healthier they are, forget the health. Do you have any idea how much cheaper it is to raise an unvaccinated child versus a vaccinated child? The vaccinated child is like an annuity for the pharmaceutical companies; they are constantly sick.

You see as you go through *Vaxxed II* the extraordinary damage and deaths.

Farrell: It is unbelievable. I watched it for the first time recently, and I was appalled at how costly all of this really is.

You are exactly right. I think the reason they want to push this vaccine agenda in the schools is precisely so that the people cannot see healthy children with normal brains and normal male or female activities that they want to engage in. It is unbelievable.

Fitts: One of the questions that I have – and I don't know the answer – is if you are putting in all this foreign DNA and male and female gene material into

these children, so boys are getting girls' DNA and girls are getting boys' DNA, is that part of this transgender movement?

Farrell: I absolutely think so. I think that it is part of the transhumanist agenda. You review that book, and Dr. de Hart and I were really dumbfounded by that aspect of it. It appeared that they were trying to crawl back up the alchemical ladder to the primordial androgen. All of this business about which bathroom people use, I think that is part of their agenda.

I have a couple of trans people who are members of my website, and they are not in favor of all this going on socially. I can't figure it out other than that.

One of the things that we ran across when we were doing the *Transhumanism* book -we didn't talk much about it in the book-was that women who are sometimes born with a Y chromosome – which is a very rare condition, but it does occasionally occur – have enormous health problems. Now they are putting in all of this 'crap' into vaccines. What is that going to do over the long term?

I go back to something else I said about GMOs: When GMOs 'came down the pike', there were no long-term intergenerational studies that were genuine of the effects of those things on the environment and on human health. By parity of reasoning, there are no long-term intergenerational health studies of the impact of what they are putting into these vaccines in terms of human DNA.

You can't tell me that the long-term effects aren't going to be deleterious in the extreme.

Fitts: We had the Bostock decision in the Supreme Court during the *2nd Quarter*, and I found myself having to explain again what you and I have discussed. As you know, I believe that one of the reasons this is all being promoted is to redo the labor and taxation systems so that you can integrate robots with humans, and then all the gradations in between. They clearly want to prototype cyborgs and integrate all types of machine and digital technology into the human body. That is part of getting people to think about the human body in a much more fluid way. "I am a boy, but I can be a girl, and then I can go back to being a boy."

Part of that is so that if you have one system, you are going to save hundreds of billions of dollars if not trillions by integrating.

The other thing is that if everybody has brain-machine interface, then you can get the humans to teach the robots how to do their job. You just hook everybody up to the cloud, and you can teach them by trial and error.

Farrell: Right, and you can offer them tax rebates or tax cuts if they do so – whatever the plan is. That is exactly what they are up to.

Fitts: It is very dark.

Farrell: It is ‘As in the days of Noah’ dark stuff.

Fitts: I want to discuss your book, *The Tower of Babel*, because I was reading it and thinking that I never understood the Tower of Babel until I read your book. It’s one of those things in the Bible that you don’t quite understand. You think, “I’ll deal with it later.”

I realized in reading *The Tower of Babel* that they have found what they did technologically with the Tower of Babel moment, a way to do it so that people who speak the same language can’t communicate. It’s amazing.

Farrell: The soft way of doing it is to apply the old gnostic techniques. Use the same words, but give them special meanings to your community.

For example, the Gnostics would talk about salvation, but they would mean something completely different than their Christian opposition meant using the same word. They did this with every specialized word or vocabulary that they could. Really when you study it, it’s a technique; take the religious aspect out of it. Gnosticism is a technique for the subversion of any cultural institution whatsoever – be it political, judiciary, whatever. They use different definitions of the same words. Ultimately, that means that communication breaks down; you are not able to communicate.

There is that wonderful scene in C.S. Lewis’s *That Hideous Strength*, where the National Institute of Coordinate Experiments (which is what he called it, or

NICE is the acronym) are having a big banquet and celebrating all their diabolical plans, and they get hit with their own technique where their speech is scrambled, and no one can understand each other anymore. That is exactly what is going on. We are in a situation where, as I said, we have two cultures that are using the same common language but meaning entirely different things by it.

One side says, “We need justice,” and the other side says, “Yeah, we need equal application of the law or justice,” but they mean entirely different things.

Fitts: One of the things that I am watching in these videos are two people talking, and one understands the definitions of the words they are using, and they understand what they mean. They believe it’s real; they believe the ideas are real, they believe the conversation is real, and the other does not understand the words they are using, they don’t understand the meaning of the words, and they don’t think it is relevant. They don’t feel it’s necessary.

Farrell: You are mentioning something critical here, and I’m glad that you said it. If you watch the modern American ‘propatainment’ media and watch the news shows, particularly when they try to bring in someone from the opposition to have a conversation, look and listen very carefully. Are they really having a conversation? No, they are not because they cannot hear each other anymore because they apply different meanings to those words. For some of these people, the words have lost all meaning whatsoever.

Fitts: They don’t care.

Farrell: They don’t care, so it’s all only an exercise in make-believe.

When people tell me that they want to have a conversation with me, or they want a dialogue with me or that they want to discuss something with me, I usually immediately have my needle in the suspicion zone – in the red zone – because that means to those people, the Gnostics, “We will talk until you agree with us.”

There is no attempt on the part of those types of dialecticians to have a real conversation and to move in any sort of compromising way. That is why the politics in this country has completely broken down. That is why we are in a cul-

ture war. It's the application of all these gnostic techniques that have been dressed up by the Frankfurt School, by the Gramscian Marxists, and so on. This is exactly what is going on.

Fitts: Many people I see discussing these things, certainly on the Democratic or progressive side, are paid to discuss them. So, they have never had to support themselves in a real marketplace.

Farrell: The only marketplace they could support themselves in now is academia, and in my opinion – especially in this country – is a totally co-opted institution. So they would be right at home there, but they don't have to face a real academic atmosphere where they encounter real hard philosophical opposition.

So, you are right. You are dealing with people who have never had to compete in the marketplace of ideas. They wouldn't know how.

Fitts: I don't think they have ever had to compete in the marketplace to earn a useful living. In other words, part of the discussion – the real debate – is between the productive and the unproductive. The unproductive are mostly subsidized.

Farrell: They are, and this is an important point for people to take away: They are subsidized with more than just money; they are subsidized by being put in situations where others are in agreement with them or others are forced to be in agreement with them. In other words, that is somewhat of an intellectual subsidy. I know that may not make sense to most people, but it goes on in 'quackademia' like 'nobody's business'. There is a reason our educational institutions are failing – because they have surrounded themselves with people of similar minds for so long that there is no more real genuine academic discussion. It's that bad.

Fitts: It's remarkable how many parents I have heard in the *2nd Quarter* say, "I'm not paying for my child to go to a university if they are going to give online classes. I'm not paying for my child to go to a private school if this is what they get. So, I'm not paying \$40,000 or \$50,000 a year for online education. It's not worth it."

Farrell: I totally agree. What has to happen, thinking down the line, is a parallel education system has to be created and accredited.

Fitts: I think it's time. I've asked a couple of people, "Would you be willing to design and teach a course through *Solari*?"

I see a tremendous need and demand for serious intellectual training, and it's not there.

Farrell: What is going to happen, I suspect, if this 'owning the culture' idea really gets percolating in people's minds – and I've thought this for a very long time – is you are going to see a return to a patronage system, the wealthy people who can afford that kind of education. You will see the return of a tutoring system where people are hiring private tutors to teach their children in 'this, that, and the other'. and then measure the success on their placement exams and so forth.

That is the other thing that I think is going to inevitably happen; the demise of the standardized test. That was one of the first big wrong turns this country took and then took the rest of the world with it.

I look back to my high school days, and I was put into an accelerated mathematics program when I was in the 7th grade. That followed me all the way through middle school and then high school. Every one of my mathematics teachers wanted to see the work – the actual solution and how we got there – rather than just the answer. They wanted to see the process of mathematical reasoning that led us to whatever conclusion we came to.

Standardized tests will not allow you to do that, and it's even worse in disciplines in history or philosophy and so on where the process of reasoning is all-important rather than ticking off a preselected answer on a standardized test. That whole system has to go. I think eventually we are looking at a situation in this country where the education is so bad, and just like you and I hear this from members of my website who are either teachers trying to teach something in this mess of a system, and they are saying the same thing. It's going to happen inevitably.

Fitts: You have to pull out.

Farrell: If we don't, then culturally I think we are facing that we are going to end up a third world country where people who graduate from these 'quackademies' in gender studies or whatever nonsense that they happen to be studying can't fix a jet engine on an airplane. It's that bad.

Fitts: I would say it differently: I think that between immigration and robotics, they will simply depopulate the crew they can 'dumb down'. I think it's a depopulation plan.

Farrell: It's that, too.

Fitts: One thing that I want to bring up before we leave 5G is you had many great blog posts. I think this is a world where you have to read Giza Death Star at least once a week.

Why are the ships at sea going in circles?

Farrell: When I saw that, I thought, "You've got to be kidding!"

There are ships sailing around in circles, and nobody knows why. They are following their compasses and so on. I'm thinking, number one, we have a considerable factor of stupidity involved because ship compasses are not magnetic compasses; they are inertial compasses; they are gyroscopic compasses. So, for a ship's compass – a gyroscopic compass – to go bad has nothing to do with pole shifts, it has nothing to do with geostationary satellite positioning, or nothing of that sort. It has to do with good old-fashioned navigation. Take out your sextant, look for the pole star and that sort of thing, and keeping your gyroscopic compass fixed and functioning.

What this is telling me is that we have a whole industry not using these things.

Fitts: They're trying to navigate the seas with automatic pilot.

Farrell: Yes-that doesn't go anywhere!

I didn't mention it in the story, but I remember a few years back the US Navy had decided that it needed to start teaching navigation again. Do you remember that? "Take out the sextant. Look for the pole star, and figure out where you are," because if the digital system goes down and you don't know how to fix your gyroscopic compass, then how will you know where you are going to send your ship?

They are trying to build out redundancy in the system, but I thought, "You've got to be kidding!"

Fitts: This is why I bought a manual typewriter. As far as I'm concerned, the system is not trustworthy. You may go to www.Lehmans.com for nonelectric goods.

We already dove into **Story #14**, but we're back:

Story #14: Transhumanism – Creepy Technology in Hotel Auschwitz.

This quarter was just one 'creepy' technology after another. In fact, in *State of Our Currency* I got Jason Worth to write for me something called *Injectables*, and I will send it to you. It's a review of all the 'creepy' technology that is involved in trying to understand what the injectable credit cards are going to be made of. They are prototyping and trying all sorts of things.

You have 91 companies working on COVID-19 vaccinations, and I think it's that they want to try a large number of things. I think this is going to be the biggest illegal violation of the Nuremberg Principle; this is going to be a huge experiment.

Farrell: What is evil about it is they have no idea about what the long-term effects of any of this is going to be. In other words, they are playing dice with all of humanity.

Fitts: Here is what I think: They have a vision of how they are going to run everything with AI and software and 5G and all the robots and all the humans and combinations thereof, – which they will test and play with – and are going

to be hooked up to the AI and the cloud through the software. They have to figure out how to do Windows/1984 in all the humans. They have no idea how to do it, but they are going to try 100 different things, and they are going to see what works and what doesn't. They will evolve it by trial and error because that's how you do it if you want to go fast.

Judy Mikovits, for very different reasons, said that a COVID-19 vaccine will kill 50 million people. In fact, if you look at the rollout of the EMF radiation in 1918, it killed 50 million people.

So whether it's 5G or the injectables, if you look at history and what they have killed before, the 50 million number is not outlandish.

Farrell: It's not outlandish, but the reason I think this shotgun approach that they are trying, which is what you do when you want to go fast and you don't know exactly what is going to work, you try a number of things. The hidden assumption here is that they (meaning the so-called 'elite') think they are going to be immune from it. I suspect that the opposite is going to happen; they are making themselves the most susceptible to their own tricks.

What we have is an elite that, while they don't know it, are committing suicide.

Fitts: I believe they are.

Farrell: They are endangering themselves. Like it or not, when you lose elites, and it's everybody for themselves, that is when it gets really messy. This is my biggest fear.

'Baal and Malicious' Gates may think that they are doing the world a wonderful thing until they realize that they have been caught in their own snare.

Fitts: One of the things that I think triggered what is happening with COVID-19 or whatever it is, there was a large meeting in December in Switzerland where the world's vaccination program admitted they were stalled, and the only thing that could get them going again was scientific proof that vaccines were safe and effective, and they had none.

Farrell: Right, so now they've created a big experiment. The way it looks is that this 'plandemic' was a plan for quite a long time. They have simply rolled it out at an opportune political and cultural moment. In other words, they have stepped up their schedule a bit.

They are shooting the dice on the craps table here with this one, and – not to coin a pun – I think they will come up snake eyes. They are not factoring in their own susceptibility to their own plans, which is always the hidden problem with elites. They think they are immune to their own plans.

Fitts: One of the challenges, I think, in being in Europe and watching America from afar –

Farrell: Oh, aren't you lucky!

Fitts: I think that when you mind control a population to the extent that we have, there is tremendous blowback because it's your morphogenic field, too. If you are a hypermaterialist, you don't realize that is a big problem.

I keep saying that people who win in a rigged game get stupid. I think that the blowback from the mind control is causing all sorts of unintended consequences.

Farrell: I do, too, and I agree with you. A large part of it is the stupidity of the so-called elite. Let's look at it a different way: In recent years, Zbigniew Brzezinski died, David Rockefeller died, and so all the old guard is no longer there to put the brakes on all of this stupidity. What you see now are the young Turks who have surrounded themselves with their own yes men. Just thank Dr. Fauci and 'Baal' Gates and that whole murky relationship.

Fitts: I know I've told this story many times, but I will tell it again. In the late 1980's, I would go to Easthampton, and my neighbor was a fabulous, unbelievably wealthy, successful Wall Street banker who had left one of the big firms. He was from a very wealthy family. He made a great deal of money in distressed real estate in New York, and he was reinvesting his money and managing his own money. He was a wonderful man who was very iconoclastic, and we had a lot of fun.

We would go out and talk about how ridiculous the world was. He was very interested in the ‘real deal’, and we would like looking ‘under the carpet’. So, I really enjoyed talking to him. He never bought the ‘Kool-Aid’. He operated from the time he was a tiny child at a very high level, so he had a real perspective.

In 1996 or 1997, I went back to see him, and had lunch with him. I hadn’t seen him for about six years. The stock market was going up and the lies were getting thicker and thicker, and the secrecy was getting bigger and bigger.

I started to talk to him, and then realized, “Oh my God! He’s bought the narrative. He’s forgotten.”

It was almost like he didn’t have enough people to talk to, and he was starting to believe the lies. I had spent that entire period unpacking how the government money really works, so I had fantastic intelligence about how the system was managed and rigged. So while he was getting more and more mind-controlled about the money, I was getting more and more intelligent about the money. We had always been tight, and suddenly we were far apart.

I realized, “Oh, this is really bad because this guy is as smart as it gets. If he is buying the ‘Kool-Aid’, then he has forgotten how things really work.”

There is nothing more dangerous than being highly subsidized and not realizing it. It is a very dangerous place to be.

Farrell: It is, and people have to wake up and realize that all of us have been highly subsidized, and have been in one form or fashion. When that system comes crashing down, be prepared to reinvent virtually every institution that you can think of.

Fitts: Story #15: Inventions – Global 2.0 to 3.0 Accelerates.

I have to ask you: What is this thing about the new CERN (European Organization for Nuclear Research)?

CERN is poised to back a plan for a \$20 billion successor to the Large Hadron Collider.

Farrell: This is going to be the collider of all colliders! They are talking about a collider around 60 kilometers. That is gigantic!

Fitts: We have the ‘mother’ of all global resets and the mother of all debt entrapment, so it’s appropriate that we have the mother of all colliders.

Farrell: I saw this thing, and hesitated about sending it to you, and I haven’t even blogged about it because I really can’t figure this one out.

Fitts: Whoa! That’s scary!

Farrell: I saw an article by a physicist who said, “Why are we going to build a monster collider that may not have any return on the investment?”

This physicist pointed out that the standard model is that we are investing more and more for less and less in terms of elaborating the standard model of quantum mechanics. I go back to something I said before: If you are a quantum physicist, go ahead and laugh at me because I’m not a scientist, but I’ve said that I don’t think CERN is about particle physics; I believe that is the cover story. I think that they are doing something else, and every now and then they give us a little hint.

We might be looking for physical proof of other dimensions and subjects like that. The clue for me was when the Chinese came out and said, “We want to build our own version of CERN.”

Fitts: Is that going forward, or is part of the giant debt entrapment to stop that, too?

Farrell: Maybe, but I don’t know. I’ve suspected that because I haven’t heard anything more about that Chinese collider since they first announced they wanted to build their own. But when they did, I thought, “They want to build their own because they want to check the results.”

You and I can't go into our garage and turn on our collider to check whether CERN is doing what they are saying they are doing. However, I strongly suspect that China suspects there is something wrong. In order to figure out what it is, we are going to have to build our own.

Now CERN comes out and says that they want to build a bigger one. For the life of me, they even admit that with the energies they are planning for their collider, they don't know if they are going to find anything significant. So, they are willing to spend billions of euros to construct this thing on the whim that it is going to elaborate some unknown particle in the standard model. I'm sorry, but that dog doesn't 'hunt' for me; they are looking for something else.

Fitts: Is it possible that they said, "Physicists are very smart people. We need to keep them busy so they're not paying attention to what is really going on? We could create a project and hire all of them."

Farrell: That could be, too, I don't put anything past these people. "Let's build a 60-billion-euro collider to check something that we don't even know what we're going to find." That could very well be, and I don't put anything past these people. But I think it has to do with areas of physics that are way unrelated to quantum mechanics. I think it has much more to do with this hyperdimensional physics inquiry – the torsion physics. That's where I think they are really investigating.

Fitts: I agree with you.

Farrell: The fact that they are willing to spend the money to build magnets of a size that will dwarf the local magnetic field of the planet tells me that they have found something with CERN, and now they really want to go after it in a major way. To do that, we need this big 'whopping' collider.

I'll 'crawl right off the end of the twig': For all of the physicists who may be listening or reading this, you can send your hate email to me. (I am easily findable.) We are talking about 5G bioelectric nanotechnology in vaccines and so on. So, let's 'crawl way off the end of the twig': If you are dealing with magnets at CERN that are around 8 teslas, which is a 'whoppingly' large amount of magnetic field, for the life of me, I cannot figure out why that strong of a local mag-

netic field is not going to have some sort of resonant effect in the magnetic field of the planet itself. By parity of reasoning from that line of argument, I cannot see why that, in turn, is not going to have some sort of resonance effect on the sun.

I think maybe you are looking at a component of human behavior modification-geoplanetary engineering on an enormous scale that they are not willing to talk about. That is my fear. So now all the physicists can bombard me with emails and say, “You’re nuts!” But I am going to stick to it. I have my junior high school physics, too, and it’s telling me something very different about all of this.

You put that decision of CERN to build this ‘dang thing’ out there with all the articles about the discovery of the Higgs boson, which is iffy if you really dig into the literature and the people who are raising questions about that whole discovery. I think that there is something else going on with the entire thing.

Fitts: There has to be. One of the things that I can tell you about the Swiss is that they don’t waste money.

Farrell: Of course, they don’t, and the Germans are the biggest ‘shareholders’ in CERN, and they don’t waste money either.

Fitts: The Swiss don’t waste time and they don’t waste money. So whatever is going on, it’s serious.

Speaking of space, this leads us to **Story #16:**

Story #16: Space as a War-Fighting Domain.

Every time I see another chemical rocket go up, I can see you shaking your head.

There is a new documentary out about Bob Lazar and all of his discussion on antigravity technology, and you realize, “What is this chemical rocket thing?”

Farrell: There has to be something else happening here. We have these Artemis Accords that are dealing with the moon and everything, and the Ger-

mans want to build out a 4G network on the moon. Nokia wants to do something similar; it's Japan and Germany. The two axis powers want to build out a network on the moon.

I don't understand the matter of Elon Musk, SpaceX, Robert Bigelow, and all these people getting into the private space race, except for one thing: If you have been building out exotic technology in a secret space program since the end of World War II, and have had trillions of dollars to play with and invent something cool-every scientist wants to invent something cool. If you've done that, then the way you spin yourself out of the needless public technology is to shove it into the private sector, and you keep the good 'stuff' for yourself. That is what I think is going on here..

I think there is an aspect of what we were talking about in the Secret Space Program conferences that were behind this move to privatize space so everybody can 'ooh' and 'ahh' and wonder at Elon Musk being able to launch these reusable boosters while the real happenings are occurring somewhere else.

I don't care how big of a booster Elon Musk builds. Chemical rockets 'ain't' going to do the job-they're just not going to do it. And anybody who is anybody really knows that. So I would tell people, "If you really want to look at space and what is going on, follow very closely Dr. Harold White at NASA and his space warp project. Pay attention to DARPA's pronouncements."

Listen to this, and I've said this before: They want the United States to be warp-capable within a century. What does that tell you about where the real technological interest is? It's not in chemical rockets.

Fitts: Absolutely, but I think that part of what is happening with the chemical rockets and SpaceX is they are trying to get thousands and thousands of young people interested in becoming space engineers.

Farrell: Right, or Space Force volunteers.

Fitts: The movie that we will have with this interview is a short documentary on the Rosetta Mission, which I found to be a very inspiring mission. That was the European Space Agency sending a satellite. The Rosetta landed on an aster-

oid, so it was the first asteroid landing. It was interesting because I remember when it happened.

Here you have a group of engineers who have been working on this for more than ten years, and they are waiting to see if it works. Can you imagine working for ten years? And then when it worked, they were just elated! You've never seen a look of such joy.

I always found the Rosetta Mission to be very inspiring.

Farrell: It's inspiring also because if I were an engineer, the most inspiring thing about it would be that they have learned to fine-tune the mathematics of their telemetry in dealing with gravitational mass of very small objects. That is a nice little step to have in the technology 'tree' if you are thinking about building other types of technology to get out there. Do you follow me?

Fitts: Yes.

Farrell: That was a huge step in that technology tree.

Fitts: One of the things that they make clear in the documentary is what a joint effort it was. You had the French, the Germans, and many different countries involved. It was a major collaboration.

There was one time in the documentary where they say, "We were stuck." They didn't say, "The French are crazy enough to do this," but it was the French who said, "Yeah, let's go for it!" It was somewhat like the Lafayette spirit.

One of the things that I want to bring up was about my conversation with Richard Dolan. We talked about the issue of sovereignty. For the Pentagon to come out and confirm the UFO videos are real, is a very big moment in time, and it got very little attention. *Solari Report* covered it and I think you mentioned it. Richard did a great video, but there was silence. Considering the importance of that statement, it was an extraordinary silence.

Then Richard did an online webinar, and he has been very reluctant to make a final decision on if aliens exist and live among us. He finally said, “Yes, I think they do.” He walked through why he believed that.

Farrell: My suspicion is that there is an aspect of this whole coronavirus hysteria – the ‘pandemic’ – that has something to do with space, and the contact tracing may be for the covert purpose of tracking a population that may be on this planet that is not entirely human or is of the genus homo, but not of the species homo sapiens sapiens. If they look like us, walk like us, and ‘quack’ like us, the only way you can tell them apart is genetically.

Fitts: If you look at the testing they are doing, it appears to be DNA testing; it doesn’t look like flu testing.

Farrell: That is exactly my point.

Fitts: I’ve always been reluctant to come out with an opinion on any of this, other than the navy trying to persuade me to have lunch with aliens. So sometimes, I wonder what would have happened if I went to lunch.

I’ve never met an alien story that I couldn’t explain with mind control. There is so much disinformation on this planet that you don’t know what to do. But the reality is that whatever is going on, I don’t know how you keep it secret. If you look at the money and time and investment that they are putting into secrecy, it is extraordinary. One of my questions is: Is the goal of the brain-machine interface to mind control people because they need that to keep the secrecy going? I don’t know.

Farrell: That could be. There is any number of ways to parse the scenario. I did this blog about some company that was deliberately testing human populations – I think it was in Tibet or Nepal – for genetic outliers. I thought, “Isn’t that interesting that we have companies now doing this as a focus of their research!”

The question is: Why? Certainly, a nonhuman population would be considered a genetic outlier. I did a show a while ago with Richard Hoagland about the virus, and he presented a very interesting case that he thought that part of this virus

may have been extraterrestrial in origin. In other words, we are looking at a Michael Crichton *Andromeda Strain* type of scenario with it. It is a very weird virus and it behaves very peculiarly. He pointed out that it seemed to him to have some mind control implications to it.

Is the mind control because they want to keep secrets locked down? Or is the mind control because they are preparing us for a narrative that we would not normally be predisposed to believe? It could be any number of these things. I honestly don't know what the answer is other than if it is the case that there is a nonhuman human-looking population among us, – if that is the case – then I think that the old adage holds true, “You shall know them by their fruits.”

If they are decent, then we will know by the fruits. If they are not, we will know by the fruits. My suspicion is probably the latter.

Fitts: Richard Dolan did an interview with David Jacobs several years ago that he just reran. He talked about a hybrid breeding program. Interestingly, when I was driving so much all over the country, I would see the same child all over the place. The most striking-looking was a very thin male with blond hair, and I would call it the ‘Jason model’. I had names like the Cylons. I would see in the early 2000's, between the ages of 8 to 15, the same father of thousands of children spread all over the country. It was the same genetics; it was the same model. It really did look like the same father or the same mother.

Farrell: I can believe that. I traveled around for a period of my life quite often, too, and noticed similar things. I would run into people in disparate parts of the country that looked like they were all from the same stock. So, we could be looking at something like that.

Interestingly enough, Dr. Jacobs – with his hybridization idea – looked at what we are experimenting with now with this whole COVID-19 vaccine with nanoparticles, heavy metals, human DNA, and all that. It appears that we are looking at some sort of hidden genetic engineering project that may not be within the purview of the so-called elite. They may just be the front men and spokesmen for something they themselves don't know the full depth. I don't know.

Fitts: They may not be in control.

Food & Health:

Story #17: SARS CoV-2 – Does It Exist? Is It a Virus or Pathogen? Was It Engineered?

Farrell: If you look at the virus itself and the peculiar way it behaves, there is no doubt that there is an engineering aspect to this just because Charles Lieber was involved with this.

Fitts: That was my question: Was Wuhan a prototype of their brain-machine interface that went bad?

Farrell: I'm increasingly thinking that because the thing that really got me early on was when I was looking at the clusters of the outbreaks of this virus. It was all clustered along the 40th parallel north.

Fitts: You and Richard Hoagland talked about that.

Farrell: Yes, it was all clustered along that line. Why there? It was also clustered around 5G networks.

Fitts: Well, that was where the spaceship was spraying!

Farrell: Who knows? That's my point: Who knows! But the outbreaks of the clusters were very odd. In many cases, the clusters – with the exception of Iran – were in places where they had already brought out 5G. So that's what made me think of what you just asked. Are we looking at a bioengineered device that was supposed to be an electronic engineered thing that went wrong? I don't know, but I think you have to hold yourself open to that case simply because Dr. Charles Lieber, head of Harvard's chemistry department, was arrested within a week or two of this story going viral, so to speak. What is his specialty?: Nanotechnology and human-brain interface and bioelectronics.

So why is he being arrested? Supposedly it was for not disclosing his financial ties to Wuhan.

Fitts: But Fauci was financing him.

Farrell: Exactly! This is the other part of the story. How do you square Fauci in this whole network all of a sudden, and then turn around – like Trump – and sponsor these people in press conferences and blaming China for it? In fact, the people who were involved apparently at Wuhan who had the most to deal with it were not the Chinese but these two Americans, both with connections to Gates.

Fitts: China went into lockdown in November;, everybody is too busy selling their stock; Congress is briefed on it. Instead of protecting the American people, Nancy Pelosi's husband buys \$5 million of Amazon stock, which they've made a fortune on.

The insider trading was unbelievable.

Farrell: It was unbelievable with this. It was not only Nancy Pelosi as I recall; it was also Diane Feinstein, Senator Inhofe from Oklahoma, Senator Graham, and all sorts of people who were doing this.

Fitts: Unbelievable.

Farrell: Truly!

Fitts: I said this the first week, and I still think this: Whatever is going on, they have the ability to turn it on and off. If you need 100 COVID-19 cases in an area, they have multiple ways of getting them.

A nurse recently gave an interview in California. They have been flying by helicopter COVID-19 positive patients from Mexico to Riverside County, and they're not flying them back. They are Spanish-speaking; they don't speak English.

Farrell: That isn't good.

Fitts: This is how New York started; they moved COVID-19 patients into nursing homes.

One of my questions is: Is the spraying or other mechanisms getting things in our body, or the vaccines? We know that people who have taken the flu shot have a higher incidence of getting seriously ill or dying.

Are they getting something into our body – whether it's spraying or the vaccines – that they can then turn on with invisible cellular technology?

Farrell: Oh, I think so. I've suspected that from the beginning. It was Lieber's presence in the middle of all this that made me start thinking of a virus that you can literally activate by turning on a field in a particular region.

Fitts: They keep talking about bioelectronics. "I'm an expert in bioelectronics." What is bioelectronics? It's the integration of biology with electronics.

Farrell: I go back to the Soviet-era research that was at the time, a highly classified black project in the Soviet Union where they were experimenting with precisely this being able to activate or turn off diseases simply by configuring in an electromagnetic field and then modulating the electromagnetic signature of a particular disease into that field. That's very simple.

Fitts: If Rife could heal cancer with frequencies, why couldn't you also give somebody cancer with frequencies?

Farrell: That is precisely what I'm saying. That is exactly what the Soviet research was trying to figure out, and they were doing experiments with tissue cultures of diseases.

One of the experiments was a quartz separator between a disease culture and a Petri dish of healthy tissue on the other side of the quartz barrier. Eventually, the healthy tissue would get the disease.

In other words, they were thinking, "There is an electromagnetic template for this," and they did plenty of research into the templates of many different diseases and learned how to modulate that information into an electromagnetic signal.

Is it possible to do this remotely? Yes. How would you increase the efficiency of the signal? You would turn everybody into an antenna by injecting them with heavy metals, by injecting them with nanoparticles, so you have increased efficiency in signal reception. Voilà!, there you are!

I think there is an aspect to this virus story that they are not telling anyone.

Fitts: One of the interesting things – after Gates got on *Reddit* with his selling all of the creepy technology – is I thought, “Oh my God! They are coming out of the closet on what they want to do!”

The longest time I’ve ever taken to write a *Wrap Up* is *The State of the Currency*. I was struggling with it because the gap between what I thought was going to happen and what the average person’s understanding is, getting people from where they are to where these people wanted them to go was very hard to explain until Gates did that.

I thought, “Great! Now *Windows/1984* is conceivable for most people.”

Farrell: That is exactly what they want to do. I hate to put it to Mr. Gates, but I think he may have jumped the gun a bit by revealing that.

Fitts: Do you know why? One of the things that I have discovered is that Microsoft software is universally despised. It’s universally despised because people know that they were played a game with the virus. It was constantly dirty and messy. So when you tell them, “Okay, he did it to your computer, and now he is going to do it to your body,” Bam! They can see it and they get it.

Farrell: It’s the Microsoft model of vaccinations. You take that vaccine, and you are forever subject to their updates – which could be entirely downloadable through their tracking/tracing tattoos. It’s the Microsoft model of serfdom.

Fitts: It’s amusing because all you have to do is plug into their hatred of the Microsoft operating system, and they can understand.

Farrell: It is already happening. I see all of these posters and pictures of Gates online, and they point this out: This is the man who invented the world's first operating system, and now he wants to tell you how he is going to treat viruses.

Fitts: Exactly.

One of the interesting things here was that from the time they started to lock down, any time you tried to ask them how many people were going to die as a result of destroying Main Street and the Main Street economy, and bankrupting state and local governments, and putting 200 million people globally into food insecurity, and on and on and on –whether through unemployment or destruction of small business – how many people that was going to kill? There was no answer in the body politics at the city council level or at the state level to respond mathematically, or do a comparison of, “Here is how many people could die from COVID-19, and here is how many people could die from COVID-19 restrictions.”

Farrell: There was no computer-generated model even at the Federal level.

Fitts: So, every person that I know who wrote or tried to talk to their city council or their local government officials about, “You want to prevent COVID-19 deaths, but how many deaths are your restrictions going to cause?” They seemed incapable of answering that.

Farrell: In most cases, they were not incapable of answering, but they were incapable of even understanding the point that these people were trying to make. In other words, it wasn't even on their radar because they were so busy buying the narrative.

Where I live, the local city and county governments are oblivious to that as an issue period. They have so bought into the narrative. In other words, we are dealing once again with fundamentally stupid people who are playing with everybody's future, and they haven't even thought of that question.

Fitts: But they are going to bankrupt themselves; State and local governments are going to bankrupt themselves.

Farrell: That may be one of the objectives.

Fitts: Oh, I think it is one of the objectives, but I can't understand why a city council would go along with bankrupting themselves.

Farrell: I can't either. None of it makes any sense to me. The only thing that I can think of is that there is already such a degree of social engineering, perhaps in conjunction with the use of outright hard mind manipulation technologies, with these people.

Fitts: I think there are so many control files. I think that with online pornography, all I have to do is get you addicted to online pornography, and then bring in child pornography, and I have a control file on you- I've got you.

Farrell: That could be, too.

Fitts: You don't even need to realize it's happening. It can be an entrapment.

There has been a whole series of examples of hypocrisy that are beyond measure. For example, the mayor of Chicago. I don't know if you saw her poster, but I have to show you the poster for the mayor of Chicago. She is a 'piece of work'.

Farrell: I don't spend any time watching her, but I have several members on my website who live in Chicago. I get horror reports and updates from them on her. You know one of them, and I have a few others who are filling me in.

Fitts: It's horrible! I don't know if you listened to a Chicago alderman. He had an online conference call with the mayor during the riots, and he was trying to get her to ask Trump to send in some kind of capacity to help them.

The mayor gave a press conference where she was screaming at everybody because they weren't obeying the social distancing. Hairdressers were considered nonessential. All the hairdressers were shut down, so nobody could go to their hairdresser. Well, she got caught by the press going to the hairdresser. She gave a press conference saying, "Well, I'm the mayor. I have to appear on TV, so I'm an exception."

Farrell: Oh, I see! That's how it works.

Fitts: Let me guide you through some of our posters. The first poster is on the **missing money**. We have something called the 'COVID Lexicon', and it's where we define COVID-19 terms.

Herd immunity: The mysterious phenomena that occurs when people get together in droves to protest racism.

Contact tracing: Track and trace system designed to justify kidnapping of children based on unreliable tests of invisible viruses.

The next one is based on the mayor of Chicago.

V-shaped Recovery: What you need when there are no other customers in the hair salon to help you out when a hair dryer malfunctions.

Farrell: That's classic! She's a conehead!

Fitts: Isn't that funny! Keep scrolling down. I want to show you something else.

Farrell: I'm picturing a Saturday Night Live skit with the coneheads!

New normal: The cultural situation in which citizens spy on each other to make sure everybody adheres to counterproductive rules that are based on flawed science.

Social distancing: The process in which the supposed leadership acts so absurdly that the taxpayers lose faith in their ability to make adult decisions.

"Since the start of the COVID-19 'plandemic'. 50 million Americans have lost their jobs, and American billionaires gained \$280 billion. How are we in this together, Steve?"

Fitts: That was because they kept trying to push that, “We’re all in this together.”

Farrell: That poster with **Fauci** and the **quotation of Judy Mikovits** is one that everybody has to read.

These are all good, and there are many of them, too.

Fitts: We do one a week.

Farrell: You have to put that link to these posters in your printed version of this.

Fitts: You have to go to December 16, 2019. It’s called ‘Dear CNN President.’

Farrell: “Dear CNN President, culture wars make your stock go up. We are missing \$21 trillion. Is it buying your stock instead of building great schools?”

Yes. Absolutely.

Fitts: The next one is **Antifa**.

Farrell: “Dear Antifa, why do you take money from Soros to protest inequality that can be solved by getting the \$21 trillion back? Be useful.”

Fitts: We do one a week, and we have fun.

Farrell: That is the sort of thing that needs to be done. I only wish that your posters and comments like that would spread far and wide like wildfire.

Fitts: They are posted publicly, and I put it on Twitter every week. People are free to send it virally.

The thing that was most popular this quarter was the injection fraud. It was very interesting. I don’t know if you read it, but one of the reasons I think it was is that I talked about family finances and what the cost of vaccine death and injury

was in terms of dollars and cents to a family. I think that really caught on and resonated in how people see the issue in a broader sense.

It was inspired by a fight I had with a grandparent. They said, “Look, this is my daughter’s decision, and I don’t want to interfere, and I can’t.”

I said, “You are very wrong. The present value cost of a heavily autistic child is \$5 million. Your daughter doesn’t have \$5 million; you do. So, it is your business. If you end up with a heavily autistic grandchild, you are going to pay. It’s your business because your daughter doesn’t have the \$5 million. She is going to ask you for the \$5 million when she needs it, and you are going to give it to her. So you are the banker, and you get to have a say.”

The hypocrisy was unbelievable. One was the Chicago Mayor. Pritzker’s wife went on vacation. Trudeau said that everybody had to stay home for the holidays, but then he went on vacation. But my favorite was the ‘nimnut’, Niall Ferguson from the Imperial College, who said that millions of us were going to die. He has his married mistress going over to his house for sex who then returns home to her husband and two children. And he tested positive to COVID-19.

So, the hypocrisies were many, and it’s another reason I keep wondering why people take this seriously.

Farrell: How can they take it seriously?

Fitts: I’ll tell you one reason: Because people are sick. People are sick, and the question is where people are sick and why people are sick?

Farrell: My problem with this whole vaccine push is the way they have been trying to demonize hydroxychloroquine. You don’t need a vaccine when there is a commonly available drug. I did this blog about the President of El Salvador who came out and said that he was instructed, as were many world leaders, to take hydroxychloroquine as a prophylactic.

So if we have a common, easily available drug that works – both to cure and prevent – we don’t need a vaccine.

Fitts: Right, and they have done everything to destroy its validity. They've done bogus tests to prove that hydroxychloroquine wasn't safe, and it turned out that was bogus. They had to retract their statement on that.

My understanding is that hydroxychloroquine has been used for many, many decades, including for malaria. I had one of my subscribers write in and say, "I was a merchant marine. We used to always take it just to make sure that we didn't get malaria. It was quite safe."

It was available over the counter in France before this all started, and very, very inexpensive. I don't know if you saw the videos of the Dallas doctor. They will be in the '*Resources*' section. Everybody was getting well very quickly, and she got to the point where CVS and Walgreens refused to fill her prescriptions.

Farrell: They don't want the cure out there because it makes the whole Baal Gates vaccine push the monstrosity that it is. It's an 'unneeded' cure or preventative.

Fitts: That's because the injections aren't going to be medicine; they have nothing to do with medicine. That is the proof.

Farrell: The other part of the story may be something else that people are forgetting: Who invented hydroxychloroquine?

Fitts: It's been around forever

Farrell: It has been around forever, but it was invented by Bayer.

Fitts: But it's no longer copyrighted.

Farrell: I don't think it is. It was invented in 1934, so it wouldn't be copyrighted any longer. But let's also remember something else: The Canadian pharmacy producer who was killed, – he and his wife made it.

Fitts: There are all sorts of strange connections like that. For example, Wuhan is the primary source for synthetic adrenochrome.

Farrell: I wonder how they get that, too. The whole narrative has so many flaws and so many bad connections, it boggles the mind. Why anybody would believe this narrative, I don't know.

Fitts: I know people who are in fear because there is a lot of sicknesses. I think that the sickness comes from the spraying and the vaccines and the 5G and a variety of other things. There may be a bad flu going around, too, but I think that when you have sickness around you, you have to ask why?

Farrell: To clarify, we are not saying that the virus isn't real and that it doesn't make people sick. We are not saying that. We are saying that there could be a variety of other causes that are being ascribed to the virus, and we see that in the way that they have doctored the statistics.

I had somebody post on my Facebook wall, a cartoon of a person who perished from falling from an airplane without a parachute. He died, and statistically, he is entered as someone who died from the coronavirus. This is what we are seeing happen. They have deliberately ballooned the statistics.

The other thing that they are doing right now in the American 'propatainment' media is reporting a surge of cases. They are not talking about actual deaths; they are reporting the surge of cases.

As far as I can tell, statistically, the amount of deaths to cases remains the same.

Fitts: The other thing is that if you have a 50-80% false positives test and you are doing greater testing, it's meaningless.

Farrell: The whole narrative is full of holes; it is absolutely chock full of holes; it's like Swiss cheese. It makes no sense other than being a 'plandemic' to manipulate for other goals.

Fitts: I did an interview with Richard Dolan on the impact of the Pentagon's announcement of the sovereign bond market and US Treasury credit. At one point, COVID-19 came up. He said, "I don't believe that this is necessarily a plandemic."

I started to laugh. I said, “Richard, I know nothing about health science, but I know about money, and this is the single-most miraculous save of the US dollar I’ve seen yet.”

I didn’t have confirmation that they would approve the Going Direct plan at Jackson Hole. When Pam and Russ Martens came out with that and a series of other articles around it, that put all the puzzle pieces together. Considering what they did and what the private equity people did and what the Fed did and what the World Economic Forum did, and you look at the timeline, all the pieces fit together.

So, it’s impossible that this is not a global reset. It has nothing to do with the virus. It’s not to say that viruses aren’t bouncing around and there’s not a game going on about that and people haven’t gotten sick and haven’t died. I think hypoxia is a real problem, and the question is: Why?

I started to laugh, and said, “Richard, it’s impossible that this is a health situation. It’s impossible”. And yet Richard is an unbelievably smart man, but he didn’t see it. I think it’s because he is not watching the financial patterns.

If you are not watching the financial patterns, it’s hard to conceptualize what total ‘BS’ it is.

Farrell: I think it’s hard for most people to see because they are not looking at the sequence of events. In other words, it becomes clear that it is part of a plan when you look at the timing of it and when you look at what has followed it. People have to start to connect dots in that way.

Fitts: Talk about moving a large amount of money back to this country! Part of it is to understand the relationship between what is happening with COVID-19 and what is happening with the riots. The wealth transfer and the asset grab are off the charts.

One other thing I want to mention about this was that I read Forest Maredy’s books and reviewed them. I had it on my list to read Judy Mikovits’ new book. I read her first one and reviewed it, but I had it on my list to read her second book and write a review about it. Then she went on the *London Real* program.

She gave an interview where she got frustrated with the interviewer, and ,
“Look, vaccines are biowarfare.”

I thought, “That is quite a succinct description. I like that.”

I watched another interview where she was talking about the retroviruses that got into everybody as a result of vaccines, and she said, “When they do the COVID-19 vaccine, it is going to interact with the retroviruses and kill 50 million people.” She thinks that is how they are going to get rid of the liability of all those retroviruses – to just clean those people out.

I thought, “Wow! Judy Mikovits is totally down on vaccines.”

Then she got on *London Real* and they said, “Are you opposed to vaccines?” and she said, “No. I’m an immunologist, so I believe in immune therapy.”

Then I thought, “Oh my God! Doesn’t she understand how that can be edited to be used?” It was rather frightening.

After that, I was approached by a very establishment-type who said, “Here is how we solve the vaccine mandate thing. We will put together a global committee of the best and brightest that you can trust. We will have Judy Mikovits and Robert Kennedy.” I wrote back, “No ‘effin’ way! We need health freedom. Every parent and every person needs to decide for themselves. I don’t want to hear about ‘global experts’. We have enough global experts for a lifetime.”

So, it took me a long time to write the review because I was very concerned about how you have all these great people who have been fighting vaccines, and they started saying, “We are not anti-vaccine; we are just anti-this or anti-that.”

As they’ve gone through the process, more and more have come out, and more and more has come out. The time has come, based on what has come out, to say, “Enough of this. It all stops. No mandates for anything.”

If a pharmaceutical company wants to give an injection, it should be useful enough for somebody to want it. If they mess up and kill them, they should be

liable. So take away the mandates, take away the employment pressure, and take away the liability protection. Get rid of all this ‘crap’.

What do we need to do to help people say, “I’m not going to keep trying to be socially acceptable by saying, ‘It’s not a ‘plandemic’,’ or, ‘I’m not against vaccines’”?

There has been an effort to get along with the official narrative, and it’s time to let go of the official narrative and say, “It’s a lie.”

Farrell: It’s a good question, but I think that we have to start coupling issues together. In other words, right now, I think that the mood in the country is nearly everybody is looking at the culture and government institutions as being thoroughly dysfunctional. If we can somehow find a way to couple this COVID-19 narrative – and for that matter all global narratives – together, people will wake up and see that the problem is this constant push for top-down one-solution-fits-all narrative in virtually every sphere that we have been confronted with.

Once we are able to find a way to do that, it will wake people up. Some are waking up already. But we have to find a way to couple all these things together for it to make sense to people.

It makes sense to the anti-vax crowd already for obvious reasons, but once we couple things together, then we have to get people to understand that sitting by and thinking you are ‘doing something’ by simply informing yourself is no longer enough. There has to be pushback. I don’t care how the pushback comes – whether it’s blogging disputes of the narrative or going down and ‘raising Cain’ with the city council or whatever it is that you want to do or are in a position to do. That is what has to be foremost in people’s minds. We have to do something, so let’s figure out, “What can I do in my place?”

Fitts: Exactly, and this takes us to **Story #18:**

Story #18: Radical Reengineering of Global Agriculture and Food.

There was a company that was approved for one of the most innovative at Davos 2020 (World Economic Forum), and they have three products – no milk, no mayonnaise, and one other; they are plant-based milk and plant-based mayonnaise.

Farrell: It's more goop, in other words.

Fitts: So we have fake mother's milk now.

Farrell: And fake meat and let's not forget the mystery burgers. We have GMO grains and fake everything. That is fundamentally what we are talking about.

Fitts: I read an article by a farmer in Michigan talking about how the insects on his farm were 20% of what they used to be. Essentially, the insects are going away. Sometimes I wonder if they're leaving because they don't want to be here.

Farrell: I have to wonder if they are actually going away, or if they are smart enough to know not to eat the GMO crops. Let the 'two legs' do that.

Part of that is the GMOs have absolutely gutted the pollinator populations. We're not just talking about honeybees; we are talking about any pollinators, including hummingbirds and butterflies. They have really done a number on the environment. These people have to be held accountable.

Fitts: Arthur Firstenberg said during the 5G Summit, he believes that once they turn on the Starlink satellite system and the other 5G this fall around October or November, life on this Earth will end.

Farrell: It may. I personally don't think so, but by the 'same token', I don't think there is anything that I've seen in any of the literature where an honest independent scientific study has been done on 5G where it ends up with anything good.

There were rollout tests in the Netherlands, and bird populations started falling out of the sky. There is a video of the pigeons attacking a 5G tower in Great Britain – more power to the pigeons!

I don't see anything good coming from it. My big problem is not with 5G per se; my big problem is what happens when you get all of those towers creating an interferometry grid of all those beams mixing together. There is no way you can tell me they have done any studies of what patterns are going to result from that and what the environmental or human health impacts will be.

So, yes, I think that if the tests are any indicator, it will be bad – just pure and simple, bad.

Fitts: One expert told me off the record, “The only way you can stop this is after the first or second wave of people get killed and die. It's just going to roll out.”

If you read *The Invisible Rainbow*, this is what you saw throughout history. The Spanish influenza is an example. You get a rollout, and 5G is invisible, so we don't see it; it's will have to roll out.

Farrell: I lost a sister to a malignant glioblastoma in the year 2000. She had contracted it in an area of her brain where she always held her portable phone. My prediction is that they do the 5G rollout, and I suspect you are going to see a dramatic increase in glioblastomas and those related cancers because of that. If that is the case, then people will have to wake up and demand they tear them down, or just tear them down. I'm to the stage that we have talked and talked and talked with these people, and they simply don't listen. I think there is a great possibility that you are going to see an increase in certain types of cancers.

Skin cancers is another one because of the 5G, but that is a prediction that may or may not occur. If it does occur, if you see a spike in certain types of cancers after a 5G rollout, it's time to rethink the whole thing.

Fitts: It's a mess.

One of the movies we had this quarter was Insight's *Slaughtered on Suspicion*. It was about the Imperial College model that was used to destroy a huge number of livestock in England, anticipating that this animal disease would kill millions of people – which it never did. By watching that documentary, you see the nasti-

ness of this Imperial College model game and the epidemiologists' game. It is very interesting.

One of the things that we have done over the last couple of years is told everybody, "For God's sake, go out and support your local farmer. Do whatever you can to build a local fresh food system."

The *Solari Report* subscribers have done a great job of doing that. One of the things I have really encouraged people to do is to persuade their Congressional representatives to support Congressman Massie's bill, the PRIME Act. Now that he has won his primary, that push will be on. That bill is to help build local meat systems. I don't know about you, but I'm not interested in having a Beyond Burger.

Farrell: I will not buy meat from any national chain.

Fitts: I'm with you. I have no idea what is in it, and I don't even want to know.

If you go to the 'Take Action' crowdfund at the home page, you can link to it. One of the groups we strongly recommend you join and support is the Farm-to-Consumer Legal Defense Fund. One of the founding attorneys, Pete Kennedy, is now leading our *Food Series*, and he has done some great interviews. He is about to interview Congressman Massie, so that is coming.

Do whatever you can do in your place, but find your farmer and find your rancher because you want to know where your food is coming from.

Story #19: The Great Poisoning – The Injection Fraud and Vaxxed Wars.

We've talked about this throughout **Part I** and **Part II**. I think the practical issue for most everybody is: How do I say no to the injection fraud? We are going to have many of these resources, not only in the *News Trends & Stories* presentation, but also in the *COVID Best Resources*.

Literally, I'm getting emails from people saying, "My university or my job is requiring me to get the flu shot and the COVID-19 vaccination, and I don't want to do it, but they are mandating it. What do I do?"

Farrell: I honestly don't know, other than for them to bring a suit against them.

Fitts: I think that's what I would do.

Farrell: Find a lawyer that will take the case, and bring a suit against all these places.

Fitts: Even if you can't find a lawyer that will bring the suit up, find a lawyer who will teach you how to bring a lawsuit against them.

The worst, ugliest attack I've seen on a lawyer in the United States so far in the last two years is Alan Phillips, the attorney who taught everybody how to stop the vaccination. It is going to be easier for attorneys to teach you how to do it yourself.

Farrell: It's getting to the stage where we need to start trying to promote the idea of lawyers associations that will 'go to bat' for people, and even bring class action suits against all these institutions nationwide.

Fitts: Children's Health Defense is doing it. They are working on a new one that I can't wait to see. That is why you need to sign up and become a member.

Farrell: That would be the thing to do: Have people sign up for that organization and persuade it to expand its purview.

Fitts: Here is the thing: I'm sure they can expand. The more gas we put in the tank, the further their car can drive. They are on board to do it.

I want to talk about taxes now because if you are paying in your property taxes for a school system, but your children can't go because they're not vaccinated, I would say that is taxation without representation.

Farrell: I would, too.

Fitts: The reality is, if you look at Fauci, we are paying him. If you look at the Operation Warp Speed nonsense, we are paying for it. If you look at the Wuhan laboratory grant, we are paying for it. This is our money.

Farrell: In addition to that, I would urge people to start to make state nullification an issue of discussion because we are fast approaching that crossroads again. If the blue states can be talking again about secession and state nullification and thumb their nose at the Federal government, as is happening right now in certain places in this country, then it's high time for some red pushback. That needs to start with reintroducing the idea of state nullification and everything that goes with it.

We have to remember something very important: The Civil War did not decide the legality of secession simply because when some of those northern states ratified the current Constitution, they put in the provision of the ratification that they retained the right to secede. We have to get that back on the table. We have to get used to the idea that we may be witnessing the country's crack-up, and we had better be prepared. That means we have to prepare at a state and local level.

As far as I'm concerned, it's fast 'rolling down the pike'. Yes, that means that we will have to be willing to be targets because we are toying with those ideas, but there is no other way to address them within the system.

Fitts: I think the billionaires want it to happen.

Farrell: I do to – to a certain extent.

Fitts: That is how they will get corporate control of municipalities.

Farrell: Right, and I think the municipalities that they want to get control of are very clear from what is going on right now. I think they want to gain control of those blue areas, and to 'heck' with the rest of us. As far as I'm concerned, you can have your socialist workers' paradise; go for it.

Fitts: Next story:

Story #20: Geophysical Risks.

Volcanoes are one. There are so many geophysical risks, and they are so mysterious. You had time reversals and parallel universes. I thought that was rather interesting.

Farrell: **Antarctica.** The way I'm looking at all of what is happening right now with the floods in China and the increase of seismic activity, I go back to something that we said earlier, and I mean this very sincerely. The materialists out there are going to think I'm 'wacky', but I think there is going to be pushback to much of this coming from good old Mother Nature.

Fitts: Here is my question: Is the mind control that makes people incoherent causing the living field to be incoherent?

Farrell: I think that was precisely what I was about to say. When you start messing up the field of intentionality, it will have massive ripple effects. Think of Dr. Tiller and his work. When you start messing up the group intentionality and introducing this much incoherence into it, the effect will spill over into the rest of the system.

Human beings are not closed systems. Anything that we do will spill over and have an effect on the natural creation. Don't be surprised if the natural creation is not going to want to go along with it. It's just that simple.

Fitts: Here is what is interesting that you just said: One of the greatest assumptions that we are all making – and it probably is not true – is that Earth is a closed system. But we have the same problem with humans.

How did we get talked into an anti-life model where a human is a machine, they are not alive, they are not connected, and the Earth is closed? Everything is in a box.

Farrell: It began with subtle changes in the language that no one fought. When they started making the change, I was a voice 'crying in the wilderness' at

the time. I was still teaching college when you saw corporations rebill their Department of Personnel to Department of Human Resources.

When I interviewed for the first casino job I had, I told the interviewer, “I’m not a resource; I’m a person. I’m not a resource for you to mine.”

“Oh, yeah. It’s just words.”

No, it’s not just words. This is why I keep saying that these people play with language, and that is how they begin to inculcate where they want to go through manipulations of language. This has been going on for a very long time. That is why I urge people, “Don’t play along with linguistic agendas. You may not understand the agenda, but just don’t accept it. Period. Use traditional English diction.” That will stop it cold.

Fitts: ‘Fascism’ is such an unattractive word, but The Green New Deal has a lilt to it.

Farrell: “Yes, it’s pretty.” Even there, I mentioned this in the vidchat recently. In the early period of the Nazi regime in Germany, there was a group of Wandervogel—a group of Wandering Birds. It was these young, German teenage boys who would dress in traditional German costumes, and they would go around the country. They were early hippies dressed in traditional German costumery. They were greens; they were very concerned about the environment.

The Nazis pandered to them ‘big time’. You can see pictures of Hitler at Berchtesgaden shaking the hands of some of these people who had come to visit.

The Green New Deal is nothing but fascism. That is all it is, but it has a clever name.

Fitts: Here is the thing: If you do a riot, and then buy tracts of real estate cheap in an Opportunity Zone, The New Green Deal allows you to go in and do whatever you want and steamroll everything. It’s frightening. It’s like, “There are no laws. Do whatever you want.”

Are you ready for **Unanswered Questions?**

Farrell: I'm ready.

Fitts: **Unanswered Questions, Take Action, & Inspiration.**

Many of these we have talked at length about, so we can do some of them rather quickly.

Question #1: How important are invisible and secret weaponry and technology to the replacement of global currency systems with Crypto control systems?

Farrell: I think they are massively important. In fact, I don't think that you can have the cryptosystems without the first one. I really don't see it working.

Fitts: Invisible weaponry will control the cryptosystem.

Farrell: Let's go even further: To bring in the type of cryptosystem that these people want to bring in on a global basis requires a massive amount of computing power, which in standard computing architecture, I don't see it exists.

In other words, I think they already have some wholly different system that may be functioning on first generation quantum computing or biocomputers or whatever. I say 'bio' because there are interesting things in computer science where they've gone in and used biological components for the computing system.

Fitts: If you look the Microsoft bioactivity patent, you almost wonder if they have to use our bodies as servers to get this system to go.

Farrell: That is precisely where I am going with this.

Given everything that we have talked about with the vaccine, the bioengineering component of it, and the electromagnetic component of it, I don't see that you can have the kind of cryptosystem they want to bring in on the global scale without a paradigm shift in computing technology.

Fitts: If you look at what it costs to build out the entire ‘smart grid’; remember they are envisioning energy that can be delivered wireless from this orbital platform that will radically reduce the energy price. To build out all the hardware and software is trillions and trillions of dollars. So what are the advantages of the financial coup? You won’t realize the profits from that infrastructure until you build out the whole thing.

Financially, it is mind-boggling to do, and that may be one of the reasons they stole the \$50 trillion.

Farrell: Maybe, but there is another aspect of this that people are forgetting. Back in the 1960’s, there were studies by the US Air Force about using space-based microwave power systems, and beaming power down to Earth for humanity. As part of that system, the Air Force concluded – and I want everyone to ‘latch’ onto this very carefully in respect to what we’ve been discussing about the real estate and the buyout of real estate- that the collectors on Earth for this microwave energy would be in zones that were so hot that all life within about 140 miles would be impossible.

Fitts: Really?

Farrell: I talked about this system in one of my books and the microwave power from space idea. So, put that in the context of what is happening with buyout of cheap real estate. They will have to place these plants on the surface of the Earth, and there will be no life in certain regions of the world. The people going in to maintain and run those facilities will have to have some extraordinary protections.

Fitts: Why not just use robots?

Farrell: Precisely. You would have to have robots that are well-shielded from all of this heat. That could be a reason they are going into cities and trying to clear them out, or that could be a reason they are trying to get everybody packed into cities.

These people are functionally insane in their goals; they are functionally insane.

Fitts: They have very long-term goals, and putting this grid in place changes all the fundamental economic opportunities for them.

Technologically they are living 100 years ahead of us. They envision a world where they will live for 145 years, and we are not, and we are a different species.

Farrell: Which may be the case.

Fitts: I think for the tech billionaires, I don't believe it's the case. I think they have lost their minds, and they're just lost.

Farrell: They are lost, and they have lost their minds. Father Malachi called them the 'perfectly possessed'. They're not far from it.

Fitts: Question #2: Where did the \$50 trillion dollars go?

We don't know, but the magic virus will extinguish all the legal liabilities. That is what we do know.

Question #3: Why is there a great poisoning underway? Why is there an ongoing global program to increase the levels of aluminum, other heavy metals, and nanoparticles or nanotechnology in humans? Is the push for Neuralink because humans will be more intelligent accessing AI, easier to control and integrate with robots, or because the elites want and need access to uniquely human intelligence and consciousness?

Farrell: At one level, what I think is what we said before. When you inject heavy metals in this kind of nano-bioengineered technology into human beings, I think you are increasing the efficiency of their receiving antennae for whatever else they have planned. That is one thing.

I do think that the best question here is the last one: Do they need access to uniquely human intelligence and consciousness? To be blunt, I think there is an aspect of this that goes all the way back to the fall of Lucifer.

The Islamic tradition has the creation of Adam actually making Lucifer jealous – or Iblis, as he is called in the Quran – which I think is a very interesting possibility. C.S. Lewis even entertains that idea in some of his books.

I think there is an aspect of this that makes humanity and its unique consciousness the battleground because every form of AI or super-computer-generated scenarios of analysis of the situation is based on a kind of intelligence that is mere ratiocination, and human intelligence is not that. Human intelligence is inclusive of things like intuition, passions, emotions, and so on. We are not – strictly speaking – walking syllogisms. That is not the way our intelligence functions.

Fitts: We are not processors.

Farrell: We are not processors. There is much more involved in human intelligence, and part of that involves our emotional life. I do think there is an aspect of this that somebody or something is trying to figure out how to tap into and use because it's lacking in some sort of fundamental insight that we have by dint of being human. I think that is a profound question.

Fitts: Is it to stop us from thinking hyperdimensionally?

Farrell: I think that is part of it.

Fitts: It's to stop our nonlocal intelligence.

Farrell: Years ago, and even at the Secret Space Program, Lynda Moulton Howe made a very interesting observation. I don't know if you remember it. She said that one of the reasons the ET's were interested in us was that their ability to manipulate minds or emotions was very strong, but it only worked at a very short distance. In other words, you had to be in very close physical proximity for it to work. The she pointed out that in the remote viewing program that was run in this country, they discovered humans have a nonlocal ability that can reach out lightyears. Whether you take that as true or not, I thought it was an interesting observation.

In other words, we are so nonlocal when it comes right down to it that we are truly extraordinarily hyperdimensional beings. In proof of that, I blogged a few months ago about some neuroscientific study of the physiology of the human brain. They concluded that describing the function of the human brain mathematically would require eleven spatial dimensions – eleven!

That means that this grey matter we have packed inside our skulls is not simply a three-dimensional thing. There is something outside of what is in our skull that is part of what makes us human.

I do think that the second half of question #3 is absolutely a possibility; it is absolutely in play.

Fitts: I've always believed that the brain-machine interface was to get us to resonate with the machines and not with each other or all life because when we resonate with all life, our reach and our intelligence is incredible.

One of the things I've noticed is that if you're in alignment with divine intelligence, there is plenty of knowledge that comes to you. It won't if you are out of alignment. That is why I think they 'chop up' the knowledge that they want and send young people off to research only that part. They think they are figuring out how to help people of Alzheimer's, and don't understand they are figuring out how to help people be mind-controlled. But they send them in there with the belief that they are doing good research so they can stay in alignment with the divine and get the knowledge.

Farrell: The fragmentations of the disciplines is part of a very long-term agenda.

Fitts: Absolutely.

Question #4: High-tech risks: Should we beware of high-tech fires, the push for immortality, DNA editing, 5G mind control and assassinations, and the interbreeding of humans with other species? What else?

I would say it looks like we've given a caveman a laser gun, and the whole thing is completely out of control.

Farrell: I agree. I think you have to be particularly aware and very, very cautious about any offer of virtual immortality or extended lifespan because all versions of that – as far as I can tell – are cutting out that emotional aspect of human life in order to plug you into a system. It's a possibility where we are being confronted (and I'm going to be very blunt) where you can have eternal life the good old-fashioned way through grace, or you can have a facsimile thereof through technology that is going to put you into an eternal hell. That is the way I view it.

Fitts: I couldn't agree more.

Question #5 is a series of questions: Will the U.S. or Israel go to war in Iran? Will India start a war with Pakistan? When will China invade Taiwan? Has the US invaded Venezuela? Will the US and China go to war or separate the Internet and financial markets? Are China and the US pitted in a win-lose position in the orbital platform and space race? What about Russia? How far might other countries' conquests go once it becomes clear the U.S. will no longer play global cop?

I have to tell you that I think we are in the middle of World War III. This is what World War III looks like. The question is: Can it get physically hotter? The answer is: Probably.

I think World War III is the centralizers against each individual person on the planet.

Farrell: I agree. You've opened up so much there I'm having difficulty finding where on the 'merry-go-round' to get on.

I think, number one, that we are already in a World War III. I think, number two, that we are already in a real civil war in this country. It's already gone violent. We've had our Harpers Ferry moment with Mr. Floyd, and it's going to get worse.

I think that you are onto something with this idea of the centralizers versus each and every individual, and then by extension, each other and their local national

cultures. That means that it is going to be osmometrical; there is not going to be an identifiable frontline. There isn't going to be an eastern front, a western front, or an Iranian front. Those things could certainly emerge at some point, but right now, no.

I think it could get very hot very quickly, and I'm waiting with baited breath for Election Day in this country and the aftermath. I don't think that either side, regardless of who wins, will be satisfied with the results. They are already both putting out the meme that if Trump wins, it's because there has been massive election fraud, and Trump himself has already laid the groundwork for a dispute of election results by pointing out, "We've already caught them forging mail-in ballots."

It's going to get very, very dicey because there is no way to resolve this since the political discourse is broken down for all the reasons that we've talked about previously. It's a mess.

Fitts: It is a mess. It's interesting because if you look at all the reasons the United States is having to eat its own bad karma, we've had 70 years of refusing to push the red button. Everybody participated in that decision; all 325 million people are directly or indirectly guilty. So that is our karma, and we are eating it while the subsidies are all getting pulled, so the game has to end. Mr. Global has hit the red button.

It's almost as though we've decided to pick out a couple of people or institutions and try to take all that bad karma and move it to them rather than face it.

Question #6: How will the U.S. government and central bank be reengineered after FASAB 56, the 2020 ops, elections, and after the JEDI contract is in place? Is the Plunge Protection Team being reengineered or privatized?

These questions go to the heart of what it means that we have the JEDI and the cloud contracts in place with the post FASAB 56. We watched all last year the planning that could occur leading to the Going Direct global reset because FASAB 56 and the clouds were in place. So, these were two things that were completely ignored in the corporate media that snapped into place and changed everything, but that change has just begun.

Now we have the Plunge Protection Team essentially privatized into BlackRock, which is big.

So you take FASAB 56, you take the privatizing of the Plunge Protection Team, you take the cloud contracts, and where in the world does this go?

Farrell: It goes to a hellish existence for those people adopting those plans. This is why I say to own the culture. What they are creating is inhuman, and because it's inhuman, it cannot and will not work. So there has to be something at the end of this whole process whenever and wherever and however it may happen. It probably won't happen in our lifetimes, but there has to be something at the end of this process that we can fall back on. That is the cultural foundation of this culture to begin with.

This is why I think it's very interesting to watch what Russia is doing. I've said before that they are the first post postmodern state. What are they doing? Yes, we acknowledge this whole Soviet thing as being part of our history, but it was a really bad part of it, and we don't want to go back to that. So, they are going way back to what they were. There are little signs of this happening nearly everywhere in Europe. It's happening in Germany. It's certainly happening in France after Notre Dame was – I think – deliberately burned.

You see people waking up and realizing that we are not going to have much of a civilization if we allow these people to burn it all down. So that is why I say that it's important to own the culture. Humanity is about more than just surviving; humanity; it is about what gives value to surviving.

This Mr. Global has not a clue either. They are presenting nothing of real human value to anyone to say that this is the way we should all go. They are only presenting things of monetary and financial value to people who are obsessed with being rich. But in the end, that's not what motivates most of us. We all like to have our money and our good times and so on, but for most of us, money is a means to that end; it's not the end itself. What these people are doing is apparently inhuman; it doesn't provide value to survival.

Fitts: I once listened to a great sermon where the preacher said, “Speak life into your situation.” So for the next 20 years, every day we are going to have to speak life into our situation and see where life grows.

Question #8: Who is Mr. Global, what is the governance structure on Planet Earth, and what are the risk issues that are driving Mr. Global’s actions?

From what I see, the elite appear as though they are scared to death.

Farrell: I totally agree with you. I said this on GeorgeAnn Hughes’ show back when we were watching the bailouts of 2008 happen. I told her then, and I stand by it now, that the way they were acting was like people who were panicked, desperate, in a hurry, and didn’t want to talk about why they were panicked, desperate, and in a hurry. With this COVID-19 thing, and all the so-called protesting going on in this country, it looks like they are panicked and desperate and in a hurry. Why? I don’t know. Part of it, I think, is because more and more people are waking up around the world – from China to India. Name a place that does not have some serious internal opposition to the way things are going.

I think they are afraid that they’ve awakened the Spartacus revolt, to draw the Roman parallel again, but the other part of me thinks they are panicked for some reason they are aware of that we are not. What that is, I have no idea.

Fitts: That’s could be a geophysical risk that has them pushing harder to move to a multi-planetary civilization. One of the questions is that there are some people who say that we are on Mars now, but whether underground or on Mars, are they building a whole new civilization? Is that why they want to grab all the children?

Farrell: That could be, but I don’t know. There is an aspect of this that it does seem like certain elites are trying ‘hell-bent for leather’ to get off this planet for whatever reason. It could be the geophysical rumblings; it could be anything. There is a factor that is in a black box that they are not talking about.

Fitts: If I were Mr. Global, my number one priority would be building a multi-planetary civilization because you never ‘bet the ranch’ on one. So that doesn’t bother me. But there is a sense of going at things from fear.

It's not worth building a multi-planetary civilization because we are inspired by what we can achieve together; it's fear and we can't let anybody know because that would really make it impossible.

Farrell: I get the same feeling.

Fitts: It's too bad because there is so much the general population could do to help, but you have a cycle of disrespect between the two groups, and I still don't understand why.

Farrell: The other problem is now, even if they wanted everybody's help, they have so 'cut their own throat' by their policies over the last few decades that no one trusts them. That is the other problem. If they were to reach out for help, who would believe them? That may be one reason that they are in a state of fear; they realize, "Oh, we blew it! We've lost the people. Now what do we do?"

I think of them in a certain way as the 'Globaloney' version of the way that China has boxed itself in during the last few months. It looks very much the same.

Fitts: I would argue that it's one thing if there is a global government and you're running it and can speak with one voice. It's another when you have all these competing interests, and nobody has enough control to talk with authority from a place of stability.

In this kind of chaos, it's impossible to have integrity. That is what they would say. That, I think, is the question.

I was always very impacted by Axelrod's *The Evolution of Cooperation*, how he describes the winning player as somebody who plays 'tit-for-tat', which is that they are always actively looking to cooperate. If you 'whack' them, they will whack back, so they know how to defend, but they are always interested in cooperating.

What happens over a progressive process of the game is that they attract the highest quality players because everybody knows you can't make money from fighting. So cooperation is what gets you there.

I think the question is: Globally, how do we build models that are based on real life, and how life really works that allow us through informal and open cooperation – primarily through culture – to build something that can really start it?

Farrell: It's through culture. This is why Russia is so fascinating to me right now. They are engaged in a huge political cultural experiment that has never really been tried before. For all the problems, and there are clearly many problems with Mr. Putin's regime, his language is always trying to appeal to this idea of, "Let's cooperate. We're partners, so let's cooperate."

He is being rejected out of hand by the West, but to the West's own detriment over the long term, I think.

His model is very interesting to look at because it's based on this idea of mutual cultural tolerance. So far, the message isn't being heard in the West, largely because the people running the West have turned their backs on the whole idea of culture, other than tearing it down. So Mr. 'Globaloney' is cutting his throat.

Fitts: So, the Democrats can win the election or the Republicans can win the election. If the Democrats win the election, particularly if by any chance they get the Senate, you are going to see over the next four to eight years, tremendous immigration flood the United States. The way for them, at that point, to deal with the cultural war is to overwhelm the population with new people who are very grateful for the ability to move in.

There are 325 million people in the United States. Let's presume a scenario where the Democrats win both the Senate, the House, and the White House. What do you think the population will be after eight years of that situation?

Farrell: Numerically, I can see the population going to 350 to 375 million.

Fitts: I can see it going to 400 million.

Farrell: I can see that, too. At that point, the culture is swamped. There will be nothing left of any part of the Anglo-American culture that founded the coun-

try. It will be ridiculously progressivist. That's not a culture what they have planned; it is not going to be a culture.

I can see possibly some sort of crackup of the country because those people coming in are going to move to the coasts. They will move to the blue states, and that will touch off a big sectional dispute because the rest of the country is just going to have it lorded over them, and they are going to get fed up with it. We are already fed up with it, quite frankly.

Every time I hear Cuomo or Newsome, I think, "Will you guys just please leave now and leave the rest of us alone?"

I can see that leading to a crackup and a cultural swamp. We know that with those people coming in, you will have the drug cartels, the pedo rings, the sex trafficking rings, and the human trafficking rings coming in bigtime. It's going to be Jeffrey Epstein on steroids. I can see a total breakdown.

Fitts: Organized crime will have the ability of contact tracing to kidnap your children.

Farrell: Exactly!

Fitts: This is the year to get to know your sheriff.

Farrell: Yes, this year is the year to get to know your sheriff.

Fitts: Question #7: What will happen to U.S. land and real estate as a result of changes underway? What about the existing energy model?

We are talking about radical breakthroughs in lowering the energy price, which means radical breakthroughs in the cost of manufacturing, which means that you can bring a good deal of manufacturing back to the United States, including without pollution. That will radically change real estate use, particularly if you are right that you need these zones.

Farrell: The other thing here is if there is a massive influx of immigration to the country, that will be a destabilizing factor for the US's role abroad. In other

words, we are going to see all the geopolitical things that we outlined in the first part of this review. Those things are going to be ratcheted up and sped along tremendously. The more unstable the United States becomes, the more the Europeans, the Japanese, and the Indians are going to ratchet up their military spending, and they are going to assume a much greater role on the world stage than they are right now. That is one fallout.

The other consequence of it is if you are a property owner or have real estate, if you have a house instead of an apartment, be prepared to defend it.

Fitts: Right, depending on where you are.

Question #9: Which is stranger: What is going on behind the veil of secrecy, or the overwhelming effort to pretend it is not going on and to create an official reality diverging steadily from reality?

Farrell: Oh, I think that the latter is stranger. This is the other thing that I was talking about with regard to this cultural civil war.

We have one part of this country rooted more or less in reality, and the other believing a 'propatainment' media narrative. The two are growing further and further apart. If there is that kind of victory for the Democrats in the coming election, that is only going to increase. It is going to become virtually impossible for the two parts of this culture to talk to each other anymore. In my mind, that will inevitably lead to an actual break.

Fitts: Let me explain one of the breaks that it is going to lead to: The perfect example was a major emergent discussion in the trucking industry of truckers saying, "We're not going to deliver to a city that defunds the police."

If you're a trucker moving a load into a city, it is very dangerous. It's dangerous because of the organized crime and some of the disorganized crime. But it's a dangerous job. It's dangerous now with a fully-funded police force. You take the police force away, and trucking will be beyond dangerous.

The truckers are saying, "We are not driving into a city that doesn't have a police force."

When Trump won the election, there was a quote that I used for productivity backlash. The people who grow the food, drill for the oil, and do the concrete functions said, “No, we’re not going to go along with it. Between Silicon Valley and Wall Street, you have people who sit at computers and spin assets around like they’re concepts, and they don’t know what it’s like to take care of a cow, and they think that all these things can just be conceptually manipulated and changed.”

If you look at transhumanism, it’s a vision of people who spend too much time on the computers, which I am one. They are not out in the concrete world dealing with the concrete world.

The people who are doing the concrete work are just going to give up and say, “You know something? We’re not trucking the food into your city so you can destroy it.”

Farrell: This is precisely why I think that a crackup is a very real possibility. You will see is those truckers – many of those companies based in the heartland – that they are going to quit delivering to those places. Once that happens, those places are going to have to start instituting governmental solutions.

I think it’s entirely possible that you are going to see things like People’s Republic of California or Socialist Republic of Oregon or whatever. In order to deal with that crisis, they create a typical big government centralized solution to resolve it. At that point, it’s a de facto crackup.

Fitts: So, we are splitting between the productive and *Atlas Shrugged*.

Farrell: You are going to have Galt’s Gulch (From the novel *Atlas Shrugged*) being represented by the vast land area of the country, and then you are going to have Andrew Cuomo’s wonderful New York and Bill de Blasio’s New York City trying to run themselves without that. That isn’t going to work, but they will try.

I think with Galt’s Gulch and the truckers, that is a signal that more is going to come if things keep going the way they are going. It’s not only the truckers who

are going to start doing that; it's everybody who is involved in actual production or delivery of goods and services.

Fitts: The reason the whole thing holds together is that they have so much subsidy from the reserve currency to waste. If you lose the reserve currency, then you are talking like a rubber band that snaps back.

I would say that it was phenomenal for me to go from Hickory Valley to Silicon Valley, back to Hickory Valley to Silicon Valley because everyone in Hickory Valley had to sell it for more than it cost them to make it. That made them phenomenally intelligent about the use of their time. Then I would go to Silicon Valley, and you had all these people with 150 IQs who were massively subsidized by black budget technology and government subsidy, but they didn't know it.

So, they had these phenomenal IQs and phenomenal educations, and they were so stupid. They had years of misleading feedback.

Farrell: This is precisely what I'm talking about. Just consider California as a microcosm of the entire country. You have the Silicon Valley people in San Francisco and the surrounding area, including Sacramento. Then you have L.A. and San Diego. That is what most people think of as 'California'. It's liberal, it's Democrat, it's subsidized, and it's many computer people on their computers thinking, "This is how the real world works."

Then you have the rest of California that has been absolutely devastated by those people. The San Joaquin Valley is no longer the lush agricultural region that it was when I was a child going out there to visit relatives; it's a dustbowl. It's because of kooky policies coming from the one-party state in Sacramento. The rest of California simply isn't represented at all.

This is why you have this movement in California to try to create two states out of it. In other words, there is an internal secession movement of part of California to secede from the rest of California. The part that wants to secede are the same people who are trying to produce something in Bakersfield or Fresno or what have you, and want no more to do with San Francisco, Sacramento, L.A. and all of that – and you can't blame them.

I look at it as kind of a microcosm of what we are seeing happen in the rest of the country. Those farmers who were put out of business by their kooky policies want to grow food, and they want to ship it. They could if they weren't beholden to Sacramento. I guarantee you that is going to spread to the rest of the country; there are movements in Oregon for this.

Fitts: People have finally realized that all these different rules, whether it's COVID-19 or the food safety rules, are designed for central control; it has nothing to do with food safety.

Once you get the fact that you are paying your taxes to finance people who are trying to destroy you, it changes things.

Here is the question: It's World War III. When are we going to stop financing the people who are trying to kill us?

Farrell: It's fast coming. I think there is a genuine possibility that after this election, regardless of who wins, you are going to see certain states say, "We're not funding this anymore. We're just not going to pay attention to whoever wins."

If the Democrats win, I guarantee you that there is going to be some sort of 'no taxation without representation' reaction.

I had somebody visit me recently who was trying to tell me that New York City was the financial engine for the rest of the country – which in a certain sense it is, but what does it produce?

Fitts: Financial fraud.

Farrell: Precisely. It's not producing oil; it's not producing gas; it's not producing food; it's not making automobiles; it's making rules and financial fraud.

Fitts: And it's running around the planet with the help of the US military collecting the subsidy.

Farrell: Exactly. I had to laughed at the guy because he was living in the New York City bubble. He had no idea what he was dealing with out here; none whatsoever.

You know as well as I do that people in this part of the country are just plain fed up.

Fitts: I'll never forget seeing the happiness after Trump won, and it was sincere. They knew how dangerous it was because the presidency is not an entry-level position, but at least to have someone who understood why a father wouldn't want his daughter to go to the bathroom with an adult male was reassuring to them. That was something that should be decided locally; we don't need Washington to dictate that to us.

I truly think that the thing that lost the election for the Democrats in 2016 was Hillary Clinton calling 25% of the voters 'deplorables' and the bathroom issue.

Farrell: I agree.

Fitts: Question #10: Given the tsunami of occult and demonic practices and symbols, should we be concerned about the interaction between AI and interdimensional intelligence?

Farrell: I think so.

Fitts: I also think so.

Farrell: I go back to what Elon Musk said about a year or so ago, "We have to be cautious about this AI thing because we could be gating beings into the system."

Fitts: If Satan is an interdimensional intelligence, you are allowing Satan to take over and run your governance system through the AI.

Farrell: Even if you don't believe in Satan, do you want to take the chance – to flip Pascal's argument on its head.

Fitts: If you look at all the different indications of occult practices – adrenochrome, the cannibalistic dinners with the food organized as a human body, the pedophilia, and on and on– that is why I like this documentary, *Out of the Shadows*. It's hard for many people to fathom that it's this bad, but knowing how to protect yourself is to pull away.

Most people are dying to go up the ladder; they want the positions and the titles and the money and the whatever. They need to understand that you don't want to go up that ladder. You don't want to get invited to the ceremony.

Farrell: I agree totally.

Fitts: If you don't know what we are talking about, watch *Out of the Shadows* to get a sense of how dangerous this is.

Question #11: Who is burning the churches of France and why?

I'll extend that: The last three months have been a war on the churches globally.

Farrell: Everywhere except one place: Russia.

Fitts: Who would have thought that Russia would end up being the one example?

Farrell: Exactly, that is my point. They just dedicated a new cathedral for the Russian fallen during World War II.

Fitts: I saw it, and it's quite something.

Farrell: It's a very peculiar structure, but they had all the military there for the dedication of the cathedral.

I'm looking at this business now of the church burnings going on in this country, and so far, there have been no mosques burnt. I'm just waiting for that to happen, too. Sooner or later, that will happen, and sooner or later, they will include synagogues etc.

Fitts: The thing that has astonished me is that you have all the burnings in France, and then you have the shut-down of the churches. Except for the two big Catholic letters, the only powerful pushback is these two Catholic efforts, and everyone else is silent.

Farrell: There is a rather heated discussion going on in certain Orthodox circles, but not at a high enough of a level. That disturbs me.

What the churches burning in France is to me, and I know this is going to sound strange, is that many people are probably inclined to blame it on all the Muslim population that has come into France. That may be a segment of it. I don't discount it because we've seen some violence done by that quarter against French priests and so on. But I suspect that behind that – if that is the public culprit – the real culprit is Mr. 'Globaloney'.

The one thing they cannot stand is any public affirmation of the role of Christ in the foundation of this civilization; they cannot stand it. That is what they are really wanting to get rid of, and when they get rid of that, they are going to get rid of Islam, too.

Fitts: They can't get rid of that.

Farrell: That is the problem.

Fitts: Christ is the barrier between them and transhumanism.

Farrell: Yes, it is, and that is the party. I'll tell you why I think that. Notre Dame no sooner was burnt, than Macron came along and promoted this kooky idea of rebuilding it with a greenhouse on the top and some sort of modern-day cathedral to Thermidor. We are going to go back to the French Revolution because that worked out so well.

I thought, "Dude, you are so out of touch with your own people." And let's acknowledge the fact that France is, by and large, a secularized culture. But when that cathedral was burning down, the Parisians were out there gathered around it and saying their rosaries, which they probably hadn't said in 20-25 years.

Fitts: They were praying for the fire to be put out.

Farrell: There is a cultural residue that people had taken for granted and assumed that it was not there when it was very much there. I would say that that is probably true of most of Europe, not only France.

I do think it is Mr. 'Globaloney', and probably some secret society type folks who have their hands really deep in it. They were the same ones who were behind the first go-around during the French Revolution and converting all these churches to temples to reason. Saint _____ [6:58:27] they turned into a barracks.

I really think it's that crowd all over again; it's the same crowd.

Fitts: Question #12: What are the supporting facts and arguments for optimism?

Before I turn that over to you, I had a wonderful subscriber ask me for my five stories that supported my argument for optimizing. I started to write all my stories on why I am an optimist and got to twelve, and finally said, "I can't do this in *'Ask Catherine'*, I have to do a *Solari Report* on it." So, I will do a *Solari Report* on it.

The more they 'come out of the closet', the more optimistic I feel. In one sense, we are up against all the power and money in the world. Their power is unbelievable in the material world. It's incredible. But I am also with you; I think that they are so antithetical to life; they don't understand it and they don't feel it.

The other thing that I know and am highly confident in is that death is not the worst thing that can happen. I fear slavery, but I don't fear death.

Farrell: I am somewhat the same way. Slavery is so inhuman and dehuman and antihuman. It's really the ultimate in that. Think of the Soviet Union and the inhuman existence that they tried to promote that ultimately collapsed, as it should have. This is what they are about. So, I am optimistic for many of the same reasons. However, I am optimistic for another, and that is that Mr. 'Globaloney', in his mad materialist rush to jettison every aspect that made this civi-

lization, which is the idea of covenant and the idea of logos and the idea of enlightenment freedom. These made this culture and being a part of it, and being human, and lent value to survival, and exposed a huge flank that is entirely open to attack.

These people need to be asked directly: What sort of world are you leading us to? That includes Bill Gates, George Soros, Nancy Pelosi, Diane Feinstein, Andrew Cuomo, and the whole Marxist grab bag of all these materials. And we want it spelled out in detail: “Spell out your vision.”

We are going to discover that many of them don’t have a vision; they are only doing it because it gives them ‘kicks’. Some of them do have a vision, but they need to be held accountable. We need to hear from them, and they need to be made to answer these questions.

What role is there for God in your world? And if there isn’t any role for that in your world, then I, for one, want nothing to do with it. Nothing.

Fitts: It’s never occurred to me that they have a vision.

Farrell: I don’t think that many of them do, but some of them do.

What I am getting at is that they need to be put in a public forum and asked straightforward questions.

Fitts: I think they do what they are told, and the people who tell them what to do do have a vision. It is a vision that would be totally anathema to us.

Farrell: I do think that most of them do what they are told, but the way to get the message out is to put them on the spot.

Fitts: There was a great book that I reviewed a few years ago. It was about a group of people who worked for an Admiral who became the Chief of Staff. They decided they needed to completely rewrite the strategic plans for the military. Since they planned to support the civilian plan, they said, “Let’s find the civilian plan,” and they discovered that there wasn’t any.

The Chinese have excellent plans that are public. If you are going to keep 1.3 billion people coordinated, you need to make the plan public. So the people in the military said, “If we were the civilians, what would our plan be? Then we will invent that, and then we will try to get the military to invent into that.”

It was unusual. When they left and went into academia, they tried to build a process encouraging a civilian plan. You could see what an incredible struggle it was and the price of secrecy. The people who have a plan are doing everything in secret, and then everybody else is just wandering in circles.

So why are you an optimist?

Farrell: Because of all the previous reasons. In other words, we are the bearers of the culture; they are not. That puts us in a uniquely advantageous position. We are the ones who are concerned with the nuts and bolts of the matrix that made all of their money possible. So if we shut down, they shut down.

I’m optimistic for that reason now. That doesn’t mean that I think it’s going to turn rosy tomorrow; I think that we are in for a prolonged intergenerational struggle that may go on for a generation or two before this resolves itself.

Fitts: I did an interview with Rappoport, and he said, “Let’s face it: We are in a war, and the war is 10,000 years old.”

Farrell: It is; it is 10,000 years old. It has been there all along, and it is not going to go away. What has happened in the last 200 years or so is that we have let our guard down.

Fitts: Certainly, within the last 60 years, we have.

Farrell: At least in the last 60 years. I can spot certain bellwethers as far as this country is concerned where the guard came down: The Civil War, Woodrow Wilson, Franklin Roosevelt, and the assassination of JFK. I think that those are the five defining benchmark moments where we took some wrong turns institutionally and culturally and politically in this country, but the war is much older than that.

I go back to the fact that the Bill of Rights, if you look at it in a certain way, is really the ‘Bill of Afterthoughts’.

Those men in Philadelphia gave us a marvelous document, but those things should have been right up there in the Preamble.

In other words, like it or not, we live in a flawed system. That doesn’t mean I am rushing out to support state conventions to get a new Constitution. No, that kind of work has to be done after we get through this crisis. But we have to realize that it needs to be done eventually, but not now. Not anywhere close to now.

Fitts: Let’s talk about **Take Action**. Number one is to support great leadership, and I will say it again: Who is your sheriff? Who is on your city council? Stop worrying about the Presidential election and start worrying about locally what is going on and where your safety is going to come from, where your food is going to come from, and where your energy will come from. You need to think very nuts and bolts.

Farrell: It is going to be the local and state levels that will be your country, quite literally, if things really go ‘haywire’ with this next election and we get ‘sleepy Joe’ in there. It is going to be your local and state governments.

I go back to something that you and I have mentioned in several of the previous quarterly reports. That includes starting up websites where candidates for local office, particularly for offices like sheriff and corporate commissioners and so on down the line, can publish where they stand on Second Amendment rights and other issues. Go down the line. If they don’t reply, publish the result as, “No reply received. Cannot recommend this person.”

You are absolutely right. The local and state elections now are much more important because those are will be the political institutions that are going to have to be the mechanisms of survival if things go south. I can’t emphasize that strongly enough.

Fitts: I got an email from a wonderful ally of mine in Tennessee. He is from a town that I always recommend people look at if they are looking for places to

move to. He said, “The price of homes is up. They have doubled or tripled in the last five years.”

Apparently, the Four Seasons is building a condo tower in Nashville, and on their first day, they sold \$80 million worth of condos.

I said to somebody, “What is going on?”

They said, “The word is out. Tennessee is the place to be.”

As the riots persist, people are looking to get out of the heartland and get to places where it’s safer.

Farrell: You mean get out of the big cities and into the heartland. I think so, too, and I think that is happening.

It’s like what a lady on my website forum said, “It’s alright if you people that are leaving California, Oregon, or wherever want to come here, but please don’t bring your politics with you. Leave it there in California and wake up and smell that your politics led to the situation that you are in.”

Fitts: I would like to talk about the Governor of South Dakota.

Farrell: I’m up for a discussion about South Dakota!

Fitts: We want to talk about great leadership. There was one state that didn’t shut down: South Dakota, which was your governor. Right after your governor made the decision, the small businessmen in the capitol got together and did an impromptu parade in her honor.

Farrell: I saw that. You have to understand that the capitol of South Dakota, Pierre, has only about 10,000 people; it’s not very big. But the whole state thought more or less that way. Kudos to Governor Noem.

I have to love her because she also recently tweeted when people started talking about tearing down Mt. Rushmore, “Not on my watch!”

I would like to see anybody come into this state and try that.

Fitts: Mt. Rushmore is so beautiful. I was passing through South Dakota on a Sunday, and it was snowing. I drove up, and the whole place was open, but it was only me because of the snow. It was one of the most beautiful things I've ever seen. It's astonishing.

Farrell: It is beautiful, and people don't realize how high up it is. When you look at the mountain, and then you turn to go out and look over the plains for miles and miles and miles off into the distance, it is a very pretty place.

South Dakota is an interesting state. I am glad that it is always a decade or two behind the rest of the country. In some respects, it is very much like Texas; it is very independent. Kudos for Governor Noem for not shutting the state down.

Fitts: I want to mention her, and I also want to mention the Dallas hairdresser.

Farrell: Her also.

Fitts: Especially her boyfriend. In Texas, money talks; they understand money in Texas. They put her in prison, and he did a crowdfund. He didn't ask for \$25,000; he asked for \$500,000, and collected it in 24 hours.

I went to donate, and I think they were up to \$350,000. I said, "Wow! This is serious!"

Farrell: And put that with the fact that nearly everybody in Texas, particularly outside of Dallas, Fort Worth, and Houston, have guns. Let's put it very bluntly.

I know for a fact there are Texas ranchers who are dealing with the immigration problem 'in their own way' because they were fed up with the Federal government not dealing with it. They haven't had problems.

You are now dealing with a situation where more and more people, like the folks in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, are stepping up and saying, "We're not putting up with it," and it is going to spread.

Fitts: If the government that you pay taxes to won't provide law and order, you will have to do it.

Farrell: Number one, why pay the taxes if they aren't going to do anything about it? Number two, if the government isn't going to do anything about it, you are going to have to.

Fitts: Let's talk about **Great Actions** because there were some great people doing great things. There was great leadership, but I would like to mention a few.

I mentioned earlier Rand Paul tweeting out to remind us that he did stop John Bolton from becoming Secretary of State. Rand Paul is fearless; he is very, very courageous, and he has done some great things. That is why I always say that it is incremental, but one person can make a huge difference.

Congressman Massie – God love him – made them vote on the record. Now he has won his primary, and we have to make sure that he wins the election. He also sponsored the PRIME Act (amends the Federal Meat Inspection Act).

It was somewhat funny because I put up a post saying that we all have to support Massie on the PRIME Act, and I went in to check who the sponsors were. They have a Senate version and a House version. My congressman and both of my senators were already on it. I said, "That is why everybody is moving to Tennessee!"

We are where we protect your beef; we don't try to start plant-based foods or grow mother's milk.

There are so many small farmers. The one that we had on *Solari* was 'Home farming in a box: Central Texas brothers help locals grow food with a business'. So, you have all these people getting online on YouTube and teaching their neighbors, friends, and family how to start gardens and grow food quickly. Some of them are a 'hoot' because they are so practical.

Everyone is realizing that they have to help each other.

So more **Great Actions** – do you have any ideas?

Farrell: The one who stood out the most for me in this last quarter was Sidney Powell, not only because of what she did for General Flynn, but for what she said in Hillsdale College and in various interviews that she has been on as all of this was coming down. I think that she is another one who has exercised a great deal of courage in putting the record crystal clear on what has been going on.

Fitts: Right, she put her life at risk. I don't think people realize how physically dangerous it was.

Farrell: She did put her life at risk. She is definitely one, and the Governor of South Dakota is another one that obviously resonated with me. For **Great Actions** going into the future, we need some organization in vetting political candidates on a regional and local level. Those vettings need to be published online.

Fitts: I also want to mention the youth in Hong Kong because if you look at the pushback they've made against the PRC encroachments, which are really an abrogation of the PRC's agreements, it's amazing. They are demanding integrity, but they are also pushing back against facial recognition and all the technology that is being used for control. It is very interesting to watch because Hong Kong was the most innovative city in the world. It was a city where people believed they could do anything and be anything. It was so inspirational to be there. The last time I was there several years ago, you could feel the fear and frustration and anger as this central control moves in.

I know what those young people are doing and what it's like. I've been amazed at the quality of their organization and their intelligence. They have to be the smartest group of protestors on the planet.

Farrell: And I think it is going to spread.

Fitts: I hope you are right.

Here is to the revolution!

Tell us about the *3rd Quarter*. What is on your mind for both you and the road ahead? What do you think the *3rd Quarter* is going to be like?

Farrell: It is going to be more chaos, and it will be increasing over what we've seen thus far. I think you are going to start to see some significant pushback from the Trump Administration in this country against all these narratives. If not, he is 'toast'; it's one or the other.

My biggest concern right now is the election – not so much who is going to win, but what the reaction is going to be. I don't see this situation getting any better. Neither side has any real solution to the problems. So, I think you will see everything that we have been talking about increasing. That concerns me – not only for my own livelihood and safety, but for my friends in this area.

Fitts: I would say to everyone listening or reading this, it is a little like the story I once told about what we were doing at Hamilton Securities. We were doing our plans for the next year, and we finished them. It had been a long process, and people were sick of it. There was something wrong, but I couldn't figure out what it was. I said, "Do me a favor. I want you to do a time budget. Tell me in hours how your plan looks."

So we did, and what came back was that we had allocated 725% of our time. There was no way that the plan could work.

So, we are going into a system and a process between Labor Day and Thanksgiving that will demand 300-400% of our time, which we cannot spend. So now before Labor Day is here, you have to decide what is important, and you have to find a way to block out everything else.

Farrell: This is one of the things for me that is going to be a real challenge in this *3rd* and *4th Quarter*, and that is simply how do I schedule my blogging time, and what do I really want to focus on. Part of the problem has been during this COVID-19, I was getting nothing but articles about COVID from people. I'm thinking that there are other stories out there, and this is being used to direct people's attention away from those other stories. And this is not going to decrease; it is only going to increase.

I am trying to avoid too much politics and so on because everybody is obsessed with that right now. So, I'm trying to figure out what my priorities will be this next quarter in terms of things I want to focus on, and that really is a question for me. It has me quite vexed as to what direction I go in. Much of that is dependent upon what my website members are doing and sending and saying and talking about.

We feed off each other. So, that is one concern. I'm not too concerned about the economy or things like that locally – not yet anyway. However, we have a mayor and a health department person talking about mandated face masks and all of this, which concerns me because that is going to put an end to most of the businesses here, which have been struggling anyway. It is very, very difficult to predict.

Fitts: Has the mayor or the health officer said once they destroy the businesses, what is going to happen to their tax base?

Farrell: No, and this is what absolutely flabbergasts me. They are not thinking or talking in those terms at all. Interestingly enough, they are scheduling their press conferences at a time during the week and a time of day – usually on Thursday afternoon – when they are interrupting a certain prominent radio talk show host. I am getting the impression that host is not saying things they want to hear.

I am watching the local situation. We have had the same kind of 'squishy' responses from our state governor, whom I voted for, but I have big second thoughts about the man.

Fitts: I think I mentioned that Ohio sent letters to 24,000 people saying they had overpaid them unemployment compensation and they wanted the money back.

Farrell: Unreal, and that money is spent.

I don't think that anybody in most of these states – red or blue – with maybe the exception of South Dakota, is aware of how cynical the population has be-

come to them. Even here, where I'm at, I don't think that they have a clue. They are so completely out of touch. So we will see.

Fitts: It's odd because people always say, "There is nothing I can do," and I say, "First and foremost, it is a spiritual war. You can pray."

Prayer can make a difference, and it helps to find a prayer group.

One of my favorite scriptures is, "The prayers of a righteous man availeth much."

Any last thoughts? *The Tower of Babel* is available by going to 'Giza Death Star'.

Farrell: Yes, it's on the front page of the website.

Fitts: You have fascinating conversations going on.

Farrell: Oh yes! We had a real 'barn burner' of a vidchat just recently. I have to tell you, it was one of the best that we've had, and it covered many of these issues.

Fitts: There is plenty of reverberation. Many of my subscribers are members of your website, and vice-versa. We have to be an intelligence network.

Farrell: Absolutely.

Fitts: I always tell the people, "There is entertainment, there is news, and then there is intelligence. We are not entertainment, and we are not news. We are intelligence."

Farrell: I'm telling you, I have some of the best intelligence analysts on my website.

Fitts: You do!

Farrell: They are really on top of the game.

Fitts: But that is how we are going to be smart. The conversation is always interesting and lively.

Farrell: Oh yes, and the recent vidchat was definitely one of the most interesting and lively of many interesting and lively conversations.

Fitts: We look forward to the *3rd Quarter Wrap Up* with you, Joseph. If we had a lot to talk about this time, we are really going to have a lot to talk about next time!

Farrell: It is going to be ‘off the charts’ next quarter, and the *4th Quarter* after the election, but I’m not holding my breath. It’s going to be off the charts regardless.

Fitts: Next quarter we will close on September 30th, so it will be the first week of October. If we are lucky, they will put the Anthony Weiner laptop up on the internet.

Farrell: I get the feeling that something is going to break before October. There is this ‘tremor in the force’, to quote Obi-Wan Kenobi.

Fitts: Obama looks terrified; he looks very scared.

Farrell: He should be!

Fitts: It’s treason, and isn’t treason punishable by death?

Farrell: Yes, it is.

Fitts: So he is guilty of treason, and he is looking scared. Who else is scared?

Farrell: Since the Strzok memo came out, you have to include Strzok, Joe Biden, and the President.

Fitts: Is Biden conscious enough to be aware?

Farrell: I'm going to send you a link after we are through. It's called *The Poetry of Joe Biden*, and I want you to watch this. I shared it with Dr. de Hart, and he emailed back that that is pure genius.

Fitts: They're not expecting Joe Biden to function in the Presidency.

Farrell: Of course not! He is being run as a puppet for a shadow presidency. Frankly, I think that one of the people behind him is Barrack Obama and then the person who owns the CNN network. I think that the whole point of his candidacy is for a de facto Obama third term behind the scenes. They are running him to bring in their 'kooky' Green New Deal agenda, but also as a means of getting rid of all these investigations that are going on, and to keep their own 'you-know-what's' out of prison because that is the only way they can do it.

If Trump gets in for a second term and those investigations continue, they could take a fall. That is if – and it's a big 'if' – they decide to go ahead with some real prosecutions. As far as I'm concerned, it will have to happen if there is going to be any restoration of trust in the Federal government and judiciary at all. They must have it.

Fitts: So, you think it's possible the Durham investigation is serious.

Farrell: I think it's possible that it is, but my problem with this whole thing all along has been that there is enough evidence out there in the public domain right now, in my opinion, to haul some of these people up in front of a grand jury and get indictments.

I can't figure out if there is any end to this whole process. Is anyone at all going to be held accountable for what has happened? So far, absolutely no one has been held accountable. It has been the Republicans going to jail, and all these Democrats behind all of this are still walking free.

Fitts: But if you look at who has gone to jail, it's almost nobody.

Farrell: Precisely, it's almost nobody.

Fitts: I think I sent to you the *1st Quarter 2019 Wrap Up* where we did the little booklet on JP Morgan Chase. There was \$42 billion of settlements for civil and criminal liabilities.

Farrell: And no one is in jail.

Fitts: No, because the Department of Justice just wants their percentage; it's a kickback scheme.

Farrell: This is another reason I think that President Trump's support is 'squishier' than he imagines. That is because nothing has been done. He can talk about how many judges he has appointed, but we have had judges flip on us before. Think John Roberts.

The problem is, from the standpoint of the average voter on the political right in this country, what they are seeing is that nothing has been done. As a result of that, it's one more time in a long litany of 'the GOP failed us again' that I think is what is driving much of the lack of support right now that Trump is experiencing. So, it's the COVID virus, and the fact that no one has been 'perp walked'. Unless that happens, I guarantee you that my read of the cultural situation is that the Federal government might as well pack it in because people are losing faith in it at a breathtaking rate.

Fitts: Here is the question: At the speed which they are printing, can they maintain the Treasury market?

Farrell: That is a good question. I honestly don't know.

Fitts: They can function without taxes. As long as they can maintain the Treasury market, they can just print the money. But this comes down to: Are you going to pay your taxes? Who are you going to pay your taxes to?

When I left Washington, I said, "Everybody should put their taxes in a local escrow. Get a court to agree. Put all your taxes in an escrow, and the court-controlled escrow pays a portion of the money to the Federal government to pay the national debt and the military. Then with respect to all money that comes domestically to the county, say, 'You know something? We'll take care of it our-

selves out of this money because we are required as citizens to make sure that the money is spent legally, and you have spent 20 years refusing to obey the law related to financial management. So, we have the right to do the equivalent of a financial citizen's arrest.”

Farrell: I think there is a good chance of that actually happening after the election if the Democrats win. I can see a situation arising where those kinds of solutions may actually be pursued.

Fitts: I hope so.

Farrell: I hope that the Democrats don't win.

Fitts: I don't either, but here is the thing: Every year we waste trillions of dollars; we waste hundreds of billions of dollars. We can't afford to do that anymore.

Farrell: I agree, but it's the situation which that would be done that bothers me. As 'wishy-washy' as Mr. Trump has turned out to be – especially during this COVID thing, I far prefer him to anybody in whatever it is that the Democratic Party now is; it's certainly not the party of my parents.

Fitts: One of the things that Daniel Liszt said was that we were going to have this dream ticket of Kerry and Mitt Romney. The solution was that Biden couldn't function because of his dementia, so you put on a dream ticket of Kerry as the Democrat and Romney as the supposed Republican, and they are the dream unifying ticket.

Farrell: I don't see anything like that happening.

Fitts: I don't see it either, but he seems to believe that is a possibility.

Farrell: If you are a typical moderately left-of-center Democrat, you can't be looking at the Democratic Party with anything other than fear and loathing because the current leadership is totally 'wacky'.

Fitts: But Kerry's attraction is that he is not 'wacky'.

Farrell: Kerry's attraction is that he is not wacky, but I can't honestly say that I think the same thing about Mitt Romney.

Fitts: I used to think that John Kerry would make a good President. The problem is that anybody who would be a good President would never allow Mitt Romney to be one heartbeat away from the Presidency.

Farrell: That is my problem, too.

Fitts: So if he runs with Mitt Romney, then he doesn't qualify for the Presidency.

Farrell: The problem I have with the dream ticket is that I think it would be perceived as fake by a significant portion of the electorate. It would win, but it would win on a plurality rather than an actual majority. I think that there are many people – myself included – who would just stay home and say, "Enough with the theatre."

Fitts: Is there anybody who would make a great President?

Farrell: Anyone who is out there now? No, the leadership class has been so 'dumbed down' and they are so corrupt.

Fitts: What about Rand Paul?

Farrell: Rand Paul is a 'maybe'. The problem with Trump is that he did not have a network of people he could bring into the government with him. If Rand Paul does that, he has to have his shadow cabinet. In Great Britain, the opposition party has its shadow cabinet ready to go if they take power.

Fitts: Rand Paul could put together a reasonable shadow cabinet.

Farrell: He could do that, but he would have to do something like that to be successful in office. The other problem that he has is he would have to get those 'flannel-mouth, cotton-mouth' leaders in the Republican Party, particularly in

the senate, off their ‘duffs’ and supporting him. I honestly don’t see that coming out of Mitch McConnell or Lindsay Graham.

Fitts: Probably not.

Farrell: The country is in a mess. There are no two ways around this. We are not going to get out of this without having a solution that is not inter-generational in nature. This is a long-term issue. We have to buckle down and start thinking in those terms. It’s not going to be the next election cycle or the next one after that or the one after that.

Fitts: It took us decades to ruin what we had. The way that we lost the country was one county at a time. Either we take it back one county at a time, or we are not going to get it back.

Farrell: Precisely. This is going to have to be a long process and a well thought out process. Part of that process, in my opinion, is that we have to be willing to critique everything in our history sanely and deeply, and first of all, we have to identify the benchmarks of where things began to go wrong. Right at the top of my list is Philadelphia 1787. They’re not afterthoughts; they should be right at the top of the Preamble.

Fitts: I would say at the top of my list is the first time we let the Beck brothers get away with it, and 1963 was one of those times.

Farrell: The other time was Franklin Delano Roosevelt.

Fitts: We let the Beck brothers get away with it again and again and again, and we will have to deal with that. It’s time to put on your big boy pants.

Farrell: It’s time to put on the ‘big boy pants’. A book I recommend for you is Diana West’s *American Betrayal*. Have you read it?

Fitts: I have it in my pile in my den, but I can order it here.

Farrell: Read it; it's passionate, it's detailed, it's argued well, and it is breathtaking. I would urge anybody to read it as well. Then go back and read her other book called *The Red Thread*. That will almost tell the whole story.

Fitts: So many books!

Farrell: Right, so many books, so little time. I do know that feeling.

Fitts: I have a pile of 400 urgent ones in Hickory Valley, but I can't ship anything here because it takes two to three months for packages to arrive. So I am building a new pile of books, but I'm only at about 60 in this pile.

Farrell: You'll enjoy hauling those back if you are ever able to come back here.

Fitts: My dream was to go back and forth and to spend 40% of my time in the US and 40% in the Netherlands. I'm hoping that I can do that again, but I'm in a process now where I can't leave until the process is done. My fear is that if I go back to the states, I can't get back here to finish.

I'll get this finished, and then we will see where the U.S. is. It isn't looking very good right now.
