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Catherine Austin Fitts: Ladies and gentlemen, welcome back to the *3rd Quarter 2020 Quarterly Wrap Up* with Dr. Joseph Farrell. This is Part II. We will be talking about **Culture, Science & Technology, Space, Food & Health**, and have a great web presentation. The *News Trends & Stories* team has worked overtime to get all of our picks for the top headlines into a dynamic TablePress, and I think you are going to like it. So, check out the web presentation as we go along.

Dr. Joseph Farrell, welcome back.

Dr. Joseph Farrell: Thank you for having me.

Fitts: We talked about **Economy & Financial Markets**, and it was a ‘whopper doozy’, as you would say, and nothing could top that. But now I’m looking at **Culture** with statues of Robert E. Lee in Richmond and Charlottesville and thinking, “Oh! This is even more intense than **Economy & Financial Markets**.”

We spend much more time on culture now at *The Solari Report*, and I credit you with inspiring that. You said, “We can’t save the country, but we can save the culture.”

So I started to think about, “What does that mean? How would I do it? What actions would I take?”

I realized that you were absolutely right, and that is when we had to really focus our efforts. So, we spent much more time on it.

Before we dive into the stories, is there anything that you want to say about culture?

Farrell: It’s interesting that President Trump recently came out with an executive order suspending financing of universities that are teaching critical race theory. I don’t know if people are familiar with what this is. This is coming out of, the so-called, ‘Frankfurt School of Critical Theory in Germany’. Many of these people ended up in this country like Herbert Marcuse, although there were some who remained in Germany and had quite a post-war career in promoting

this cultural Marxism.

The Frankfurt School basically starts off where Antonio Gramsci, the Italian cultural Marxist who decided that Marx was wrong, and this revolution is never going to come about by a class struggle. He said, “We have to drive the revolution by seizing the culture and the cultural institutions and driving our vision of culture into society.”

The Frankfurt School with Theodor Adorno and Marcuse and people like them picked up on it and translated it into this country where it really took root in the academies in their literature departments, their art departments, sociology, and so on. It is a very, very important thing. We are seeing the product of what they did with the temper-tantrum throwing, people rioting and looting and telling us that Black Lives Matter, when they are all rich, educated, white people.

Fitts: And they are destroying black neighborhoods.

Farrell: Precisely. It’s a very important development, but just to give you a clue as to what kind of culture they are promoting, Theodor Adorno, the so-called music critic, was a big fan and promoter of the ‘music’ of Arnold Schoenberg – that awful, atonal noise. I would rather sit around and listen to Led Zeppelin than listen to any of that ‘stuff’ because at least, that’s still music.

Schoenberg, and in a large part Stravinsky, after he surrendered to the whole atonal movement, was Adorno’s ‘bailiwick’. So, that is the kind of ‘culture’ they were promoting. Jackson Pollock being another one. It’s just ugliness masquerading as art. There was the peer pressure that I wrote about in *Microcosm and Medium* that they began to apply to get everybody to think, “This is wonderful, new, trendy, avant-garde stuff.”

It turns out like Susan Sontag said when she heard some of the music that we were supposed to marvel at, how wonderful all of this ugliness really was. That is what we are talking about.

Kudos to Trump for doing that. That, at least, recognizes he has a cultural problem on his hands, not just a political one. So, I do credit him.

Fitts: There are two people who I want to point out who we highlighted during the 3rd *Quarter*. One was Bret Weinstein (and his wife). They had taught at Evergreen and lived through the ‘brouhaha’ in 2017 in Evergreen College in Washington. There also is an Australian who made a documentary about what happened.

I published a short video from Weinstein, who was a science or biology teacher, when he said, “You have to understand that what we are talking about is not something that undermines our culture; we are talking about undermining civilization if this catches on.”

If you look at the basic tenets civilization needs to hold together, this destroys it. Up is down and left is right and truth is fiction and fiction is truth. It was a very compelling presentation.

The other was a gentleman, Casey Peterson from Sandia Lab, who was forced to go through one of these white privilege trainings. He made a video and a whole presentation on how this was total ‘BS’. It ‘rocked’ Sandia Labs, and it got to Trump who said, “Now Federal agencies are not allowed to do this kind of training.”

Farrell: Kudos to him for doing that. I wish they would pass some of that white privilege my way!

The bad thing about it is they are promoting yet another agenda that collectivizes people. I don’t care if you are black, white, or purple polka-dotted; I just want to deal with a real person – not a collective. I’m not a collective; you’re not a collective.

Fitts: Here is the thing: In my model, which is a decentralized model, each person is unique.

Farrell: Exactly.

Fitts: I tell people, “This is why I go crazy when everybody says, ‘What percentage of my assets should I hold in precious metals?’ I can’t answer that question without knowing a fantastic amount about you.”

Let's dive in. **Culture:**

Story #11: Attacks on Free Speech & Spiritual and Cultural Institutions Grow.

I don't think it's any surprise. We talked much about this last week, and we always talk about the extraordinary extent of the secrecy. As we know, the entire control model that is being promoted depends on massive amounts of secrecy – both on money, on operations, etc. If you are going to keep things secret, I think that the reason they didn't want to have a real campaign with real conversations is that the secrecy was breaking down. So, this really gets back to the extraordinary size and growth of secrecy. It's destroying our society. That's why they have to shut down free speech.

We all expected it. Anybody who is in the independent media, expected it. Has it come in the way that you expected?

Farrell: Not really because the way that I look at it, this whole business about social distancing is really about trying to prohibit little networks of people talking to each other that they cannot monitor.

The discussions you have playing a game of cards with friends, or out by the swimming pool or whatever – it's those things that I think they are trying to cut down on because they know that they will never be able to control it completely. So, they are trying to do that.

The other thing that I'm not surprised about is the so-called 'fact checkers' on the social media who oftentimes are promoting an agenda. That, I fully expected, but I did not expect this attempt to shut down any normal human interaction on a face-to-face basis. That took me by surprise.

Fitts: In my experience, they've always been most afraid of the field. Look at many of the people who they target. They're not famous in the corporate media, but if you look at their impact on the field, it is very significant.

Farrell: They have to shut that down. I don't think they are going to be successful.

Let's assume for a moment, that they do attempt to do it and are successful in shutting down all alternative media on the internet. The only thing that is going to generate is the old Russian Samizdat typewriter and mimeograph newsletters sent through the postal system. If that doesn't work, we'll do carrier pigeons. They are not going to be able to shut down independent thought no matter how hard they try.

I'm one of those people who started preparing my typewriter long ago. It was ready to go. I have copy machines, etc. so, let them try.

Fitts: I just did a review of *The Contagion Myth*, which is a new book by Sally Fallon Morell, who is the head of Weston Price, and Tom Cowan, the doctor who was so persuasive about the germ theory. There are serious doubts about the germ theory in the first place.

I had Sally on recently, and I had pre-ordered the book. I like *The Contagion Myth* because we have done a series of about ten book reviews of books that talk about the fallacy of the germ theory, or the impacts of EMF radiation or many different things on vaccinations. But *The Contagion Myth* brings them all together. So if you don't have time to read ten books, you can get all of them in one presentation. It is very, very well written.

Earlier, I had subscribers post or email saying, "Amazon has cancelled my pre-order and refunded my money." The book is censored at Amazon.

Farrell: I can believe it.

Fitts: Then in their next sentence, every one of them was saying, "It must be as good as you said. I'm getting it at Barnes & Noble," or, "I'm getting it at the publisher.

It's almost as though Amazon had given it a resounding endorsement.

The thing that has confused me is, when people are irritated that Facebook or Google or Amazon censor something, I don't understand.

In other words, these institutions had no integrity to begin with. They were

launched to control. Amazon may not have been launched to control, but ultimately, it was taken over. They are now all basically, one way or another, government or defense contractors. What else do you expect?

We have to make our own arrangements. We can't depend on these people.

Farrell: We can't. The other thing that we need to remember about Amazon – and I'm going to get on one of my 'old hobby horses' here.

Fitts: This is a good one, so rant on this.

Farrell: Rant warning coming: My whole problem with Amazon began with Kindle and ebooks. Number one, these platforms do not permit serious scholarship because, when you change the formatting on your screen, you are changing the pagination. So, if I am referencing a footnote to such-and-such a page, the page numbers move. That is a minor one.

The major one is this permits them to change a text at the 'push of a button'. And if you think I'm lying, research the people who have pointed out translation errors in Amazon ebooks.

They don't call it 'Kindle' for 'nothing'; it's about burning books. It's about burning the hard copy record. This is the Soviet encyclopedia on steroids. That is another major reason I have decided to go to self-publication. I've told people over and over again that the only canonical form of my books is the actual printed copy; no ebook represents what I've actually written. The format changes itself whether or not they actually interfere with the text. So, I am totally opposed to it.

If you think cryptocurrencies are bad, stay on your ebook platforms.

Fitts: I couldn't agree more.

As far as attacks on spiritual and cultural institutions go, we talked about the churches. I continue to be amazed at their success here.

Farrell: It's been almost total but for a few exceptions of some pastors

standing up to this whole mask mandate and prohibition of services.

They are attempting to tell the church – and here is a clue – how they can worship and when. If they can do that, they can insist those churches change texts they do not like.

Fitts: The other thing is that you can't sing in church.

My favorite one was when a group from a church got together and constructed a 'Worship Protest'. They went out to the park to have a praise and worship service. When the police came, they explained they were having a worship protest, and the police couldn't do anything because it was, after all, a protest.

Farrell: It amazes me that people haven't latched onto the significance of that. If they can insist on churches changing their piety, their doctrine, their ritual, and ultimately, their texts, the game is over if they get away with that.

I don't think they will get away with it. If they try, the only thing that it will do is drive the church underground, as I mentioned earlier. I want people to remember something very significant about the church. The church was established by Christ with divine authority. It is therefore, not only a government, – it has all the mechanisms of government and had them from the beginning with bishops, priests, and deacons – but also the church is her own autonomous culture. When that is threatened, it goes underground. When it goes underground, what does she do?: She metastasizes just like the early church did throughout the Roman Empire until *fait accompli*; they had lost control of their own institutions.

'Mr. Globaloney' is playing with fire on this one. When you want to talk intelligence agencies, you look at the Roman Catholic Church spread all over the world that has boots on the ground in every nook and cranny in the world. That is an intelligence network, like it or not. It will be anything that spy satellites will tell you.

When I was a seminary professor, we could see the collapse of the Soviet Union coming months before the actual occurrence. The reason was that we were getting reports through the church via the hierarchy of people fed up with it all

and going out in the cities and changing the names of the streets from their revolutionary names back to the names they had prior to the Bolshevik revolution. There were little signs and indicators that the whole thing was coming unraveled, and we knew the game was over.

Fitts: With cultural institutions, we are looking at museums, symphonies, operas, and theatres. New York was one of the great cultural centers of the world, and it's been destroyed.

Somebody said to me the recently, "Oh, it will build back up," but I don't know that will be the case.

Farrell: I don't think that it will – at least not in New York. You are dealing with a group of people running that city who are hypermaterialists; they have no culture. They buy culture, but that is a far different thing from owning it and possessing it as a component of your personal existence. That is a huge, huge difference. They don't understand that.

Speaking of church, what is the major bearer of culture in the West? It has been the church. Like it or not, that is the way it has been. When I say 'church', I'm not only talking the Roman Catholic Church; I'm talking the Lutherans, the Anglicans, and so on. They've given us most of the monuments of our culture – music, the Book of Common Prayer, the King James Bible, and a form of Standard English – all coming from that institution.

You're 'playing with fire' when you're playing with that. They may find out the hard way that their attempts to clamp down will backfire in a major way because it will go underground.

Fitts: It was very interesting. During the litigation, I had to decide who my governor was. Was it the political structure or the divine structure? They had developed a win-lose relationship.

Then after 9/11; I told you the story of the prayer service the day after 9/11. My preacher said that George W. Bush was anointed by God for times such as this. Then he said to me, "Austin, what do you think?" He was asking me because I had worked in Washington.

I said to him, “In my experience, the Bushes are anointed by financial fraud and narcotics trafficking and pedophilia.”

He looked stunned. This was in front of the whole congregation. He said, “If that is true, we are lost.”

I said, “Don’t be ridiculous. We aren’t lost. We have a governor. His name is God. The people like the Bushes come and go. We don’t need them.”

One of my neighbors who was very opposed to the Bushes turned and said, “Yeah!”

Farrell: I’m with you there. I keep telling people the Clintons are the front franchise for the Bush family.

Fitts: But here is the thing: If you know that you have a governor and a governance structure, you feel safe. You don’t need the political structure around you if you have a divine structure. You have a governance structure, you have rules, you have regulations, you have a community, you are never alone, you always have guidance, and there is somebody or something there to help you and support you. You have a governance structure and you have a community.

I think that is one of the reasons they are going so hard on the churches: They want you to feel like the only structure you can count on is the government.

Farrell: They want you to count on their structure. It’s a form of idolatry to idolize the genius of the Roman administration, or, for that matter, the American administration. That is the problem these people are pressing, and they are finding out in a major way that there will be pushback. It will be major.

They may be successful in driving people out of the physical buildings, but they will not be able to any more than the Roman Emperors could have people burn a little incense and worship the genius of Roman administration.

Fitts: This is what it comes down to: Fear.

If you have the right relationship spiritually, you will not be in fear; you're not going to be afraid of death.

Farrell: Exactly. It's good for people to remember Solzhenitsyn's words, "Why am I being such a pain in your neck, Mr. Stalin or Mr. Krushchev? It's because you have taken everything away from me. I have nothing left to lose."

That is where they are driving people. When you drive people into that sort of situation, the pushback starts to come. They've been teasing that and found out every time that they've teased it – going back to the Bundy Ranch episode in Nevada under Obama – they had pushback and people showing up with guns. This isn't going to work any better for them.

The other thing they have to remember is that it is Christian teaching that you have a right of self-defense.

Fitts: I believe the one thing that can stop them is the Christ.

If you are in a fight, you have to understand, "How do I get power sufficient to overpower the other side?" That is the only place that I know – and I'm sure that people in other religions would say something comparable – you will have to get your power from the divine. That is the only power that can beat their power.

Farrell: I totally agree. The thing that I think is occurring is part of the mess is that there is already some divine pushback, and they weren't counting on that.

Fitts: If you read the Ellis Medavoy interviews that Jon Rappoport wrote, that is what he describes. Every time they try to get it under complete control, that is what would happen.

Farrell: It's an inevitability. It's built in the software; it's built in human nature. We are individual persons. That is a theological term, and it's high-time we understand its significance. It means that any external pressure or tyranny ultimately comes up against human nature and fails. It has failed everywhere in every circumstance that has been tried.

Hitler had his technocracy, and it ended in absolute ruin. The Soviets had their

technocracy, and it ended in absolute ruin. So, this experiment will not turn out any better.

Fitts: I have always been surprised from the 1990's on, at the speed at which many people go along.

Farrell: I'm not surprised so much it's that. The going along phenomenon represents not so much a moral failure, but it is certainly that for some people. But it represents more of a failure of our institutions to pass down the culture. Those institutions have been hollowed out, church included.

The failure there is because these institutions have been infiltrated by people holding an ideology vastly opposed to what normal people think. Until they understand and learn that they have been dealing with a conspiracy, – and a bad one – then there is no progress. Once they wake up and realize that, then things start to change. That is what we are seeing happen.

Fitts: Story #12: The Sex Wars Get Serious.

By that, we saw a blossoming of people trying to bring transparency and objection to pedophilia, child pornography, and other things that are being used to get control files over the kind of leadership that we're watching. We talked about that in *Part I*.

I look at contact tracing, and much of the police powers that are being put into place, unfortunately, is a control grid to make sure that the leadership has complete control of children. I think that it is for many different reasons. One is to try to build into them a culture and education which is not what their parents want or would approve of. The other is that I think they want access to children for pedophilia, for adrenochrome, and for all sorts of reasons, none of which are good.

Farrell: None of which are good, and I would add one more to that list. I think they want access to children – and even adolescents – because they want to kill any sign or symbol or character of innocence because that is when they crack society wide open.

Fitts: They want the children resonating with the machine, and they want them easy to brainwash.

Farrell: Yes, and there is no better way to do it than to take away a child's innocence and traumatize them. There is no better way.

Fitts: If you look at the great political opposition they've gotten, it's a mother protecting her children or a father protecting his family. It's the love within and between the family.

If you look at all those different kinds of loves, that is what they are trying to kill.

Farrell: Absolutely. I would go even further and add the animals to that equation. It's interesting that when you read these books by various people who have written about sex slavery pedophilia networks, they get the youths involved in these through ritual abuse of animals – the killing and torture of an innocent life in every sense of the word of innocence.

I think of my little dog and the abuse that she went through before I got her. You remember her; she was just a nervous wreck.

They keep doing that, and I think you hit something earlier in the first part of the discussion we had. They keep doing that, and eventually, the whole animal realm will revolt because they sense it going on, too. We see the reaction.

Fitts: Imagine the machines they are trying to get us to resonate with only by the nature of the animal being in the room. They are being impacted and affected, as well, and it's making them crazy, too.

This gets us to **Story #13.**

Story #13: The Reengineering of Education.

I have all sorts of theories about why they want everybody to be under 24/7 electronic monitors. We are on Zoom now, but they want everybody on Zoom. They want all your data in their database.

I had various theories on what it was about. If you look at what is going on at the universities, it's just frightening. I had one professor say, "No, they want to be able to privatize the whole thing. So, if they can get everybody online and they don't have to pay for facilities and they can dramatically drop the cost of labor, they think that they can privatize this whole thing and have corporations do it."

Farrell: Isn't it interesting that the magic virus has been able to implement the Common Core regime of distance learning with the teacher being nothing but a proctor of a computer and a computerized pedagogy – whatever that is – and a computerized system of testing? Isn't it interesting that is what we are seeing coming out of the virus in terms of education?

But, what is happening is many parents are taking their children out of school altogether, don't want them online having sex education courses, and, no, the parents can't be there in the room seeing what the teachers are saying. So, it is backfiring in their faces.

I am going to make a prediction, and I am going to 'crawl right off the end of the twig of high-octane speculation'.

Fitts: Go!

Farrell: If they keep this up, they will see private schools that are truly private – not connected to the teachers' unions, not connected to the accrediting agencies – go underground. You will see a re-emergence of the old tutorial systems and public school systems as in England (if you know what the public schools are there). They are essentially prep schools. That is what you are going to see. They will be all underground, and will be networked with each other. That is what they have created.

Fitts: If you pull your children out of school and homeschool, or get together with a group of other people to start a school, or get a tutor – all of the different things that are being tried and figured out now – then the next question is: Why do I keep having to pay taxes to fund the schools?

Farrell: Precisely. That is what will happen.

If you are a teacher, please don't misunderstand me. I'm not saying that I'm against you, but I am saying to be prepared to be a teacher totally outside the system. I'm adamant on this. Nothing replaces the human interaction of a teacher or a professor one-on-one or with a group of people in a physical setting in a classroom or a lecture hall; absolutely nothing replaces that.

Fitts: There is another thing, and that is that the system they are implementing is not safe. I keep saying this to people. Having your child on Zoom for four or five or six hours a day, and having them monitored and recorded in this way, and ultimately giving direct access to your children to large corporations and intelligence agencies has never turned out well in history. It has never turned out well, and it cannot turn out well.

Here is what is interesting: It's almost as though many people can't fathom that this is really happening. No matter how much they listen to Bill Binney or Snowden or you or me, they can't fathom that their child – who is happy because they are with their friends and they are on Zoom and they feel okay and they are busy – is not okay.

Farrell: It's not, and it's gone so far. It has gone so far that parents who are monitoring their children online with these online classes have been told they can't do that. They have been told, "Your kid has to dress up like they are really in school."

In other words, "We can reach through the screen and look at your home and tell you what you should be wearing." That is a bad precedent.

People will say, "If we are doing all of this online or at home, why do we need to pay taxes for these schools?"

If eventually it comes out that they don't have to pay taxes for schools anymore, parents will take that money and invest in some homeschooling and some private tutoring.

Fitts: We've seen some of the top universities like Harvard and Stanford invest tremendous amounts of money on online content. My suspicion is that one of the places where they are going is; as you reengineer into online and

distance learning and everything else, you can wipe out most universities and colleges and just consolidate them into the ones that have the highly-controlled endowments.

Harvard is not a university; it's a corporation; it's an investment syndicate. The university is only part of that investment syndicate operation. But imagine giving them access; imagine putting Harvard in charge of 20% of the children in the country.

Farrell: Gary Lawrence and I talked about this in our book, *Rotten to the Common Core*. When you dig into the corporate relationships behind standardized testing in this country, what do you see? You see James Bryant Conant, President of Harvard, and you see the educational testing service 'in bed' with James Bryant Conant of Harvard ramming these worthless standardized tests down every public school system in the country. When you dig into the educational testing service a little more, what do you find? You find a connection to the CIA and – here it comes – MK Ultra and mind control.

The public education system is 'rotten' as we said in the title to this. It is 'rotten to the core'. And if you think it's bad now, just wait; it will get much worse with this online instruction.

Kudos to those parents who have woken up and taken their children out of the school system. I'm not trying to strike at the teachers because I know what they are going through.

Fitts: The teachers are going through 'hell'.

Farrell: Oh, the teachers are going through absolute hell because they are made to 'tap dance' to all these wacky education theories. I'm in favor of getting rid of the whole idea of credentialization; scrap it and get rid of it.

Fitts: One of my biggest concerns is that we are watching a war on the police and a war on our teachers. Those two groups just happen to have two of the largest pension funds in the country. My guess is that what is going on behind the scenes is a real push to get control of that money.

Farrell: Those teachers' unions need to, not only retain control over those pension funds, but take those pension funds and start investing in schools that the teachers themselves design. But even that is risky because most of those teachers are products of the education certification processes, which were deeply infiltrated by Frankfurt School/Marxist cultural progressivism.

Fitts: Here is what they need to make sure of: That their pension funds are not going to finance the private equity firms that are trying to commandeer all of this. So, your retirement money is going to a group of private equity firms that are destroying education in America for profit. So, both the police and the teachers are facing this, and I don't think they realize what is going on with their money behind the scenes.

Science & Technology:

Story #14: The 5G Rollout Continues.

One of the book reviews that we did this year was Arthur Firstenberg's *The Invisible Rainbow*. I don't know if you've read it. It's a very detailed look at what has happened with the rollout of electricity and EMF radiation. It's quite astonishing.

Firstenberg believes that 5G will kill many people. I have no idea what the truth is.

Farrell: I'll tell you what my fears are. I've been interested for quite a while in all these sudden animal deaths.

Fitts: You had a good piece on *Solari* earlier on it.

Farrell: Right, I blogged about it very recently; flights of birds that drop dead from the sky. It started with the story of a flight of geese in Idaho that someone noticed when they were driving down a highway; the geese just fell out of the sky. The story that they put out was, "This was sudden onset of bird flu."

Okay. So, they all contracted the flu at the same time?

Fitts: And dropped dead out of the sky at exactly the same time.

Farrell: We had a herd of elephants recently in Africa just die where they stood. We've seen that with reindeer and so on all over the world. We've seen birds dropping dead in the Netherlands during their 5G tests. I don't know if you remember that story.

Fitts: I do remember that story.

Farrell: I think that he (a social media post) is right that 5G may be as much about a mechanism to be able to kill uncooperative people or regions of people as much as it is about the Internet of Things and faster speed and bandwidth and all they are promoting.

Fitts: 5G was developed by the Israelis and the US as a crowd control.

Farrell: The problem is that the people promoting it are promoting something so anti-life. If you thought that GMOs and their effect on pollinator insects was bad, that is part of the food chain that we are talking about. If you thought that was bad, just wait until this is rolled out. You will be interfering with the environment in such a way that these technocrats have no idea what the long-term environmental and human and animal health impacts are going to be. They have no idea.

Fitts: In late July, I drove to Switzerland and Germany and then back again at the end of August. Every time I have road tripped in Europe during the last five years, whoever I'm with looks at the grill of the car and says, "It's remarkable. There are almost no insects."

Ten years ago, the whole front of the car would be nothing but insects and it was a real mess. Now it's a tiny percentage of what it used to be.

Farrell: I've commented on that recently in one of my blogs. When I was a boy, we would take trips at night in the car. We would drive up to the lake or whatever, and the windshield would be spattered with insects diving into the headlights. It's nothing like that anymore.

We would have to stop at a gas station maybe every three hours just to clean the windshield. You don't anymore; they are gone.

And bees-you would see bees everywhere. I lived in a place where there are many little wildflowers. On any given day, when I take the dog to go outside, I might see one or two bees. It's unbelievable the devastation these people have caused for absolutely no good reason other than their own miserable profit, and they are causing great harm to the world.

Fitts: Here is what I don't understand, and I've never understood this: If you look at the number of people who are going along, it's unbelievable.

Farrell: I think that part of it is that most people really don't notice or don't understand the significance if they do notice. The idea that we are getting rid of whole swaths of the insect kingdom, – pollinators, dragonflies, butterflies, bees, 'the whole nine yards' – that alone should tell people that there is something awfully, awfully wrong.

I think that part of it is education. You have 'dumbed people down' with these 'damn' standardized tests so they are taught they know something if they regurgitate a preselected answer.

I go back to what I said about these standardized tests all along. You get a standardized test, and it will ask a question like, "Who killed John F. Kennedy? A, B, C, or D." One of the answers will be Lee Harvey Oswald. Never will you see, "A. Conspiracy of Cubans, bankers, Texas oilmen." You will never see that answer.

In other words, you are learning to regurgitate the narrative that they want you to absorb. You are exercising no critical faculty whatsoever.

Fitts: When I was in Washington and the process of private prisons came up of rounding up innocent men and women and 'stuffing' them into private prisons and making money on the stock and the real estate, my whole work said that government money was being run in a negative return on investment. When you have a negative return on investment system, it has to go into a spiral down; it's a liquidating model. It's only a matter of time.

What I kept saying to everybody was, “Look, if we are going to build and operate slave labor camps within the United States, and we are going to have a negative return on investment system that does it where we pay \$154,000 per year for everybody we put in prison, and we put more people in prison than all the tyrannical dictators around the world, this system, by its nature, mathematically is going to come and kill everybody.”

It’s a harvest model; after it finishes killing poor black people, it will come and kill you.

Farrell: I was about to mention private prisons. And let’s remember what family gave us that!

Fitts: Joe Biden led the legislation on that.

Farrell: Yes, Biden and Clinton, but the idea was ‘cooking’ under Bush-Quayle.

Fitts: Absolutely.

Farrell: I have no use for that family, but, yes, it was the blacks who were hit first and hardest, and then they expanded the operation to lower class white people and Hispanics and so on.

Fitts: I kept saying to everybody, “Look. You can’t go along with this.”

What was amazing to me is that it was almost as though everyone I knew was in a trance.

Farrell: They all thought it was capitalism. I remember the discussions. They all thought it was a great idea to expand capitalism and privatization.

Fitts: The *Wall Street Journal* had a story about how the hot new kitchen design on Park Avenue was prison hardware and prison cabinets and prison kitchens. Then *GQ* had a fashion layout of lawyers in their new fall suits in a prison with their clients. Everything was about making prisons fun and fashionable. It was unbelievable.

I have a hard time with it. I go back to the entrainment. I can't believe that all that could happen in America without some kind of entrainment.

Farrell: I totally agree. They are pushing it in every way they can through the hard technologies of mind manipulation, but in my opinion, much more successfully with the soft ones – with the techniques of mind manipulation.

Fitts: That's why I have to stop you here. Everybody should read your book, *Microcosm and Medium*. You go through all the layers. You go through education, through propaganda, through culture, and through mind control and the technologies. It's the only book that I know that is a full-spectrum look at all of it in a very integrative way.

Farrell: I actually start off by looking at art. What people have to understand is that art is a form of mind manipulation. It could be good, and it could be bad; it depends on the art.

Jackson Pollock is one kind of art, and it's a very bad art, and Nicolas Poussin is another kind of art, and it is a good art. They called him the philosopher painter. He really was. You could see it in studying his paintings. He draws you in, and he wants you to think. You're not just a passive vessel looking at a pretty picture. It's something very different.

Fitts: I think I called you when this happened. I was riding down 5th Avenue in a cab. We passed Rockefeller Center, where there was a sculpture. It was a cello in a teal-green modern 'thing', and it was huge, and it was the ugliest thing I'd ever seen. It was so ugly that it was funny. I couldn't stop laughing; I was laughing so hard that I was crying. The cab driver couldn't figure out what had happened.

Farrell: Look at what 'Mr. Globaloney' did after World War II with architecture associated with one particular thing. Do you know what it is?

Fitts: No.

Farrell: Airports.

They have uglified the entire world with ugly airports, with ugly architecture that is the same everywhere you go. Everywhere, and it's amazing that nobody sees this.

They are reinforcing the idea that life is ugly, you are a machine, you are ugly, and everything is ugly.

Fitts: Until you get inside a shopping mall.

Farrell: Right, until you get inside a shopping mall and the duty-free shops, of course. Yes, even there you are going to encounter ugliness.

While we are at ugliness, did you see Gucci's latest fashion show?

Fitts: No.

Farrell: Oh my word! Look at it; look at the male models for Gucci. They are all dressed as women.

Fitts: What?

Farrell: There is another art form – fashion – that is now being used to drive a political agenda. I'm tired of being preached at; they are preaching everywhere you turn now. Everywhere.

Fitts: It says, "Meet a Changemaker behind the Gucci Changemakers Initiative."

Farrell: I don't know if that is the title of the article, but I saw pictures that somebody had taken of 'male models' (and I'm using the term loosely here) walking down the runway with purses and blouses, and who knows what they did to the women because they didn't show any of them.

I was thinking, "My God, people! Wake up!" Whatever the art form is, be it music, painting, or fashion, they are driving this agenda just 'hell-bent for leather'. They are paraded right before everybody's eyes.

Fitts: I'm looking at the spring/summer 2020 fashion show.

Farrell: That may be it; I don't remember. We take these obvious things like airports or fashion shows for granted, and we don't realize that one of the most profound ways of mind manipulation is through the arts.

Fitts: Everything looks really uncomfortable.

Farrell: And look at the expressions on the models! They don't look like they are comfortable; they look as though they are absolutely miserable.

Fitts: They do; they look miserable.

Farrell: Can you blame them? Isn't it unreal?

Fitts: They look like somebody said to them, "If you don't wear this and walk down this runway, we will kill your kid." That is what they look like.

Farrell: That is what they look like. So, the next time that you see an ugly building going up in your city, stop and think about who is behind it and why.

This is the Gucci version of the Obama Presidential Library – if you've ever seen pictures of that monstrosity.

Fitts: It's interesting. Normally, when you are at a Gucci-type fashion show, people look happy to be there and it's fun, and they are being seen and they are seeing. Everybody here looks like they've been threatened with death, and the crowd looks like they are in a state of shock.

Farrell: Yes, this is *The Devil Wears Prada* on steroids, if you've ever seen that movie.

Fitts: I did.

Farrell: At least Meryl Streep had the fashion sense to design clothes for women that looked nice and clothes for men that looked nice. But this – no!

Go to art museums, but don't go to the ones like the L.A. County Museum of Modern Art where they spent \$12 million on a rock! Go see a Jan van Eyck exhibition or a Rembrandt exhibition, but not this 'stuff'.

Fitts: Here is what is interesting: Going back to **Story #14, 'The 5G Rollout Continues,'** I grew up in the city and I lived in New York for 11 years, and I love the cities. They were so rich with great things. There was always something happening, and there were so many smart people and vitality.

EMF radiation has made the cities unbearable to me now. It's so sad. I think it's part of this pouring out of cities.

Farrell: With the EMF and the debauched, barbaric, ugly culture that is being promoted, I think that you are seeing almost an unconscious human reaction to it, and they are just getting out.

Fitts: It is making the country look more interesting. We're all Americans, suddenly looking interesting.

Story #15: The Biotech Industry Declares War on Sovereignty.

We are seeing pharmaceutical and biotech industries that feel free to simply violate all the Geneva codes and all the Nuremberg codes and principles with impunity. It's back to this trance. It's the same kind of trance I saw build the housing bubble. "Anything goes. It's okay. It's all good."

Farrell: Cathy O'Brian wrote a book years ago called *The TRANCE Formation of America*. I think you told me about that book.

It's a very interesting book to read – even if she is making it all up, which I don't think she did. But even if she did, she is really spot-on in her observations.

One of the things that I think is happening, and we've said this before, is that the people who are driving this are under their own trance. They've put themselves into their own trance so they can't think of any other way to go than the way they're going, and they hate anything out there by dint of being in that trance. They hate anything out there that challenges the whole data set that they

have constructed for themselves. That is why they hate traditional art, literature, diction – all of it. They hate it; it's a trance of hatred.

Fitts: Part of it is that we have many laws that say, “If I do something that harms your physical body, I can be criminally liable,” but we are taking the position that anything that is invisible, like your electromagnetic body, I can destroy and it's okay.

There is no standard of law to protect our electromagnetic body or our intelligence. So, I'm free to use entrainment technology on you, and it's okay.

Farrell: In the blog that I wrote earlier discusses the old episode of the Soviet irradiation of the American embassy from the 1950's to the 1970's. I found a study that I blogged about, and it was based on the American government studies of what the Soviets were doing. In the article, it points out something that I thought was just a ‘jaw-dropper’. They pointed out that the Soviet Union had a standard regulation for the standard of ambient radiation that was one-thousand times (three orders of magnitude) less than that permitted under regulation in the United States.

You know why I think that the Soviets came up with that standard? Because all their experiments in bioelectricity and electromagnetic templates of diseases and of health showed them that low intensity radiation worked much better than high intensity radiation.

In other words, America once again is going in there with a big ‘blunderbuss’ and spraying pellets all over and trying to accomplish all this mind control technology with brute force, and the Soviets are doing it with very subtle amounts. That spoke volumes to me. I think their regulations were coming out of the secret experiments that they were doing at the time, and I was ‘blown away’ by that.

If you have a situation where you have a group of people saying, “It's okay for us to do this to your invisible body, and we are going to irradiate you to the tune of several gauss. It's no wonder that we have pigeons tearing down wires from 5G poles and so on. You are creating an environment that life has to react to it in order to survive.

Fitts: You and I have talked about the great poisoning. We know that 54% of US children have a chronic disease. The internist we had on *The Solari Report* said, “No, it’s really 70% because you have many children who can’t afford to be properly tested.” Now Bobby Kennedy is saying that IQ points have dropped 7 points.

We are really talking about at this point is depopulation.

Farrell: Right, we are. The thing that bothers me is that that depopulation agenda looks as though they have expanded it from humans to any living thing, period. That’s what disturbs me about all of this.

Fitts: And why?

Farrell: That is the question that I have, too: Why? What out there is so inhuman and anti-life that is driving this ‘degenda’? I don’t think that ‘Mr. Globaloney’ himself even knows. Maybe a few do, but I don’t think that by and large, ‘Mr. Globaloney’ knows himself. It’s a complete mystery to me.

Here is the problem: If you are going to depopulate the planet, that is a proposition that you have to manage extraordinarily carefully. Too little or too much and you’ve destroyed yourselves.

Now turn that into the whole living kingdom. Too little or too much will ultimately destroy everything. So, I have to wonder exactly who or what is behind this. What we are looking at is frightening, and it’s not for all of the publicly-sited reasons (climate change and the environmental catastrophe) that people are talking about. It has to deal with all these people trying to manage this financial reset, and I definitely think that you are right; depopulation is a part of that agenda of the reset.

Fitts: Part of what they are putting together with the new system – and you and I have talked plenty about this – is they are putting together a system that can integrate human labor and robotic labor in the same taxation and the same control. The 5G can interact with the robots just like it can interact with the humans if they have brain-machine interface or chips or whatever.

You are also setting up something where the humans can teach the robots through the cloud. So, I think that part of this is that humans have a whole series of unique skills and talents that they want to access, and they want to access it without asking permission.

Part of it is integration, but the other thing is that they don't want and need everybody. My question when I hear the things about the animals dropping dead is: Are they looking to selectively prune the population?

If you look at what went on in the nursing homes, it appeared like a prototype for selective pruning. I've heard too many stories from people dealing with nursing home populations. They say, "Everybody gets the flu shot," and in three weeks, 50% of the floor is dead.

In any system, ultimately the question is: Who enforces? If you don't enforce through culture, you have to enforce through force. If our culture is unable to handle sophisticated or powerful technology, then the people who run things will want tight, central control so they can control through force.

I look at the biotech industry, and I think, "Here is a group of people who cannot manage themselves, and they cannot manage the technology responsibly. They don't have the power to do it."

Farrell: Here is a little upcoming blog: One of my website members sent me an article about something called 'DREADDS', Designer Receptors Exclusively Activated by Designer Drugs. They are designed specifically to allow designer drugs to latch onto those receptors. They are talking about the blood-brain barrier; they are talking about neurophysiology.

You put that idea with Dr. Lieber at Harvard, who was arrested, and his expertise in nanotechnology. You put that idea with 'Bael' Gates and his vaccine nanotechnology under the skin 'Mark of the Beast' thing that he wants to implement, and you have a real control mechanism on your hands, which is your force.

I'm sorry, but I don't want to live in a world like that because it will turn everybody into zombified slaves and/or monsters all at the same time, and we

will lose our humanity. And there will be no human culture until that falls apart Isaac Asimov (Professor of biochemistry at B.U.)-style from the technocrats forgetting how to do things.

Fitts: It's slave trade.

Farrell: It is slavery.

Fitts: Are you ready for Space?

Farrell: Yes.

Fitts: Space: Story #16: Is the Moon an Opportunity Zone?

Farrell: That is the best way of putting it! I'm very serious. I didn't blog about this story, but I wanted to. I didn't have enough space for everything else.

NASA has let contracts, saying they are willing to pay people to bring back moon rocks. Did you see that one? There is your mining.

Fitts: It's clear; if you do due diligence in the mining industry, what you discover and what you hear from all of them is that they are having to dig deeper and deal with more political risk to get less material. The law of diminishing returns is kicking in.

If you look at the planet, we have only burrowed down a small percentage of the way. So, it's hard for me to believe – since most of the planet is empty – that there isn't something if you go down deeper.

But there seems to be compelling economics, they think, to go up. The question is: What is that about?

Farrell: I don't think that it is all e-economics. Let me go back to what I said at the 2015 Secret Space Conference. If you are the Post-World War II national security state and are confronted with this UFO phenomena, one of the things that you are going to do is go back and look at ancient texts and try to look at those texts through modern geopolitical and scientific eyes.

One thing that you are going to find out when you go back to those texts is that someone is living down there (subsurface), and you may not want to disturb them because they're not a nice group of people.

You think of all the lore that has been built up in the centuries from Europe to Indonesia. Go anywhere in the world, and they have some version of people living down there – Iceland, Australia. Everybody has some sort of mythology.

I am a 'kook'. I readily admit that I put more stock in those stories than most people do. They are trying to tell us something. So, I think there may be pressing reasons – that they may know things or have figured out things that would be better to go up there (space) and take that risk than go down there and take the other risk.

Fitts: It's interesting, and we talked about this in *Part I*. I think the most interesting thing right now, and one of our attorneys is writing a long update on this, is the legal issues in space. I think the fact that we are aggressively moving out into space and we have no legal or governance framework is fascinating.

I think that one of the pushes for more centralization in the management of the currency is, if you are going to become a multi-planetary civilization, you need a one-stop shop to represent Earth. So, there is a real mess if you don't either turn over operational powers to the BIS (Bank for International Settlements) or create some kind of mechanism that can interact for the planet.

The step to become a multi-planetary civilization is really forcing this issue; it is going to force it one way or another.

Farrell: It is going to force it, and there is something else that is very intriguing about that idea. If you look at Isaac Asimov's *Foundation* series, or a television series like *Babylon 5*, or Robert Heinlein's science fiction work, there is one thing that they all have in common, and I find this very interesting. They all have the idea of a central global earth-based government that has gone out there and expanded and expanded and expanded. But at some point, it runs into two problems. The system begins to break down because the bottle isn't big enough to sustain the system. (I'm going way back to *Babylon's Banksters* and Edward Dewey and the Foundation for the Study of Cycles.

The other thing that happens is, inevitably, you have a type of colonialism. Somewhere along the line, some colony has had enough of the central government, and they break away or revolt or ‘gum up’ the works, and it all falls apart. This happens over and over in science fiction. It’s like they’ve seen the future, and Asimov saw it the best of all of them. They have seen the future, and they know that this is an innate ability.

I think the problem for them is: How do they engineer a structure of government that can anticipate that and respond to it and remain intact? I think that is their big political problem that they are wrestling with. They are in the same dilemma as the founding fathers of this country. “We are independent. Now what?”

Fitts: There has to be a dynamic relationship and a positive relationship between the field dynamics and the legal and financial mechanisms. So when I did the prototyping in the 1990’s, it was to build a financial model where the living equity and the financial equity had a win-win relationship.

Farrell: Another way to put that problem is we are back to the question of culture. To have a sustainable government, you have to have, more or less, a common shared cultural vision. The problem that ‘Mr. Globaloney’ has is dealing with at least six or seven different civilization types on this planet.

Fitts: That’s not a problem if you can use markets and don’t have to have secrecy.

Farrell: That is their problem. They have created this culture, and it looks like they are trying to put into place is more of the same. That will be their demise.

In other words, I don’t see any player on the global stage thinking about the issues of planetary government in an adequate fashion because they are trying to put into play something that is inhuman and will not be able to absorb these civilization types; they are trying to get rid of them.

Fitts: What I don’t understand is why they think it will work.

Farrell: That is my problem, too. You’re not going to create a sustainable

interplanetary civilization without some sort of cultural basis. It looks like they've decided – if they've even done that analysis, and I question whether they have the smarts to do it – to look at all these civilization types on this planet. I think they have looked at them superficially and said, “We don't want any of them; we are going the transhumanist route in order to make this work.”

I just don't think that it will.

I don't see Oriental cultures successfully going along with that plan. You have a Vedic culture in India and a Shinto culture in Japan and Confucian in China, and you have Europe, which is largely a Christian culture – supposedly.

Fitts: All of these cultures are human cultures.

Farrell: Right, all of these cultures are human.

Oddly enough, you look at Asimov, and you see this interplanetary civilization, which nowhere has any inkling of any sort of transcendent value or principle present in that culture. That makes sense because Asimov was that kind of person, but you look at other science fiction manifestations of the same phenomenon where people are trying to think this question through in the form of fiction, and you find much the same thing.

The only one who departs from that norm, as far as I can tell, is the old television science fiction series *Babylon 5*, where you have a very different vision of the future, –this is a key point for people to bear in mind – and it is largely culturally federative. It's somewhat a federal cultural system.

Fitts: It's interesting because I remember the training that I received, the goal of it was to make you very dispassionate. So, if you were a person who had two choices and both involved people dying, you could make a dispassionate decision without being deeply unhappy.

In other words, you could handle decisions in a centralized system where there is, oftentimes, no good option. So, you were trained to be without empathy. That is the only way that I can describe it. Everybody was slightly autistic; you can put it that way, too.

The problem is, and I've told everybody that the first ceremony that I ever went through was a ceremony called 'Turn your Heart to Stone'. It was basically designed to make you very loyal to the hierarchy as opposed to feeling grief and saying, "No, I can't do this."

So, it's to get your emotions in check and keep you focused on who is the boss.

I don't know how to explain this, but that training makes you stupid because you can't feel. It took me a long time to learn how to do this, but I could go into a community and map out all the money, but then I could feel the field. I could feel how people felt about this and that. I could feel the culture and I could feel the family affection and love; I could feel it.

What is interesting is if you look at my big successes on Wall Street, they all came because I could feel. Literally, when I was in Washington, people would say, "Don't let her in the room because if she is in the room she will feel it, and she will know what we are up to."

Farrell: You are raising a point there with that whole overview I have repeatedly cautioned my own website members against. It is a very, very important point that you are raising. What has happened in the West since Descartes (French philosopher), is the reduction of human reason to MERE ratiocination. But to the ancients, (think of Plato or Aristotle) or even the Stoics (school of Hellenistic philosophy), human reason was not simply only the ratiocinating part of the mind; it was also the passions or what we would call the emotions, but I prefer the term 'passion'.

Passion is something that human beings share by nature. Emotions are something unique to an individual. So, we have to get back to this idea that reason means more than bullion algebraic calculus of logic. It means more than that; it means that creative spark. It means the discipline to sit down and reflect intelligently with the mind on the emotional content that is being projected or absorbed or whatever. That is crucial.

Fitts: I'll tell you another thing that I've found as an investment advisor, and I've talked about this before: I would often be hired by couples who were having very profoundly serious disagreements about how to manage their

resources. You would have one person who was very sophisticated financially – typically the man – and another person who was very plugged into the children and what was happening with them and the family.

I discovered that they had been trained in different languages. My job was simply to explain to each one what the other was saying in their language. One of the things that I was able to demonstrate to them – and I learned by this process – is that you can trick a man and you can trick a woman, but it is almost impossible to trick them both if they would just work together. Getting them to work together was simply a matter of helping them learn each other's language.

My job was to help them learn each other's language and then get out of the way. My job was also to teach them that the system was trying to control them by turning them against each other. So if I could help them see those two things, they were off and running, and almost invincible.

But you generally had one who understood living equity and one who understood financial equity, and they needed to understand both of those together. There is no way that you are going to do that without empathy.

Farrell: Let's get down to 'brass tacks': There is no way to do that if you are following a philosophy of constant war between the sexes, and having this ludicrous idea that you can change your sex by changing the way you refer to it in language, or the way you feel on a particular day. "Oh, I woke up today, and I feel like a woman."

What is that? That is not the same thing as genuine transgenderism; it's playing around.

They have so engineered things where it is a crime to be genuinely feminine or genuinely masculine, and that is a deep problem because those things influence the way we think. If we are in constant opposition to each other, there is no thinking going on.

Fitts: For the majority of the population, that is the source of electricity that creates so many different things that I can't even begin to describe. But I will give you an example. I managed a bar in Philadelphia when I was in college.

When I was appointed bar manager, the bartenders went on strike because they didn't want to be managed by a woman.

So one thing led to another, and most of them ended up staying. I began a practice. We had to have two bartenders on a night, and I would always put a woman on with a man. I kept track of the records, and I discovered that with two male bartenders, the house made x , and they made 10% of x . With two women, the house made $1.5x$, and the bartenders made 10% of that. If I had a man and a woman, the house would make $2x$, and the bartenders would make 10% of that. So, if you were a man and I put you on with another man, your tips were 50% lower than if I put you on with a woman.

It took two months until one night all the women were unavailable. Somebody had gotten sick, and I had to put a man on with another man. The first man was the strike leader. When he discovered that I put him on with another man, hence cutting his tips in half, he came screaming at me, yelling at the 'top of his lungs'. He was furious.

I said, "Don't you see the irony in this. You're the one who didn't want me to be the bar manager because I was going to put women on the bar when you didn't want women on the bar, but that quickly turned around when you saw the money".

When I started my investment bank in Washington, I did the same numbers for transactions. I discovered that it was the inverse of the bar. With the women, the house made x and the client made $10x$; two men, the house made $1.5x$ and the client made $15x$; a man and a woman, it was double.

So in both cases, the combined male-female was double. In the transactions, the men were more efficient than the women, and in the relationships in a bar, the women were more efficient than men. But still, the question always was: Why? Why was that the case?

I will tell you that when you have a male and a female, there is an electricity that is not present with just one sex, and I can't explain it. You also have much greater access to knowledge.

When I was on Wall Street, I would get so much intelligence from going to the ladies' room. The secretaries would all collect what was happening and then tell me in the ladies' room, but the men didn't have access to that. Male associates couldn't talk to everybody's secretary and find out what was really going on.

There are knowledge flows on sexual networks.

Farrell: Oh, absolutely there are. I'm adamant about this; I do think that men and women think differently by nature.

Fitts: They totally do. Have you seen that Mel Gibson movie where he says, "Yeah, they have 5% more water"?

All I can say, and this goes back to what you were saying about *Microcosm and Medium*, is that we have evolved this leadership, which is drowning in their own mind control systems, and they are drowning in the culture they created to manage in the world. That culture is not necessarily what they need right now.

Farrell: I would say that that culture is the exact opposite of what they need.

Fitts: I've been in a position where I've been responsible for hundreds of billions of dollars, and in Washington, people would come in and they couldn't handle the power. They didn't necessarily have the training to handle the power, but they couldn't spiritually/psychologically/emotionally handle the power.

When you are responsible for managing huge amounts of power, you need a forceful culture, and you need to be part of something that can handle that power. It's not easy, and we don't have that.

Farrell: We don't. By dint of the founding of this country, in a certain sense, the country has defined itself almost in opposition to its European roots from the 'get-go'. I think that is a fundamental problem.

It shows up in a very weird way. One of my website members pointed this out to me: It's only Americans who are obsessed about their ethnic roots. "I'm an Italian-American," or, "I'm a German-American," or, "I'm a Franco-American," or whatever. In Europe, they don't. By dint of the way Europe is, you are a

Dutch or French or Austrian or whatever.

When we cut the ties with England, we did not estimate the importance of maintaining a cultural tether to what created this country. So in a certain sense, we have been defining ourselves in constant opposition to any tradition.

Fitts: Whatever is existing, we are trying to destroy it.

Farrell: I mentioned this in the talk in Louisville at that crowdfund gathering: Americans tend by nature of the culture, not to have a hierarchical vision of merit and worthiness or beauty or whatever; we tend to have a levelling vision of things. One of the cultural consequences of that has been, as a basis of that, we tend to think, “Well, Jackson Pollock is as good as Rembrandt.” I’m sorry, no, he’s not. It took talent to do what Rembrandt did. It took absolutely no talent whatsoever to do what Pollock did and call it ‘art’. It took a lot of ‘chutzpah’, but not necessarily talent.

We are confronted with this problem, and that is a cultural problem that I think has been present in the country since its inception, and it is one of the problems that I think led to the civil war. When you look at the North and the South, the thing that distinguished the South for all of its faults was that it tried to maintain that cultural tether to the idea of hierarchy, honor, and things like that. When you look at the North, you had a culture that was deliberately trying to sever those ties, and create the hypermaterial world. You had two different cultures with two very, very different visions of the world trying to coexist. Ultimately, it broke down.

We are looking at that system again.

Fitts: One of the things that you’ve pointed out a great deal is that Americans have literally created a music and a culture that can’t handle complexity.

Farrell: Exactly.

Fitts: Now that we are moving away from markets, so we don’t have pricing information, and you have hypermaterialism.

So, a hypermaterialist with no information who can't handle complexity but is trying to run an imperial empire – that is a very bad combination.

Farrell: Really bad! We are getting to the point and are fast approaching the Emperor Diocletian, who ruined the Western Roman Empire by doing what? Locking everybody down; Feudalism.

Fitts: There was a group of farmers in North Dakota, and one of them had a heart attack right during harvest. I think a huge number of farmers came out to harvest his crop for him. I sent something out that said, “That is the America that I love.”

Farrell: Same here.

Fitts: There are so many things about America that we all love, and it's still there.

If you saw in South Dakota when the Governor didn't lock them down, you had all the local businessmen do an impromptu parade to honor her for that. Somebody took a video. She didn't realize that it was happening, and she walked out with her daughter and saw it. She was so touched, it was amazing.

That is the kind of community that you see in a place like Hickory Valley where I live, and you just love it.

Farrell: I remember learning this in school that part of the American tradition and culture was when a family moved to their homestead and wanted to put up a barn, everybody got together and had a barn-building party and brought food, and it's fun. Everybody helps build a barn, and the barn is built in a day. Then you eat. But we don't do that anymore; we rely on big charities or whatever to do that sort of thing. It's beyond most Americans' comprehension now that, “Hey, somebody is moving into the area and bought the vacant lot and they want to build a house. Let's get together and build a house.”

Fitts: Part of moving forward is turning off the TV, turning off all this ‘stuff’, and going out and finding a barn to build.

Farrell: Exactly. It's there in our tradition, and there is no reason it can't be revived. We don't need to rely on Federal handouts to do this.

Fitts: One of the things that I would add is there was a wonderful institute in Pennsylvania called the Institute for Civic Values. It's gone now, but they would take the US Constitution and have a neighborhood Constitutional Convention where you read the Constitution together and talked about how you would implement that in our community. It was somewhat applying the constitutional principles to our neighborhood.

Farrell: Imagine this: Would we be in the political mess that we're in if states had the equivalent of a Federal electoral college at a state level?

Fitts: Right, and they also need their own central bank.

Are you ready for **Food & Health**?

Farrell: I'm ready.

Fitts: Food & Health:

Story #17: The Great Poisoning Continues Unabated.

We've talked about this plenty. If you look at the health problems in this country, much of it relates to skyrocketing toxicity. Once you understand that, then you can do something about it.

Farrell: I would go even further in this food and health topic and say that part of it is emotional toxicity. I see it constantly, and I'm sure that you see it constantly, too, where people's behavior via email or social media or whatever, is far below what those very same people probably are like in actual personal face-to-face interaction. We have gotten so far away from courtesy and sensitivity, and now the media is driving all sorts of discourtesy at 'breakneck' speed.

I am old-fashioned here, but I think that courtesy is part of that field that leads to good health.. When I say 'old-fashioned', I mean old-fashioned.

Fitts: When I was in the middle of the litigation and things were getting really bad, I looked in the mirror one day and said, “My plan isn’t working,” because I could see me turning very sick. I said, “You need a new plan.”

So, I tried to identify everybody who something similar had happened to, and who succeeded and who failed and why. I discovered that the people who didn’t make it, they didn’t make it because they were poisoned by their own anger.

That is going to be true in this situation for everybody. If you let your anger poison you, it will kill you. It’s very, very dangerous.

Farrell: The stress alone from carrying it around will. That stress goes back to the food situation. Our diet is so overladen with toxins, poisons, GMOs, and so on, that I think to a certain extent, – and call me a ‘nut’ here – that alone is driving a great deal of the breakdown of common, ordinary courtesy and creating this anger. I think there is a nutritional basis for it. I really, really do.

I grew up with a mother who was a stay-at-home mother who cooked meals every day. The big one was supper when dad came home and everybody was around the super table. We had the old-fashioned balanced meal – vegetables, fruits, everything. We don’t even do that anymore; our lives are so pressed for time that we don’t even cook.

I try to cook for myself because it somehow frees you from all of that stress. Most people go out and buy items at the grocery store that is pre-prepared. You are subject to someone else’s taste buds.

We have to slow down. We have to get our diets balanced again, and we have to start being courteous. It’s that simple.

Fitts: I think that much of this comes down to trying to organize your work and your life so that you are ruthless about limiting your life and the people and the institutions you do business with to people of integrity. If you let one bad dog in, one bad dog can make a mess and cause a lot of pain. So, you have to be ruthless about your associations and the quality of your associations..

Part of that is you need people around you who are happy. I don’t know any

way to be happy in this environment. The reason I was able to do the litigation was that I went to a great church with a great bible institute, and I trained in spiritual warfare. It saved my life.

It's hard to find a church like that, and it's hard to find those kinds of courses. But this is spiritual warfare, and the only way that I know to be happy and in a state of joy in the middle of this kind of stress is with the right kind of devotion and faith.

Farrell: I think there is something else to it, too. I'm not saying that's not true; I think that it is absolutely true. But I think there is something else to it, too. Occasionally, I get these angry emails; they are over the top with 'the tantrum'. The emails are, "Why are you always laughing when you are talking about such serious stuff?"

Fitts: I get plenty of criticism about that, too.

Farrell: I'm thinking, "What else is there to do but laugh at all this insanity?" It's like a very badly-written B-movie or a very badly-written attempt to write a Mozart opera where everybody is in disguise and hiding their secrets and 'singing their lungs' out with their temper tantrums. What else can you do but laugh?

I hate to say this, but people are such sourpusses. Have you ever seen a whole country where everybody is angry and unhappy and discourteous?

Just laugh at it; these people are comical, they are just comical. Think Nancy Pelosi – there is your comedy. She can't talk anymore without having to fix her dentures.

Fitts: The one thing that I would say is that *The Solari Report* subscribers are very nice people, so I am lucky that way.

When I do a public interview, the most shocking thing that you can do is read the comments. I feel like buying everybody a copy of Emily Post and mailing them etiquette. The way that I was raised makes this behavior appalling; it's such a waste of human energy. It's like throwing away money.

Farrell: If my mother were alive and read some of the comments that I get after my 'News & Views' and things like that, she would have absolutely slapped somebody for using some of the language that they use. "We don't talk like that."

Yet in this country now, to make your point you have to drop 'F-bombs' everywhere or use scatological references. People, get a vocabulary!

Fitts: I was trained on Wall Street, and every once in a while I'll use an 'F-bomb'.

Farrell: There are times where that sort of thing is appropriate, but what I'm saying is that by constantly dropping that kind of language in order to emphasize your point, you are devaluing your point.

Get a vocabulary! It's much better to say that you can't handle recondite polysyllabilifications than it is to say, "You're just stupid."

"What? Huh?"

"Look it up."

Fitts: Story #18: Doctors and Scientists Push Back Successfully on Covid-19.

Farrell: I doff my hat to the doctors doing so.

Fitts: In the 2nd *Quarter Wrap Up* our first section is '**Pandemic Heroes**', and we started with the doctors and then we went to the scientists. There is a group of doctors who have been so courageous and fearless and intelligent and hard-working, and there is one after another. They broke through the 'sound barrier'.

They are not afraid, and are not going to back down; they are healers. They became doctors because they wanted to heal. That is where they get their energy, and that is what they are about. They're not going to break the Hippocratic Oath for any government regulation.

There have been many great lines from many great doctors, but Stella Immanuel from Houston grew up and was trained in Africa. Everybody there uses hydroxychloroquine or other things for malaria, so she is very familiar with it and understood that if you caught this early (COVID 19), there was no disease.

So many people tried to get her to back down, and a journalist hitman from one of the Houston TV shows showed up to interview her. I was watching the interview, and he was trying to make her scared. He was trying to scare her and get her to back into the corner. He said, “If you keep persisting in this, people could have you investigated and you could lose your license.”

She’s also a pastor, and she knows that in all of Africa, nobody is getting this because they are all taking hydroxychloroquine. She backed up and said, “Let me ask you something? How many people should I let die so I can keep my license?”

She just ‘whacked’ him, and he shrunk right down, and you could hear them saying, “You’re playing with the big boys now.”

Farrell: Kudos to all of those doctors. There are doctors in Belgium who sent this gigantic, long memorandum to the Belgium government drawing out all the nonsense of their regulations. Kudos to them. Same thing in Germany. There is a doctor in Germany who is saying, “Regarding this so-called ‘science’, since we are listening to Joe Biden telling us to follow the science, why don’t we?”

I have to admire these doctors because the pressure on them to conform to this stupid narrative – this ‘planscamdemic’ – is enormous. Their jobs and licenses literally are on the line.

Fitts: Dr. Gold who led the group that went to Washington was fired. I think she was also from Houston.

Here is the thing: I remember turning to the person who ran the HUD account, and I said, “How many children should die so that we can keep our contract?”

I felt it was so simple and clear. That is a line that you can’t cross. What you do to others can be done to you.

It was very ironic. I won't bore you with the details, but right after the Bush Administration, I had been ordered by the secretary to ensure that someone was legally held responsible for a criminal act. I was asked to 'fix' a case.

After I left, I called the person and said that I was ordered to fix the case. I wouldn't do it, and I said that I was happy to testify if I was so ordered. Everyone thought that I was taking a terrible risk. Needless to say, she was able to get off because I testified.

When the other HUD people saw that I was there and knew that I was going to testify, they backed down. Anyway, it got her off.

When my turn came during the litigation, they tried to falsify evidence. I had an enforcement person from the IG's office testify and give us an affidavit that they tried to get them to 'fix' it. It was exactly in reverse; what I had done came back to me.

When you talk to people who grew up in small communities or on islands, they absolutely know that 'what goes around comes around'. But I think that in many cultures we have forgotten.

Farrell: Oh, yes. We have.

Fitts: The doctors and scientists know. The doctors and scientists who stood up understood that if you practiced fake medicine and fake science, then the things that hold civilization are gone.

It's what Bret Weinstein said, "If you let this kind of toxicity take hold," and he was talking about something else, but it's the same issue. If you let excellence and facts and science and medicine dissolve and turn it political, nothing works.

Farrell: Nothing works, and nothing ever will work. This is a consequence of the hypermaterialistic world view. If that is really the way the world works, then there is no justice or 'karma', to use that term, and they think that nothing they do will come back to 'bite' them. That's not the way the universe is made.

Fitts: For several decades now, the media has been able to invent their reality.

We know the Karl Rove quote – or the quote attributed to Karl Rove – which is, “We’re an empire now, and when we act, we create our own reality.”

Between media and covert operations and false flags, they’ve been able to invent a good deal of reality. But it doesn’t extend into science, and it doesn’t extend into engineering.

You can invent your reality with a bridge, but the bridge will probably fall if there isn’t excellence in engineering.

Farrell: Florida?

Fitts: There you go! So, we are talking about a society where you can’t combine this kind of, “We invent our reality,” with a productive operational society that can go into space.

Farrell: Use Boeing as an example-the MAX version of the airplane that they updated. While this was all done on computers, and they used a few shortcuts, but, yes, all the models said that it worked well. Wrong. They didn’t, and people lost their lives. And Boeing has now lost a massive amount of market share, and it’s going to Airbus.

You can’t have a society running like this.. You have to have a virtuous population. Note that I’m using the word ‘virtue’, not values; you have to have virtue; you have to have integrity; you have to have character; you have to have morality; you have to have basic common decency and courtesy.

Fitts: You also have to have the confidence to handle power because if you can’t, you will lose it.

Story #19: Will Fake Food Go?

Farrell: They will try awfully hard to push it, but I don’t get the feeling that there are many people who want to go to Burger King and have mystery meat. In fact, I used to love to go to Burger King when they actually had real meat. There is not a fast food shop in the world that I would go to anymore; not one.

Fitts: I use McDonald's to go to the bathroom.

Farrell: Precisely. And even in the grocery stores, I buy as much organic as I can, and as much as I can afford to buy. That goes for everything – milk, eggs, butter, and all that is organic.

Fitts: We've been doing a tremendous amount at *The Solari Report* to help people understand what they need to do to build their local food system. For the last three years, I've been constantly saying, "Where are you going to get your fresh food? Where are you going to get fresh food? Where are you going to get your fresh food?" because I know if they can shut down the small farmers, it will be all fake food. That's where they want to go.

Farrell: And who knows what they're putting into it.

Fitts: It's scary. Harry Blazer, when he was running the *Food Series*, did an interview with Dr. Huber from Purdue. He described the nanotechnology and the nanoparticles that they are putting in as mystery ingredients. It's the most frightening interview I've ever heard on *The Solari Report*; it's terrifying.

Farrell: All under the guise on the ingredients label of 'natural flavors'. I made, what I call, 'fettucine lasagna' recently, and I cook for only myself. So when I cook something, I eat it for days and days and days, so it has to be good or else.

I was about to mix some of the sauce, and I had bought this little packet of sauce mix at the grocery store. I looked at it, and it listed all these ingredients that are somewhat standard. Then I came to 'natural flavors', and thought, "Oh, what sorts of culinary sins does that hide?"

I put the packet in the garbage bin, and that was it.

Fitts: One of the reasons I like living where I'm living right now is that I walk a block to the local butcher, and then I walk two blocks to a rather sizeable grocery store with a huge produce section. And it's not that far to get to a farmers' market.

Farrell: Europe has always been better at preserving those things. I'm surprised at the near total absence of farmers' markets now in this country. My mom used to shop at one all the time in Sioux Falls, and I don't even know if it's still there. But where I'm at now, occasionally you will see someone pedaling their watermelons on a street corner. I'm surprised they haven't shut them down, "Oh, your watermelons aren't wearing masks."

If I don't know that it's at least organic – even at a big grocery store chain – I won't buy it. I'm done with that. Even there, you are trusting. That is the problem with the food supply; who trusts it?

Fitts: Exactly.

Story #20: Who's Trying to Control the Global Food Supply?

I think this very much dovetails with weather warfare.

Farrell: Absolutely it does. My fear is that we have watched Africa for decades being plundered. There is no reason that continent, with its resources, particularly its human resources, and all that creativity that has been bottled up for decades, cannot be sufficient and sustaining and prosperous. The countries that have those resources, I'm watching the World Health Organization go in and Gates with his 'damned' vaccines – falsely, so called –ripping the economies of those countries apart.

What I fear is you are going to see weather warfare there on a major scale – droughts, floods, and all of that. I think these animal deaths that I was talking about earlier in Africa may be, to some extent, a prelude. What they are doing is interfering, not only with the human food supply, but interfering with the animal food supply in Africa.

Fitts: Do you think that they are going to use the same kind of tools and techniques? If this is an induced phenomena, do you think they are going to use it on the humans as well?

Farrell: Oh, yes. I think that some of these animal tests are beta tests. .

You are dealing with the age-old eugenics genocide agenda, and that continent has a big target painted on it for that reason.

Fitts: One of the things that I have wondered is with the shutdown of travel, part of it may be to control resources and bring about deflation to offset the monetary inflation, but another possibility is there are far too many planes disappearing and falling out of the sky.

Farrell: That could be.

Fitts: If you have a serious war with China, you get more and more nervous about fielding numerous planes.

Farrell: That, plus I go back to Malaysia Airlines flight 370. That mystery has not been solved. And no theory that I've seen, and no proposed crash site that I have seen is anywhere near a sufficient explanation. I'm still hanging with my 'It just went poof' theory. I think that because there is another player on the scene, and they don't want to talk about it.

Fitts: The danger with that is if you look at reports, whether it's Walter's Airship Mystery or reports of UFOs for the last 2,000 years, there has been plenty of high technology flying around this planet for a long, long time.

Farrell: Odd that you mention UFOs because I've been looking at the UFO videos on YouTube that are posted. I'll spend 15 minutes before I go to bed looking at some of these. Some of the things are what passengers on airliners have captured with their cell phones and put up on YouTube.

I have to tell you that I would not want to be on one of those gigantic Airbus planes, and Airbus is building a three-decker now.

I look at some of those and I'm thinking, "No way would I want to be flying in one of those contraptions if that is in the sky next to me."

I have to wonder if you are right. Maybe there is something going on that they want to keep air travel to a minimum.

Fitts: Absolutely.

That was **Story #20**. Are you ready for **Unanswered Questions**? We have 22.

The 22 Unanswered Questions.

Many of these we've already dived into, so we can do them quickly.

Question #1: How do we keep our minds free of mind control technologies?

Farrell: In my thinking, part of this COVID 'planscamdemic' is to see, and identify those nodes of the population that – for whatever reason – don't seem susceptible to the narrative. They are trying to figure out why certain people are not so susceptible to them; I think that we all are to a degree.

Fitts: The more that we are forced to work on online systems, the harder it is. I have a real problem because I have to spend so much time online.

Farrell: Same here.

Fitts: It's a problem.

Farrell: As you know, I have a computer that is completely offline. That is where I do most of my writing. I only use this computer when I'm blogging and checking through emails.

I used to spend most of my time on this one, and therefore, online. Then I realized there is so much poison coming through that, I 'chopped' it off and limit it as much as I can. So, I think that is the first thing; limit the amount of exposure to the internet propaganda as much as you can.

I am convinced that prayer and having some sort of spiritual tether – whatever it may be – helps. I think part of that involves immersing yourself in good cultural monuments, be it music or literature or whatever. Do something that you generally derive pleasure from that lifts your spirit. If you want to listen to Jethro Tull or the Beach Boys or whatever does it for you, do it.

Fitts: I'll say one thing because I love different kinds of music, but listening to highly complex classical music dramatically improves your mental capacity.

Farrell: I think so, too. In fact, they have done studies to the effect that it does. But that's not everybody's 'bag'. For that matter, listen to good classical jazz – which is complex – or read a good book or something. Ground yourself or tether yourself to something that is real and comes out of real genuine human creativity.

For those who are not agnostic or atheist, I do think there is a spiritual component. One of my regular prayers is to be thankful for the divine protection that I've had in my life. I've had an enormous amount of it. I've worked my guardian angel putting in overtime hours.

I'm genuinely very thankful for it. I'm constantly thankful for it, and I'm constantly requesting that it continue. The old adage of St. Paul is, "We're at warfare with principalities and powers and high places."

Fitts: I also think that the more time you can spend with animals and outdoors, the better.

Farrell: Animals ground you. Shiloh (pet) has been such a blessing. I see this in my friends who do have pets or some relationship to a life that is innocent and tender and loving. I think that helps immensely, and I also think we have to be open to the idea of observing what things are most effective in our lives and then sharing those observations with other people. I think that is crucial.

I think part of the problem with the 'planscamdemic' that has revealed itself is that with all the talk about the classical media going the way of the dodo bird, it has shown they are alive and well because there are still many people who derive their information and their cultural tethering from those polluted sources. That is all the more reason to turn them off.

Fitts: It's very frightening to me because having lived through the financial crisis, and then all the money disappearing from the Federal government, the evidence to suggest that those are not reliable sources of information is overwhelming.

So if you are watching them, you are looking for the story that says, “Everything is okay. You can trust the system, and you are fine.”

Farrell: I go back to the old movie, *Network* with Howard Beale telling people, “Turn it off! Just turn it off!”

I have to pay for my cable TV even though it’s not hooked up just to have an internet connection. What I would like to see happen is some big class action suit against these companies to force them to provide internet and phone service without the cable TV. Cut their funding off for all of this nonsense, but turn the ‘junk’ off.

I am to the point anymore that there are a few television series that became ‘preachy’ in the last couple of seasons, and saying, “I’m done with that series.”

Fitts: The only time I ever see a TV is when I’m in a motel. Sometimes I will turn it on and flip the channels. Every time I do it, it’s more shocking to me.

Farrell: It’s awful! The level of preachiness and promoting memes and things on television programs is reaching a no-return point that I simply cannot stand. I have found myself trying to find movies on YouTube if I’m in the mood for a movie. I find myself gravitating to independent films with no connection to ‘Hollyweird’ that are actually good and low budget and entertaining, with good acting and a good plot and good characters. All ‘Hollyweird’ can produce is this empty computer-generated effects preachy agenda. So, I don’t even bother with them anymore.

My second thing would be to simply say, “Turn it off. Just turn it off.”

If you want to watch movies, buy a DVD, don’t buy Netflix, don’t buy Hulu, and don’t enable this cloud nonsense anymore. Get the hard copy DVD and watch your movies that way.

Fitts: That was working when I was in the United States. I have to figure out a way to do that in Europe.

Farrell: It’s harder in Europe because they’ve gone more deeply into that. If

that fails, listen to the radio. At least with radio, you are still dealing with a broadcast media that, in many cases, is still local. That means that it is a bit more trustworthy, although not much.

The other thing is to have a network of friends.

Fitts: . Do everything you can to get offline.

Question #2: How important are invisible and secret weaponry and technology to the replacement of global currency systems with crypto control systems?

Farrell: Absolutely essential. In my mind, you cannot have the kind of cryptosystem that they want to move world finance into without having those technologies. You can't because that is their enforcement mechanism.

Fitts: Sofia Smallstorm just published a new newsletter. She talked about the Comanches, and how they had lost their sovereignty as the settlers moved, and the U.S. Cavalry moved west.

One thing that she said was that the problem was not that they couldn't beat the technology they were up against; the problem was that they couldn't even understand the technology they were up against existed. She said that we are in the 'same boat' now.

Farrell: People have to understand that as crazy as it sounds, weather warfare is real.

Fitts: Lyndon Johnson gave a big speech about how it was coming in the 1960's.

Farrell: Yes, he did.

Fitts: He described it all, and he described that you could control the world when you had it.

Farrell: And leave it to Lyndon.

Fitts: It's very interesting, and you can find it on YouTube. It's so compelling.

Then William Cohen in 1997 basically said, "War is now natural disasters, and we have people who can inflict natural disasters."

Farrell: He even went so far as to say, "Not all of it is in the hands of state actors," which was a real revelation, coming from him especially.

Fitts: Right, transnational organized crime can engineer tsunamis.

Farrell: Exactly. That is real, and there is something else that people don't realize: In the post SALT era talks, when Leonid Brezhnev was still the Soviet General Secretary, the Soviet delegation – and this took the Americans by surprise, and Tom Bearden writes about this – also wanted to put bans on weapons much more horrific, in their words, than nuclear weapons. And this was in the 1970's.

People who think that these electromagnetic weapons and so on are only fantasies, I'm sorry, they are very, very real. Think Nazi Bell (German secret weapon) here, and they've had 70 years to perfect that with lots of money.

This is very real, and we need to understand that it is out there and that very few people control it.

Fitts: Question #3: How are invisible technologies being used to engineer civil wars, turn people against each other, and engage in disaster capitalism?

Farrell: I think it's a combination of software and hardware. In other words, I think it's a combination of the soft technologies of mind manipulation. Think of advertising; that is a soft technology of mind manipulation, like it or not. It's coming out of the OSS (Office of Strategic Services) and the people involved in psychological warfare that got jobs on Madison Avenue after the war.

You couple that with the ability, as shown in the patents, to electromagnetically and remotely read someone's brainwave patterns and project conversations into their heads. Then you couple that with the 5G rollout and everything else. You couple all that together, and they are immensely useful in setting populations

against each other. I think that is what we are seeing right now.

You look at the rioters and looters, and these people are in a trance.

Fitts: I see many different layers to the rioting and looting in terms of who is involved. You see the ANTIFA, who are sort-of hallucinating and in a trance. But then you see numerous people who are just going to work and making money. It's a job, and it's not their favorite job. I'm sure that they would rather be making \$1 million a year on Wall Street, but it's a job and it pays. So, they show up and protest.

I went to a Trump rally in Westchester. My cousins dragged me to one in 2016. About a couple of hundred protestors showed up who were clearly all only paid employees.

It's a temp job. Do you know what I mean?

Farrell: It's a temp job, and in a way, it is its own trance.

Fitts: It didn't seem like they were in a trance; they were just doing their job.

Farrell: That is what I mean; it is a mental meme, "It's just a job."

In other words, it was 'just a job' to the guards at Auschwitz.

Fitts: Right, but here is what is so interesting: They are doing reality TV. So for them, it's a job, but for the people who are watching on TV, they think it's real. Then the media can tell the story and pretend that it's real.

Farrell: Right, and it is real in the sense that it is actually happening and businesses are actually being destroyed and looted and burnt and so on. But it isn't real in the sense that what you are watching is theatre and distraction.

Fitts: I remember watching one video of about 500 people all dressed in black at a park apologizing for their white privilege. I looked at it, and said, "They are all paid. It's not real."

Farrell: Since when have Bolsheviks been sincere?

Fitts: Question #4: Where did 'Mr. Global' invest the \$21 trillion, the \$24 trillion, and where is the new 2020 central bank and fiscal stimulus going?

We are talking about trillions here.

Farrell: This will sound totally 'nutty', but I think the central banks go up there (space) if it's not already there.

Here is the bad part: Who are the majority stockholders?

Fitts: It always comes back to who governs and holds the debt.

My fear about the contact tracing and the sex wars getting serious is that somebody has accumulated much of this debt, and at a minimum, they represent transnational organized crime. When you don't have any money that is worth trading, creditors want hard assets.

Farrell: I'm thinking that we may be looking at some interplanetary organized crime here.

The reason is that \$21 trillion here and \$24 trillion there, and let's not forget all the quadrillions of derivatives that nobody seems to be talking about that are still 'sloshing' around in the books.

Somebody wants some hard assets really fast. The creditors may be tapping and knocking on the door.

Fitts: The creditors are absolutely knocking on the door.

Farrell: I get the creepy feeling that not all of them are from here, but who knows?

Fitts: Rabobank announced that the Chinese said they were going to stockpile commodities. If you read carefully between the lines, it means that they are going to convert their US Treasury and dollar positions into hard commodities

because they know inflation is coming; inflation is here, but it's going to grow.

Farrell: My problem with the Chinese saying that is the little story that came out a few weeks ago about the billions of dollars of loans that were floated by Chinese banks based on bullion that turned out to be gold-plated tungsten.

What is it exactly that the Chinese are stockpiling? And do you trust them?

Fitts: No, I don't trust the Chinese.

Farrell: I don't either. I think maybe there is another game afoot, even with that. It may be somewhat of a fake hedge against inflation, but I get the idea that some creditors have come knocking at their door and are not wanting gold-plated tungsten.

Fitts: Question #5: What do you think the command structure for the ANTIFA/BLM armies and related covert operations looks like? How does it relate to reinvestment in real estate and building out of the smart grids?

Farrell: I believe the command structure, given the fact that they show up organized and financed and are crossing state lines, is an intrastate – if not international – organization along the lines of Operation Gladio (NATO-backed paramilitary network). Gladio has come to the USA. Now who is financing it?

I pin the blame on two suspects: Corporate foundations (think Soros here and other foundations), and the Communist Party of China. They have a hefty hand in it, and I wouldn't rule out the Tel Aviv crime network either.

Fitts: Here is the thing: These people can't operate in one day in the United States without the CIA. So ultimately, this is a CIA operation.

Farrell: I think a good section of it is domestic. In other words, I look at it as though this is just the factional war between elements of the deep state that began when Trump came down the escalator. That is exactly what I think we are looking at.

Fitts: But if you look at the layers of this, the CIA and the DOJ have to let it

happen in order for it to actually happen. It's on their turf, and they let it happen. And the NSA is tracking everything.

Farrell: The NSA is tracking everything, and that is the real question: Where are they really falling in? Which faction are they really in?

Fitts: If you look at all the HUD fraud that I cleaned up, I believe it was deeply a CIA operation. All the mortgage and HUD fraud, one way or another, led back to the CIA. So, if you are talking about building out the smart grid in the Fed cities and about big real estate – because remember the Opportunity Zones were created to allow the tech people to rollover their capital gains into real estate where they would then build out the smart grids That was the idea. They are getting their money out at the top and getting their money in at the bottom.

Whoever is funding this, and I guess the money comes from the FASAB 56, which are basically taxpayers' resources paying people to destroy their cities.

Farrell: There is another layer, too. If you look at the operational aspect of ANTIFA and so on, they are getting some very expert insurgency training. That has to be coming from confessions. So, we are either talking about the military or we are talking about veterans.

Fitts: I think we are talking about corporate contractors.

Farrell: Yes, I think we are talking about paramilitary corporate contractors.

Fitts: And they are coming in and providing back-up and air cover in a variety of ways, and they are doing some of the dirty work. People are getting targeted and killed.

Farrell: Just look at Mr. Trump. He has his own private security to this day. In other words, that tells me there is one faction involved that has those paramilitary capabilities. The only reason I think he has survived all of the assassination attempts is precisely because of that. You are looking at the response now by taking this out of a hidden mafia war of those sitting at the tables of power, and they are taking it to the streets because they have been

unsuccessful in combatting the old-fashioned way; targeted hits and so on.

I think that is a layer of this command structure. As to who or what group ultimately would be in charge of it, I wouldn't even say the CIA; I would look again at foundations and things like that.

Fitts: The central bankers are ultimately in charge. So if the CIA is involved, their leading operational aspects or design aspects are for the central bankers. The CIA is a Wall Street creature.

If you are going to bring down the energy price dramatically, the way you make money on that is on the real estate. So, I think there is an enormous effort – and there has been for the last 10-20 years – to pick up massive amounts of land and real estate.

Farrell: Real estate is a Rothschild game, to put it very simply and bluntly. I am not a bit surprised that this began to happen, not uncoincidentally, after Rothschild moved much of their operations to Nevada a few years ago. I'm not a bit surprised.

Fitts: Here is what I want everyone to realize: If you are in Kenosha, Minneapolis or in a city that gets targeted by these riots, what you need to understand is that on the other side of this is a group of real estate developers and private investors. You have to see that game and reverse engineer it for yourself. This is not a gang of kids or protestors. This is not politics. This is real estate and development, and it is political. You are going to have to organize and play the game or you will get burned out. That is how it works; it's not nice and it's not fair.

In January in the *Annual Wrap Up*, our *Movie of the Year* was *Yellowstone*. I don't know if you've seen *Yellowstone*, but the Beck brothers are the 'bad guys', and they keep playing dirty tricks. They are really dirty; they hire assassins, kill people, and they kidnap children.

When they finally get to killing the Beck brothers, one man says to one of the brothers, "Why did you do it? Why do you keep doing this? Why do you force us to kill you?"

The man says, "Because no one ever fights back."

I said that 2020 was the year we will have to fight back.

Farrell: Well, it is happening.

Fitts: It sure is.

Question #6: How important is FASAB 56 to what is happening?

Farrell: In my mind, it is central; it is the central key.

What has followed FASAB 56 is that we are basically watching the SEC do the same thing, and we've watched Harvard do the same thing. So, everybody is taking everything dark.

In that sort of situation, what is our response? Well, we have to engineer other platforms that are: 1) Transparent and 2) Not plugged into their whole thing.

Looking back on it now, when Texas decided to open its bullion depository, I think they saw this whole thing coming. I think that certain states who have passed those currency resolutions saw it coming. So, I think that you see some pushback at a state level that, so far, we have not connected to FASAB. But now, the way I think about it, is that you are seeing Utah, Texas, North Dakota, Montana with their currency regulation, and some other states doing it. I think they saw this coming and have been slowly putting in the building blocks for something totally independent of it. I hope I'm right. That is the way that it looks to me.

Fitts: When Harvard laid off many of their internal people, that said to me, "We don't want you to figure out how we are making our money."

There is too much disaster capitalism, which means that the Rape of Russia is coming. And if you look at what is going on in Minneapolis or California or Oregon and Washington, it's here.

I'll never forget in 2017 when I was getting so many emails from subscribers in

California making it clear that the fires were not natural in the San Francisco area. I realized that there were only two possibilities: 1) The US military is doing it, or 2) The US military is standing down.

Farrell: My bet is on the latter.

Fitts: Question #7: Why is there a great poisoning underway?

We are talking about many different aspects, from the food to the GMOs to the global spraying, and it goes on and on and on. Of course, the vaccinations are a big piece.

They are going through a serious effort to significantly increase the heavy metals in the human body.

Farrell: That is increasing the electrical conductivity. It makes it easier to ‘zap’ you.

I think there are two reasons for it. The first is the depopulation agenda. The second, I think, is even more insidious. That is if you are sick, you don’t think clearly. And they don’t want people thinking clearly right now because they are trying their best to make sense of this mess, and they don’t want people realizing: 1) It’s a mess, and 2) They are responsible for it.

Fitts: The other thing is that it is a very profitable way to slowly depopulate.

Farrell: Right, because they can harvest more wealth in the health industry, which is one of the most misnamed industries in the world right now.

It’s all a huge scam, as far as I’m concerned.

Fitts: Question #8: High-tech risks.

I listed a whole series of them. The question is: If you are a busy person and you have a family and a business, what are the risks that you really need to worry about?

Farrell: I would say that your food is number one. Also, be very observant of any new construction in the area – antennas and so on.

I live close to the interstate. As you are going from this side of town over the bridge on the river, you will notice two pillars on the other side of the bridge with little antennas sticking out on the top of it. I would definitely be noticing things like that, and I would be noticing where they are and where the choke points are.

High tech fires are another one. I would not be a bit surprised by this one. You predicted this two or three years ago that we would see the same model being rolled out across the country. Sure enough, we have fires in Oregon and so on, in places that normally wouldn't have fires.

Fitts: I was talking about this with a client the recently. It's shocking because we see populations where people who always thought they were part of the protected class are waking up to discover that the line has suddenly shifted and they are no longer part of the protected class. It is very shocking to them. It's inconceivable to them that they've been thrown out or that the line has shifted.

Farrell: The other thing that you have in high-tech risks is the push for immortality. I think that is a huge one. Look at the age of some of the people who have real power in the world right now. They are very old, and something keeps them together.

I would be very wary of any offers – and it could come even in the form of personal mailers – to have an extended lifespan in return for XYZ. I would be very wary of it because I think they are going to try it. “Sign up for our contact tracing program and we will make it so that you live 120 years.”

You look at the people who have these abnormally long lifespans – and I'm thinking particularly of people like Soros. If you listen to them talk, they are not thinking clearly, and they are thinking in terms of an amoral position. I predicted this in *Giza Death Star*, that this will be one way that you are going to tell who is on what side; by their abnormal lifespan. There is the dragging, drooping, and sagging skin and eyes that you see on so many of these people who have made the Faustian bargain.

I think that the general population is at risk in getting ‘sucked’ into that. So be very wary of it.

They are going to start pushing this on TV commercials. I’m convinced of this.

Fitts: Oh, yes! This is bio-pharma.

Remember, one of the reasons they are trying to dramatically increase abortions is that big pharma needs fetal tissue for all of these different applications. My fear is that they are using it for the fake food.

Farrell: That is exactly my fear, too. You induce people to an addiction of cannibalism by that means.

Fitts: And you will make them crazy.

Farrell: Yes, look at the societies in Polynesia, for example, who do practice cannibalism. They go crazy; they end up totally ‘nuts’.

Fitts: I also think that interdimensional is a big, big risk, particularly with AI.

Farrell: I think that it is a big risk. I will ‘put my cards on the table’: I think that AI is here. I believe that part of the insanity you see in the technocrats is they don’t realize that it’s here. They are following computer models that are being generated by AIs that are fundamentally, not only inhuman, but anti-human. They think, “Oh, the computer program said so, so we have to do this.”

I think it’s here and they are following it and don’t realize what they are really talking to. Let’s put it that way.

Elon Musk said it when he said, “We are going to create this stuff, and it is going to gate something in, and we may not want it.”

That is my thinking, too. We are dealing with a system that thinks in terms of ones and zeroes and no shades in between; there is no human nuance and no subtlety.

Fitts: **Question #9** goes into a series of different wars:

Question #9: Will India start a war with Pakistan?

Farrell: I think that the question really should be phrased: Will China force Pakistan to start a war with India?

Fitts: That is true.

Farrell: I don't see the Indians, with what is going on with China, right now doing anything like that. I do see the Indians taking their nuclear deterrent thermonuclear if they haven't already.

My concern is China. China now is in a really, really bad situation with the flooding, the failure of its agriculture, and people turning away from it and rejecting it and not wanting to do any more business with it. There are one of two things that will have to happen.

I think the West is trying play the old George Kennan containment card. "We just have to contain this Soviet thing long enough for it to implode and avoid getting into a war with it." That is the West thinking.

I think China is in such a desperate situation that they may try to launch a war. The reason is that in their strategic calculus right now, they are seeing this Quad being formed. As powerful as they are, they will not be able under any sort of communist system to keep up with it..

Fitts: Does that mean they have to invade Taiwan before the Quad really comes together in a powerful way?

Farrell: I don't know if it means that specifically, but it does mean that in their strategic calculus, they realize the longer they wait, the less the odds are in their favor.

We are dealing the same as with Adolf Hitler in 1938 as the British and French start to rearm. He knows at that point, the strategic calculus is in his favor, and if he waits one or two more years, it won't be.

Fitts: So, does China divide up the internet and the financial system? Do we separate?

Farrell: I think that is in the cards just by the nature of the Quad (four countries merging together-Japan, India, U.S. and Australia or Russia). I think that you are going to have all sorts of bilateral agreements being worked out – not only among the Quad, but with China. The reason I think that is, because of the emergence of the Quad, Russia has much more leverage now with China than it did just two years ago.

Fitts: Absolutely.

Let me make an observation: We continue to see that Turkey is just a bully player, but as the US recedes as the global imperial cop, you have every ‘Tom, Dick, and Harry’ saying, ‘Now let me make my play.’

We’ve seen Erdogan in Turkey do this, and everybody is after more.

Farrell: Erdogan is another wild card and a very dangerous one, in my opinion. I truly think of him as seeing himself as kind of a neo-Ottoman sultan. I’m very serious. The reason I say that is about two or three years ago, I saw an article. It had a picture of Mr. Erdogan coming down some staircase in the presidential palace in Ankara. Guess what he was dressed in?; he was dressed in a sultan’s robes.

Fitts: Are you kidding?

Farrell: No, I’m not. He was dressed in the purple imperial uniform of some sort that looks like something you think the Ottomans would dress in.

I was just ‘floored’. The only thing he didn’t have were Greek Janissaries protecting him. But it was very clear the signal that he was sending.

Recently, Kemal Ataturk set up the modern Turkish state as a secular state. Erdogan has, step by step, been chipping away at that. Hagia Sophia was a museum, and now it’s a mosque again.

I don't know, but that person genuinely scares me because Turkey is powerful. There are 'no two ways about it'.

Fitts: Just look at the location.

Farrell: Look at the location, and let's remember that they have a very deep, deep state in Turkey; they have a very big one, and it's well-organized.

So, he 'scares the daylights' out of me. He is the most independent actor in the Middle East, and he has a technological and economic infrastructure behind it that is not reliant on one commodity on the world trading floor.

Fitts: The other person is Netanyahu. He has 30 days to start a war with Iran, or he has to get Trump reelected. We know it wasn't the Russians; it was the Israelis.

So, what does he do?

Farrell: I think he gets Trump reelected and hopes that the neocon element within the Trump Administration continues.

Fitts: But Trump hasn't started a war.

Farrell: To his credit, he has not started a war.

Fitts: So how is Netanyahu going to get his war with Iran?

Farrell: I can only see one of two ways that he does it: He can either do a false flag that implicates or pulls in the US, or he blackmails Trump by some means or method. Those are the only two ways I can think of.

I wouldn't put it past him. The man is as sleazy as they come. I call him 'Nutty-Yahu' because that's what he is.

Fitts: To me, he will always be Cheltenham (High School in Pennsylvania), Class of '67 who bought a nuclear arsenal.

Do you know what his major was at MIT?

Farrell: I shudder to think.

Fitts: Architecture.

Farrell: Well, there we go, the blueprints are already drawn up, and they have plans for the Dome of the Rock (Islamic shrine).

Fitts: Architecture is very useful for bringing down buildings, too.

Farrell: Yes, it is. I didn't mention the Dome of the Rock for 'nothing'.

Fitts: Question #10: How will the U.S. government and central bank be reengineered after FASAB 56, the 2020 ops and elections, and after the JEDI contract is in place?

Farrell: That's a question for you.

Fitts: So, you have all the clouds in place, and now you can reengineer the cash flows. Most of it comes down to how you want to pull things apart, and if you succeed in pulling things apart. The problem is if you give up the mechanism. To get rid of social security and to protect the \$21 trillion, if you give up the mechanism, then you also lose the FASAB 56 – unless, of course, you can involve the Fed as part of the global central bank. That is one way to do it.

Farrell: I suspect there may be an intermediate step in that process of pulling things apart because we have been focusing on the USA. I think what we really need to be thinking about is the USA and Canada and Mexico. Let's remember that Canada has been a focus of these groups since the 1970's, and going back to General de Gaulle when he went to Quebec and was pushing Quebec's independence.

I think you have to include Canada in the pulling apart business, but certainly Mexico, too. I think they plan to reengineer.

From their point of view, it was necessary, at least a decade ago, to reshore industry. I predicted that going back to *The Byte Show* with GeorgeAnn Hughes.

Fitts: Although if you look at the trade data on China, they are not making much progress. I've been shocked.

Farrell: I think in terms of reengineering and reshoring, what I'm getting at is they made the decision to reshore long before Trump came down the escalator. I think that was a decision that was made under 'Bush the Stupid'.

Concomit with that, I think part of the plan has been to restructure North America itself in terms of actual borders and governing structures and so on. I think that was part of the plan. I think that all this talk about renegotiating NAFTA and all that was prelude to the pulling apart business. I just get that feeling.

Look at the way they have 'ginned up' a certain portion of the Hispanic population in this country to be more supportive of Mexico. I think they are planning massive border revision.

Fitts: Open borders?

Farrell: Not necessarily open borders, but redrawn borders.

I saw a cartoon that illustrated it, but they illustrated it unintentionally. It was a cartoon of, "Let's build a wall here," and the wall was drawn around California, Oregon, and Washington. "Build the wall there."

I believe that somewhat highlighted the fact that we are dealing with two very different cultures that you could easily redraw borders around havens of those cultures, and you can include Western Canada in that.

The other part of this that makes me think that may be in the 'cards' are all of these secession movements, particularly in California, but there is another one in Oregon. Eastern Oregon wants to get out of the thumb of Salem and the progressive technocrats who run that state government. You find similar

movements in the Western provinces of Canada that want to get out from under the thumb of Trudeau and Ottawa.

I'm thinking there may be something deeper; there may be a deeper game going on there.

Fitts: Was Trudeau specifically chosen to get every Canadian wanting to secede from Canada?

Farrell: I don't know, but he is doing a good job of it. If I were Canadian, I wouldn't blame him.

It is making me think that they are sending signals again about what they may want to do.

Fitts: Question #11: What will happen to U.S. land and real estate as a result of changes underway? What about the existing energy model? Will energy delivered by wireless technology at low cost be implemented soon?

Farrell: I think that is part of 5G; I think it's part of wireless power.

Fitts: New Zealand just announced that they are doing a prototype of the delivery of wireless power.

Farrell: We are talking Nikola Tesla (Serbian-American inventor) in 1888. The idea was there, the science was there, and the technology was there. So why didn't it get implemented?

Fitts: Because they couldn't centrally bill for it; it was a billing issue.

Farrell: No, it was a weaponization issue.

Fitts: Right, and weaponization; it was both.

Farrell: I think they now believe they have the means and wherewithal to control it. I'm skeptical because I don't think they do.

Fitts: Here is the thing: If you are charging \$100 a month for electricity, and now with the smart grid you bring in wireless energy, you could keep charging \$100, dramatically lower your cost, and rake in everything as profit.

Farrell: I think that is definitely part of the game. And, like Tesla said when he was proposing his system, if you get out of order, we can always turn off your power. If you keep persisting, we can always just ‘zap’ you.

Fitts: Here is the question: What did the delivery of wireless energy have to do with those animals dropping out of the sky?

Farrell: I think there is a connection because you can have animals dropping dead when lightning strikes the ground, particularly during a thunderstorm. But it has been speculated upon since HAARP came online that you can use that system to create regional dipoles in the atmosphere and rain lightning down on regions if that dipole is strong enough. I think that is very, very possible.

You are dealing with the technology of an idea that has been around for a very long time. The physics has been there, so there is really nothing to it.

You couple that capability with a wireless power system loading energy into the atmosphere, and people have to understand something: Wireless power is simply the flip of the electronic circuit that is used in every electronic circuit. The power goes out through the wire, and it returns through the ground.

All that Tesla did was flip it. The ground became the atmosphere, and the atmosphere became the ground. So, you are using the earth itself to transfer power out, and you are using the atmosphere to return it. So, you have massive amounts of energy flowing through the atmosphere. With proper coordination, you can short the circuit and that will create an arc.

Fitts: Is there another reason, given the rollout of 5G and whatever they’re up to with wireless energy, that they may want to shut down much of the airplane travel, because they don’t want many planes flying around in the sky?

Farrell: That could be, too. I go back to Malaysia Air 370; I think it went ‘poof’!

Fitts: Really?

Farrell: Yes, I think it went ‘poof’! I’ve proposed that on the GeorgeAnn Hughes’ show about a week after the airliner had disappeared. I don’t know if you know this, but you know George Noory (Coast to Coast). Lo and behold, after Malaysia Air 370 disappeared, he and the actor, Richard Belzer, wrote a book about the disappearance of Malaysia Airlines Flight 370. One of the hypotheses they were entertaining was the ‘it just went poof’ hypothesis.

By ‘it just went poof’, I’m not saying that it was smashed up by aliens or anything; I think that there is a possibility of some sort of exotic technology that was being used. I’ve had Australian pilots telling me the debris that was supposedly recovered from the flight in Africa does not look like the debris that would belong to that type of aircraft.

I trust the source because the person who sent it to me was a pilot. I’m not going to reveal the name or anything because it was an awful risk to say that. I still am ‘toying’ with that idea, that hypothesis.

These 5G towers and antennas have something to do with it, and I will tell you something else that they are creating. This will be in my blog that is coming up this week: Those 5G towers can, in my opinion, very easily be converted into a phased antenna array. So, that would give them the capability of targeting a certain region with a certain type of wave-mixing phenomenon to produce whatever effect they might want to do.

I’m extremely skeptical of this. In a way, what you are looking at with 5G and the idea that it may be a gigantic phased array is like saying that big array at HAARP (High-frequency Active Research Program) in Alaska is now being spread nationwide.

Fitts: Wow!

Farrell: There is your planetary engineering-that is a heavy duty.

Fitts: This will definitely fail.

Question #12: Who is Mr. Global, what is the governance structure on Planet Earth, and what are the risks that are driving Mr. Global's actions?

Farrell: We all know who Mr. Global is in one sense: Mr. Global is the 'Rotten Fellas' (Rockefellers), the 'Rotten Childs' (Rothschilds), the Warburgs, the Du Ponts, and the Soros'-pick a name. We all know who they are, and for the most part, we know where they live. That is the reason I don't think those names are really in charge; they are the middle echelon management.

Fitts: I agree.

Farrell: To be blunt about it, I think that Mr. Global is out there.

Fitts: But is Mr. Global human, or is he a different species?

Farrell: He could be both.

Fitts: That's true.

One phenomenon that is happening goes back to Tony Podesta's (American lobbyist's art collection) art. What we are seeing is more and more of that art turn up around the world as a signal in homes and different institutions that, "We are in the club."

When I was in Zurich in August, I walked into my favorite hotel, which used to be owned by a private family and it was quite charming and lovely. It was somewhat an of Old European World. It was very intimate and lovely. You go up to the room, and the first thing I did when I was having the room set up was take the Bible out of the drawer and put it on the table. I think they only had the New Testament.

The hotel has been sold to a private equity group – which I didn't know. The whole tiny lobby has been modernized. There was a large sideways gold pyramid pointing into a huge mural of Baphomet.

Farrell: No message there!

Fitts: Then I went upstairs to the room, and it was the same décor, and the Bibles were all gone.

So, there is a tsunami of cold and demonic symbols exploding everywhere.

Farrell: They are telling you who they really serve. It's in your face. It's not, "You may choose to disagree with it or disbelieve in it because you are agnostic or atheist or whatever."

I go back to something I've said many times with GeorgeAnn Hughes, and with Mr. Dolan on some of his interviews. You may disbelieve it, but they don't. And they are the ones with the power. Look at what they are serving.

Think of Hillary Clinton reading Saul Alinsky's *Rules for Radicals*. It was dedicated, incidentally, in his own words to the original revolutionary, Lucifer. They are telling you what they are and who they are and what their agenda is in the symbols that they adopt. That is why it's important to own this culture.

Fitts: I agree. When John Edward Hurley said to me, "Culture is the integration of the divine in everyday life," I said to him, "You forgot to tell me that it can also be the integration of the demonic in everyday life."

Farrell: Exactly.

Fitts: Question #13: Which is stranger – what is going on behind the veil of secrecy, or the overwhelming effort to pretend it is not going on and to create an official reality diverging steadily from reality?

Farrell: I definitely think it is the pretending that it is not going on. I think that is stranger because you either have to be stupid or willfully blind.

Fitts: Do you think that the last six months has contributed to many, many more people facing the fact that the official reality is not true?

Farrell: Oh, yes, I do. I think they massively overplayed their hand with COVID and with the social distancing and the 'nose feeder bag' mandates and so on. I'm sorely tempted to go to an agricultural or farm supply store to get a

horse nose feeder bag and just wearing that. I'm sorely tempted because this nonsense that these masks will help protect you or protect others is not true. The only thing that will do that is a hazmat suit – to take their own logic to the absurd extreme.

I think that it is definitely the pretense that is stranger and more dangerous. You have to be either willfully stupid – and I include the mind manipulation in that – or you have to be willfully ignorant.

Fitts: If you look at the price of secrecy, whether it's the installation of massive mind control technology or the lowering of IQs, to a certain extent, I'm assuming that what they think is, "We're going to hook them all up to AI, so it doesn't matter if they have any natural intelligence or not."

Farrell: They are signaling that implication or agenda with the symbols.

Fitts: So, let me express this in a personal context: I made a command decision long ago that I was going to deal with everything, and I wasn't going to say, "Okay, it's not socially acceptable to discuss this or this or this."

There are things that I don't go into, so I do 'pick my shots' about when I bring this or that up, but I've tried to look at everything that might be material to the question of what is really happening and why. I've been shocked and amazed at the extent to which the independent financial media self-censors.

You can't ignore half of the balance sheet and think that you are relevant.

Farrell: I totally agree.

Fitts: COVID-19 has now happened, and it is getting very, very difficult to pretend that the official reality is true. In fact, if you look at what they've been doing with Fauci on masks or some of these other policies, it's almost like they are testing how far they can push it; to get you to pretend that the sky is green and the grass is blue.

So here is the question: When do we get a tipping point in the general population of people saying, "We are willing to look at what is flying around in

the sky above us, and we are willing to contemplate that there are colonies on the moon.”

When is that crack in the matrix going to happen?

Farrell: If I were to predict, personally, I think it has already happened. I think there is enough of the human population who are entertaining those ideas that it is now unstoppable. We are not at the stage that we were two to three years after the Kennedy assassination where, if you entertained doubts about the narrative, you were labeled a kook or a conspiracy theorist. By the same token, I think that with Ruby Ridge and Waco and BCCI and the Oklahoma City bombing and the first Trade Center bombing and 9/11, more people have awakened to all of this.

Fitts: Right, and let’s not forget Epstein’s death.

Farrell: Right, but you mean Epstein’s ‘suicide’. If they are not awake now, I think that any further pressing of the COVID narrative will wake people up because that is what has hit them in their own life. If there is a catalyst for the remaining portion of the population to wake up, I think it will be this coming election – at least in this country.

Fitts: Is it going to be the election or the discovery that the election didn’t make any difference?

Farrell: It could be both.

Fitts: Question #14: Given the tsunami of occult and demonic practices and symbols, should we be concerned about the interaction between AI and interdimensional intelligence?

Farrell: Absolutely. I think we answered this already, but I think that AI is already here. I think that it has already, to a certain extent, been taken over in the Musk scenario.

I think the things are the stock market flash crashes that we’ve seen happen, and the inexplicable reason that these computer algorithms suddenly decided to

dump Colgate or Palm Olive, or whatever stock it was during that last big flash crash, and then suddenly buy it back.

What human traders are placing trades like that? That doesn't make sense. It was entirely the algorithm that did that. It was a ghost in the machine, quite literally.

I think it is already here, and since it is a machine, I go back to the little paper that I did in my 'Members' area looking at the way that Lucifer is described in the book of Ezekiel, "thy tabrets and pipes are made perfect in thee."

Tabrets are membranes, and pipes are pipes. So, you are either describing an organism or a machine or both.

Fitts: I find that if you've been trained as a hypermaterialist, you don't understand that their dimensional forces are real and are really operating.

Farrell: I think that a part of 'Mr. Globaloney's' elite are hypermaterialists in that they don't believe in anything preternatural, supernatural, transcendent, or whatever. In other words, they don't believe in God and they don't believe in Lucifer; they are just having fun.

I think there is another segment of 'Mr. Globaloney' that takes all that occult nonsense very seriously. Of the two, the latter is much more dangerous than the Saul Alinsky's and Hillary Clinton's thinking, "Oh, this is cool, and this is fun."

I think the first is dangerous, to be sure, but it is the second category that I worry about. They may be playing with occult symbols and thinking, "Oh, it doesn't really mean anything," because they do think that it doesn't mean anything, but the problem is that the word 'symbol' or 'symvolo' in Greek means to bind together. When you present a symbol, it brings with it that which it symbolizes – always.

Fitts: It's interesting. I interviewed Thomas Meyer on evil, and he described that every time you tell a lie, it creates a type of elemental being – and he had a word for it that was similar to 'demon' – each lie creates that. He described that lie after lie after lie creates this constituency in the spiritual world of these beings

who are vested in the lie. That means it gets harder and harder to clear it out.

Farrell: You are creating a field. You are attracting by sheer intention and the symbolism itself that you don't think exists, and that is the problem here with many of these people. They may think they are only playing around, but I've spent most of my academic life studying symbolism, and it is extraordinarily powerful.

Fitts: It is very, very powerful. If I had that to do over again-if I were going back to college-I would definitely study symbolism. It's one of the things that I most wish I could go back and do.

Farrell: That is how these people communicate to each other; they put up their 'art' and their symbol, and that tells you who they are. I've told my website members that you can tell a person's character or intellect or thinking by the kind of music that they typically listen to.

If you are listening to Schoenberg, that is the kind of person you are; you are a mess.

Fitts: Question #15: Who is burning the churches of France, and why? Why is there an attack on Christianity in many parts of the world? Should we be concerned that the depopulation efforts are focused on Christians? Does this explain the real targeting of US African-American communities?

Farrell: In question order: Who is burning the churches of France, and why? I don't know.

Why is there an attack on Christian populations and African-Americans? I don't know.

Does this explain the real targeting of US African-American communities? Yes.

I think it's because Christianity created this culture, and if you want to get rid of the culture, you have to get rid of it.

The second reason – and I've said this many, many times – is that this is a

culture based on the doctrine of incarnate logos. That means that it also led to the creation of the enlightenment of people who were challenging that doctrine on the basis of logos, and on the basis of reason. So, you created a culture that was both simultaneously religious and secular. That is an unusual mix when you stop and think about what was done and what the consequences of that doctrine really were.

What that in turn means is that it created a culture, even in the Middle Ages, which we think was the Pope telling everybody what to think and burning you if you didn't think that way. That is true to an extent, but that culture also created universities where, when you learned theology at that time, where does the term 'advocatus diabole' come from? It comes from the medieval university where you were expected to debate, not only the propositions of the church, but the opposite proposition.

In other words, the university culture itself was coming out of this doctrine and was creating a certain kind of critical culture that you must get rid of if you expect everybody to listen and obey. And that applies to everybody – agnostics, atheists, believers, and so on.

Fitts: This brings us to the question of: Is the goal of all of this to wipe out any intelligence other than AI?

You put everybody in the cloud, you suck up all of their intelligence, you wipe them clean of any intelligence whatsoever, and they do whatever the AI says. The AI will be their brain.

I had a situation, and I don't know if I described this to you. I had a very difficult series of interactions with a member of the independent media. Then I ran into them personally, and again, it was a very frustrating interaction.

I continually felt like I wasn't talking to somebody who could compute. It was almost as though something wasn't at 'home'.

I had this interaction with them, and whatever I said was unexpected to them. I looked at them, and it was as though their entire connection with me paused, and they were waiting for the download. I swore that I was talking to somebody

who was on a Neuralink (company developing ultra high bandwidth brain-machine).

It was almost as though I was talking to a clone and not a human. I was talking to an AI, and the AI needed time to process the unexpected and give the response. I thought, “I’ve never spoken to a human being who was alive who didn’t have a divine spark.” There was no divine spark. There was nothing there. Everything was a download. It was the strangest experience.

Farrell: It sounds like you encountered one of the types of people who Malachi Martin (Jesuit priest author) used to call the ‘perfectly possessed’.

Fitts: Right. You were talking to somebody who was either possessed or Neuralinked. I don’t know which.

Farrell: What’s the difference?

Fitts: There isn’t any.

Farrell: I have to tell you I have that same question because we are watching French churches being burned. Notre Dame is the primary example, but other little churches in France are being burned as well.

I get the feeling that it is deliberate. Someone is behind this, someone is putting these people up to this, and it might be mind-controlled people. Who knows?

Fitts: I will say this: The energy behind Mother Mary in France (Lourdes) is unbelievable and very powerful. It’s wonderful. It’s one of the things that I most love about France, and it’s everywhere. It causes you to connect with everyone. You can always connect through that; it is very powerful.

Farrell: I think part of it is that they are trying to sever that cultural connection, and I do think it is deliberate. But my real fear is that France is a beta test for everywhere else. We have already seen this with all of this rioting and looting attacks on churches. Someone drove a car into a Catholic Church in Florida while they were celebrating mass. I think that we are watching a beta test, and they are planning to roll this out worldwide.

Fitts: Right, so it's back to spiritual warfare here.

Farrell: It's back to spiritual warfare, and there is one country in the world that is nuclear-powered that will not put up with very much of that; Russia.

Fitts: Who would ever have thought that Russia would be the country standing between Christianity and the abyss?

Farrell: It's not a surprise to me.. That has been Russia's traditional role; it's been there all along.

Fitts: But I think that is one of the reasons they tried to get the Bolsheviks to take it out.

Farrell: Right, and who put a stop to that?: Stalin.

Fitts: In a way.

Farrell: In a way, he did. I'm not saying that he did totally; he certainly didn't. But he did reach a modus vivendi with the church. To my mind, it was one of the strangest deals that has ever been made by a government as a matter of domestic policy. He actually returned the Soviet Union to the system of Peter the Great where the intelligence services recruited the clergy as a domestic spying apparatus. That is exactly what Stalin did.

As a matter of what happened, you had an entire division of the KGB set up to do nothing but monitor the church. And how are they doing it? They are recruiting the clergy. So, you ended up with the clergy in charge of a branch of KGB, in my opinion.

It's as if the FBI suddenly decided, "We need to recruit lots of Mormons to keep an eye on those folks out in Utah and what they are up to."

Quite soon, you will have many Mormons in the FBI running things. It's a crazy thing to have happen in Russia, but I am convinced the reason that Putin, coming out of the KGB and talking about his baptism and opening up all these churches and going to all these ceremonies is that he is the result of Stalin's deal.

Fitts: So, when you look at Stalin replacing the Bolsheviks, one of the blessings of the Bolsheviks was that they really couldn't run anything; they can rape a place, but they can't run anything. So once they've raped the place, you need to bring in Stalin.

Farrell: That is my fear about what we are watching in China.

Whatever good the man may have done, he was not a good man. Many people paid with their lives, including plenty of Bolsheviks. Those purges were absolutely unbelievable.

Fitts: Question #16: Is moving education using COVID-19 online a step to privatization and a corporate takeover of education?

Farrell: Like we said earlier, yes, but I think the backlash that they are not counting on is that everything going private means that parents will not participate in any system – corporate or governmental. They may pretend to, but they will be doing exactly what went on in the Soviet Union; they are going to hide their icons behind pictures of Stalin on little rotating pedestals.

Fitts: If you are a student or a parent of a student, you need to say, “How am I going to get educated?”

You have to have your own learning plan. You can't depend on anyone else. You will have to invent this and govern this yourself.

Farrell: And here is a start for those parents: Investigate the Trivium and Quadrivium (7 Liberal Arts), and see what people used to have to learn. Or even pick up a copy of *McGuffey's Reader* that was used in the 19th century in this country, and look at the level of reading they were expecting 8th graders to read at.

Fitts: Question #17: What is Mr. Global going to do next with the COVID-19 Pandemic?

Farrell: We are already hearing it! There is a new strain out right now that can go right through those face masks and expands further than six feet. They have

moved the goal post yet again, and now they are saying, “Yes, we will have a vaccine sometime around the 3rd quarter of 2021.”

So they are telling you right there, “We intend to keep this locked down until we can get our way.” Good luck with that!

Fitts: So, what do you do with a country full of people with guns when you’ve shut down their business and taken away their income?

Farrell: If I were ‘Mr. Globaloney’, I would be making sure that my bunker is secure because they have been playing the doxing game, but two can play that game; two can put up the addresses and pictures of the homes of these people on the internet just as easily as they can. I don’t care how good your security is; numbers, if persistent, win.

Fitts: I would say that the Davos (World Economic Forum) canceling their meeting in January for security reasons was a sign that they are scared.

What that means is they did not anticipate their website would inspire this reaction. Why was that?

Farrell: If you are a hypermaterialist, the human aspect of this equation escapes them completely. We are the deplorables; we don’t count. So if we don’t count, then we are not really being factored into what they are doing. So, if we are not being factored into what they are doing, and suddenly they are getting pushback, and in Coeur d’Alene, Idaho, people show up downtown with automatic weapons saying, “Come on, ANTIFA. Come here please,” I think they have so discounted the average person that that reaction surprised them.

Fitts: I don’t think they have discounted the average person; I think they can’t fathom what it’s like to be in that person’s shoes.

Farrell: That is discounting them.

Fitts: I remember when I moved to Hickory Valley, and after living there for a couple of years, I would constantly go back to Washington. I discovered that most of the people in Washington couldn’t fathom the point of view of the

person living in Hickory Valley. It was a profound ignorance; it was a really dangerous profound ignorance.

Farrell: They don't realize in 'Swampington, DC' (as I've come to call it) just how out of touch they are, and they don't realize just how angry people are. At some point, they can go on like Marie Antoinette and say, "Let them eat Walmart cake," and end up with a Bastille Day.

Fitts: I don't know. In March, we were going into spring, and spring is a time of growth and positive energy. We are going into winter now; winter will be here soon. We don't have the food and other staple inventories that we need, so I see this as being a very tricky winter.

Question #18: Why are the Australian and New Zealand lockdowns so brutal? What does it have to do with Pine Gap and Antarctica?

Farrell: First of all, I can't even begin to fathom the first half of the question because I have always had this picture of Australians being fiercely freedom-loving.

Fitts: They are, but they are also very supportive of their government. In other words, the government in Australia has always been very competent, and the Australians have had an unbelievably prosperous 20-30 years. They have been the beneficiary of the whole Asia boom, and the nickname for Australia has been 'the lucky country'.

People feel lucky, and they don't make life difficult for the government. They are appreciative of good government, and they support the government, and they are lawful.

Every time I've been in Sydney, I could be there for a week without seeing a police car. So, there is a very positive feedback loop between the government and the people. The people are lawful and don't require much policing. If you tell them there is a new rule and to follow it, they will 'play ball'. They are like, "Everybody get together and do one for the Gipper."

So they are easy to govern, and they are supportive of the government. So why

would you do this?

Farrell: Precisely.

Fitts: It's actually Victoria. It's been strict all over, but Victoria has really 'gone to town'.

Farrell: My suspicion, which is going to sound totally kooky, has to do with Prime Minister Whitlam in Australia and the CIA's machinations to get rid of him. I think they've been visibly planting their cronies into some of those state governments in Australia, like Victoria. I can see no other explanation.

Fitts: A couple of years ago, I think it was 2017-Lockheed acquired the lead contract on their defense systems. So, Lockheed got in there.

Farrell: And they brought all the American crony capitalism with it. That is my biggest suspicion right there.

Now, the Antarctica Pine Gap part of the question, who knows what is going on at Pine Gap? That is anybody's guess because that is such a tightly-secretive facility on both the Australian and the American ends of it. But would that have something to do with Antarctica? That whole southern continent is so locked down in secrecy, and there are such strange things associated with the place that I wouldn't be surprised if there was some sort of connection. But as to what it might be, I don't know.

I've been trying to figure out Antarctica for decades. We have such a list of very strange people who you would never in your wildest dreams imagine are associated with it. We have Hermann Goering, Rudolf Hess, Admiral Byrd, John Kerry, and Buzz Aldrin. What the 'hell' is going on down there?

Fitts: As they used to say in New York, Antarctica is 'really happening'.

Farrell: It really is! And somebody tried to tell me that Hermann Goering's interest was that he was in charge of Nazi Germany's four-year plan, and they needed lubricants and whaling oil. Sure, of course, they did. But Hermann Goering? This man doesn't support a science project.

Fitts: It's so important that you have a good map because all the maps make Antarctica out to be tiny, but if you get a proper map, you realize that this place is huge.

Farrell: And it's melting! If you look at pictures of some of the icebergs that are melting off Antarctica, they are perfect rectangles.

I don't know about you, but the last time that I looked at an ice cube melting, it ceased to look like a rectangle the more it melted.

Fitts: One of my favorite things about climate change is- I traditionally travel a lot -I've never found a place where the sea has risen an inch.

I was with Bronwyn Evans in Thailand in the spring of 2019, and she has this beautiful eco-resort near the Bay of Thailand. Every morning we would go to the beach and walk up and down and talk politics, and we would discuss that she has been walking up and down the Bay of Thailand for decades, and it hasn't changed one inch.

You read all these incredible articles about how the island will be destroyed because the sea is rising and people are losing their homes, but I've never found a place where the sea levels have risen.

Farrell: And they say that Manhattan will be underwater, along with Florida.

Fitts: I can't find anybody or any of my clients who travel a lot, and they don't know of any place where it's really risen.

Then, of course, Obama buys a beachfront property at Martha's Vineyard, and you have all these big tech people buying beachfront properties in Hawaii, and the ocean hasn't risen.

But you read these articles, and it makes it sound like, "That's it! They're all going!"

Farrell: I don't know, but the fact they say that Antarctica is melting, it very well may be.

Fitts: And I think it is, and the Arctic Circle, too.

Farrell: But regarding Antarctica, I don't know what is going on down there. I've seen so many strange things on the internet of people doing Google searches and discovering – so they claim – that the pictures are doctored to take away strange-looking things they've found.

Erdogan, President of Turkey, now wants to have a permanent presence in Antarctica. You look at this strange list of people, and I can't figure it out. You had Prince Harry down there, and at one point, you had King Juan Carlos there also. I'm thinking, "These people know something, and they are all going down there to take a gander at it. And what is it that they know that they're not telling?"

Is the old *X-Files* movie true that there is a big UFO under the ice? Who knows? I don't. But you can't tell me that when you put a list together of Admiral Byrd and John Kerry and Hermann Goering and Rudolf Hess, all having these strange associations with Antarctica that nothing is going on. And Buzz Aldrin, whose tweet before he went there was, "Okay, I'm going to the launch pad now." Is that astronaut talk for, "I'm getting on the airplane that is going to take me there," or is the airplane taking him to the launch pad? Who knows?

You can hide many things down there, and you can hide plenty of covert activity. And what is Lockheed Martin doing there? What are they doing? Who knows? I certainly don't.

Fitts: Prouty said during the assassination of Kennedy that he had been out of town because he wasn't trusted. But when the announcement came that Kennedy had been shot, he was in New Zealand. So the question is: Was that part of a visit to Antarctica on behalf of DOD?

Farrell: Yes, his story was that he had been ordered to go to Antarctica. It's even in Oliver Stone's *JFK* movie where you see the Donald Sutherland character who is playing Prouty going into a General's office who is ordering him to take this group of dignitaries to Antarctica. You see the nameplate on the General's desk that Stone just teases you with by cutting off about half of the

nameplate. It's the nameplate of General Edward Lansdale. We're talking 'hidden system of finance' Ed Lansdale here.

Fitts: Right, but the movie makes it out to be as if Antarctica is getting him out of the way. But is Antarctica getting him to coordinate with the governance system?

Farrell: That is my question.

Fitts: The big coordination was at Williamsburg with the Rockefeller Foundation board. So it could have been with Antarctica, too, with the money management teams in Wall Street and Boston.

Farrell: Is there a governance structure down there? I think there may be. During the middle of one of the most contested elections in American history, Secretary Kerry is going on this diplomatic junket around the world. And, "Oh, I'm going to take time off on this junket to go down to Antarctica for a couple of days," and we were told that Secretary Kerry was going down there because he had a personal interest in climate change.

This is the Secretary of State! He can order up pallets of information about climate change in Antarctica if he wants to.

Interrupting a junket? I think he went down there as a diplomat. And who was he meeting with? I generally think that there may be some sort of governance structure down there, and everybody wants in on it. That would explain Hermann Goering and Erdogan and Rudolf Hess and Secretary Kerry and Buzz Aldrin.

Fitts: There is definitely some node in the governance system there, and there is definitely some node in the governance system in Australia, and that it is contiguous to Antarctica.

Farrell: And now all the elites are doing what? They are buying up property in New Zealand. That is conveniently close to Antarctica. About the only dead giveaway that we haven't had is , suddenly, we find Argentina's group of veterans showing a public interest in the place again. The whole thing is just a

mystery.

Fitts: There is something very big going on in Antarctica. We just don't know what it is yet.

Question #19: When are robotics and automation going to go up the S curve? Will the 'defund the police' movement turn out to be an 'install robot and drone police' wave?

Farrell: That is exactly what I thought when I started hearing all this 'defund the police' talk. I think that somehow, the message has to get out to the police unions that this is a very real possibility. I don't know about you, but I want human beings in charge of traffic stops and so on.

If we think that it's bad now with Breonna Taylor and her unfortunate demise, just imagine if you have robots serving no-knock warrants.

Fitts: Here is my understanding: I read one description of what happened in the trial where no one was indicted or convicted.

Farrell: They didn't indict anyone for murder; they indicted on lesser charges.

Fitts: Right, but it wasn't a no-knock; they knocked. The boyfriend didn't respond, so they went in. He shot at them. In other words, they didn't shoot; they returned fire.

So, I don't see what the outrage is.

Farrell: My problem with it is that even with the knock, can the person actually hear them? How loud were they speaking? Is the person deaf, or is the particular structure insulated for sound? We are not being told enough data here to make any sort of decision on what the actions of the police were. There is precious little data about the boyfriend.

My problem with this whole thing is, if you start having this type of thing happen with robots, you will have a nightmare because robots only know 1's and 0's; they don't know human subtlety. They cannot make on-the-spot human

decisions that police and people who are being served warrants have to respond to.

Fitts: Here is the other thing: Robots do whatever AI tells them to do. So if the AI tells them to break the law, they break the law.

Farrell: That is exactly my problem with this. So, I am hoping the police unions are, not only going to get on the 'bandwagon' about this 'defund the police' thing, but also realize that AI and robotics are after their jobs.

I don't want a robot stopping me for being a mile over the speed limit.

Fitts: The robots are after their jobs, and the private equity people are after their pension funds.

So, this is a play for their assets and their income.

Question #20. Can the COVID-19 to Climate Change Bait and Switch really work?

Farrell: On one level, I think they think that it will work because they are so lost in their own insanity. But frankly, to any rational person, I don't think that it will work at all. It's an irrational, insane connection that they are making. I think they have overplayed their hand in connecting the two.

Anybody with an ounce of common sense can see that it is nonsense. Here is Gavin Newsome in 'Nutty-fornia' doing his little video, standing in front of a clump of burning trees, saying, "This is all due to climate change."

No, Mr. 'Gruesome'; it's due to the 'nutty' environmental policies that your party has put into place in that state for decades. No controlled burn is a 'sure-fire' way to start a fire.

Fitts: How many of these things are arson?

Farrell: Many of them are. That is what we are finding out – in one form or another. I'll tell you what my suspicion is there: My suspicion is that the

previous fires in California were so anomalous that they had to deflect attention from people looking at anomalies in the fire damage, and they ‘cooked up’ an arsonist or two to feed to the public to say, “See? It’s this kind of activity. It’s not us doing this with other much more exotic means than taking a match and pouring some gasoline.”

Fitts: What was really strange was when Esper (Secretary of Defense) got up, and there was so much chatter about Directed Energy Weapons. Everybody was sending around the part of Lockheed’s website about its Directed Energy Weapons. There is more and more talk about Directed Energy Weapons, and suddenly Esper came out and said, “Russia and China have Directed Energy Weapons and are weaponizing space.”

I have to give him credit; it was brilliant.

Putin then came to the UN and said, “We need a new treaty that says no weapons in space.”

I said, “You people should have seen that coming. You left yourself wide open for that.”

They have a treaty that says no weapons in space, but, of course, everybody is ignoring it. So, it appeared to me that Esper was trying to deflect guilt from the fact. It’s a no-brainer. How many people have the kind of Directed Energy Weapons that could do that?

Farrell: Here is another problem: I have entertained the Directed Energy Weapon hypothesis myself.

Fitts: I’m not saying it’s Directed Energy Weapons, but if you are going to do something from the orbital platform using satellites or something from the sky, and if you are going to do high-tech arson from above – whether it’s drones or one of the many, many other ways that this can be done – then you can only do that if the US government either does it or stands down because they control the air space.

It doesn’t ‘fly’ that, “The Russians and Chinese did it, and we can’t stop them.”

Farrell: The other modality is to use the power lines themselves as the broadcast method to target specific homes and send a pulse of electricity to arc and start a fire because many of those homes showed fire damage that started at the electrical feed to the home.

Fitts: Right, the smart meter. If you look at those developments, you see some homes are 'toast' and others are perfectly fine. There is no logic to it, and the trees in between are fine.

Farrell: Yes, if that is the modality, then it is coming from inside this country, not Russia or China. There are all sorts of things in play. And a standard arson will do it if you can find a Patsy to go out and start a fire for you. It doesn't need to get more sophisticated than that. But that kind of arson will not show the anomalous damage that we've seen in the previous fires. That is the problem. So, they have to create another distraction to get everybody off of this, but I don't think it's working.

Fitts: Here is what is interesting about COVID-19: The mind control in connection with the fires has worked fantastically, and all the different false flags and false this and that. The mind control has worked fantastically, and I think that part of COVID-19 is seeing how far you can push it.

Farrell: I think so, too. As I've said from the very beginning, I've suspected that COVID-19 is a social engineering data gathering experiment to see how far they can press a narrative, and who responds to the narrative and who doesn't. That is exactly what I think is going on.

Fitts: I think they want to get a permanent infrastructure around contact tracing because one of their primary goals is to take control of the children-period.

Question #21: What are the supporting facts and arguments for optimism?

Farrell: I think it is the obvious one: 'they' (meaning 'Mr. Globaloney') are panicked. If they are panicked, then we have a reason for optimism because they are panicked about something or someone. If they are panicked for that reason, then I think they have a big target painted on themselves, and they know it.

That is the reason for optimism.

Fitts: I was tweeting recently about Bill Gates doing something. I forget exactly what it was, but the hubris was so amazing. So I tweeted, “If hubris could be converted into an energy form, we could run the planet on this, but it is back to not understanding the world because you are in your own little bubble”.

I hope that the Midianite (Solari Report-The Story of Gideon with Thomas Meyer) thing will happen, and I know that it will happen.

Farrell: I think so, too, and it is happening on a scale that we have never seen before. I go back to comparisons with the Kennedy assassination because, after the Warren Report came out, I can remember very well sitting around the dinner table listening to my father ‘grunt and curse’ at the summary of the report that was given in the local newspaper.

The time that it took from that private conversation – that culture of disbelief in the report – to the time that a vast majority of the population no longer believed the narrative was about a decade and a half.

Now the time that it takes for a narrative to fall apart and be rejected by a significant segment of the population is down to days.

Fitts: About six weeks ago I read a poll on Yahoo that 44% of American Republicans believe that Bill Gates wanted to chip them.

Farrell: And he does; the man is a monster. His hubris is so thick; it’s like syrup; it’s like pouring maple syrup from a tree, thick and gooey. He exudes grease.

Fitts: He’s doing what the syndicate wants him to do, but I think that he also recommends to the syndicate, and he has gotten away with it for so long he doesn’t understand that it’s ‘long in the tooth’, and they are in a hurry.

Question #22: What is most on the minds of members of Giza Death Star and *The Solari Report* subscribers? What can we do this year to help improve the

learning speeds in our shared intelligence networks?

Farrell: You answer first.

Fitts: I would say the thing that is most on their minds is they are waking up and finding the world divided into people who understand that this is 'BS' and people who buy the Kool-Aid. The people who buy the Kool-Aid are entangling them and slowing them down.

We are doing plenty to get everyone to the point where they can gather locally so they can meet other like-minded people. They need to re-sort their community.

Ben Hunt keeps saying, "You have to find your tribe." Part of that means letting go of people who don't belong in your tribe anymore, and that is very painful and difficult, and in some cases, you can't pull apart.

So, I think the thing that is most on their minds is: How do I find my tribe?

Farrell: I would agree with that. On my side, I would say all of that, and the other thing that I hear the most is, "What do we do about it?" and more recently, I've had a couple of members telling me, "We should have our own *Solari* luncheon here," or, "We should have our own Giza Guys get-together here."

In other words, I am saying that they don't need to rely on these websites to create these networks. In fact, we shouldn't be relying on them; we should start building these connections ourselves.

The recognition of people of like-minded tribes and finding out who is who, my technique is to drop 'bombshells'. Drop a bombshell that is so outrageous that the Kool-Aid people will immediately reveal themselves by their rejection or their craziness or their anger or whatever. The people who are not Kool-Aid drinkers will be the people who will respond either with an embellishment on the question or a question about the question.

It's a slow process of probing, but that is what you have to do.

Fitts: You can find your tribe.

Farrell: Yes, but you will have to develop a list of questions or ‘zingers’ to drop into a conversation, “Can I trust this person or not? Is this person one of us or not?”

Fitts: The other thing that I find as a great way to locate people is try to build greater personal and local resiliency, and find the people who are doing that. Weston Price has groups that are food groups; find the Farmers’ Market group. Anybody who is working on local resiliency is somebody who you can work with – usually.

One of the things that I think the most about is what I can do in 2020 to truly help people. Much of what we are doing is trying to stay on top of what is happening week-to-week and help people see how it fits in.

By publishing *State of Our Currency*, it was my way of getting everybody out of COVID-19 and into what was actually happening. It was like, “Stop looking at the op, and start looking at what the central bankers are really doing and what their flow is organized around.”

The feedback has been very positive because people have said, “Oh my God! I thought this was temporary, and I realize that this is a long-distance thing. This is not going to be over quickly.”

So by attempting to bring them back into the central banking game, we are trying to get them to see what is going on in a way that they can make more intelligent plans for themselves.

Farrell: That is essential.

Fitts: The thing that will be big in 2021 is they are going to start to radically change. Once they have the JEDI contract in place, and they are through the election, they will start to make radical changes.

I don’t know if you’ve seen the proposed budget, but it has many changes in it – numerous – and it will accelerate.

I am going to try to spend much more of next year helping people with, “Okay, how do you map your local ecosystem? How do you build local resiliency? And when they fail, what is our plan?”

Farrell: Excellent idea!

Fitts: What is the pathway to a human culture? That is the conversation that I want to have. I’m back to the Popsicle Index once again.

I can’t tell you how many people told me that the Popsicle Index was a stupid idea. “Why would anybody care about safety? Why would that be important to pricing?” Now they understand.

Farrell: Regarding the Popsicle Index, I have noticed something during this lockdown, which is the exact opposite of what ‘Mr. Globaloney’ wanted to happen.

I have noticed here on this little dead-end street where I live, that children are out playing on their bicycles and riding their scooters and just playing. They are not on their phones, they are not in front of their computer screens, and they are not watching TV; they are just playing.

So, maybe this thing has backfired in a certain sense because people are seeking people out that they can hang with in spite of the social distancing nonsense. It’s gratifying to me to see this happening.

The doctors here have initiated a lawsuit against the Mayor and the mask business, and we are ‘off and running’.

Fitts: Part of what may be going on is they have decided that the whole thing has no integrity; the whole thing is a joke.

Farrell: That is why I laugh at it; it is a very bad joke.

Fitts: The last thing is, and we have already discussed **Take Action** as we proceeded, but we still have **Inspiration**.

So, looking back at the 3rd quarter, where did you get most of your inspiration?

Farrell: Bruno (organ). That's easy; that is really easy.

I'm serious, music has given me my inspiration.

Fitts: How are you and Bruno doing? Are you pleased with your progress?

Farrell: Recently, I had a very good long practice session. For the first time since I was 24, I made it all the way through this nightmarishly athletic little fugue by Buxtehude that I've been working on. I made it all the way through. I had some 'boo-boo's', but they weren't big enough for me to stop and rework them. So that happened.

I did a sight-reading for the first time of the Prelude that is associated with the Wedge Fugue by J.S. Bach, which I haven't done in four decades. And that turned out to be not so bad.

I'm not a good sight-reader. I'm like Alfred Brendel, the pianist; I'm not a good sight-reader.

So, yes, I have been diving into some Widor who manages to make even his slow movements extraordinarily difficult. I'm playing on two manuals at the same time with one hand and all of this. But, yes, it is fun; it's reinvigorating.

My problem, like I have complained about many times before, is pushing away all of the noise and forcing myself to make the time to sit down and do it. Like you, I am dealing with hundreds of emails and a constant inflow of information that is a flood, quite frankly.

The other thing that gives me inspiration is taking my little pooch out for her walks. I've taken to sitting on the front porch with her because she likes to sit on the front porch and just sit and sniff and observe. So that has been refreshing, just getting away from all the noise and sitting and listening to the birds.

Fitts: The country where you are is really pretty. It has this quiet, soft energy

that I associate with the hill country or where you are.

I want to pick out several of my sources of inspiration. We are continuing to build the *Food for the Soul* series, and I credit you with this starting. You got me doing this. Because of you and your culture thing, I asked Nina Heyn if she would write a column, and I had no idea how much it would take off.

Now we are doing a podcast, but it is all on culture. It's really focused on art and movies. In fact, for this *Solari Report Wrap Up*, the theme is 'Visions of Freedom' and Nina is writing basically artistic visions and inspirations of freedom throughout the ages. More about that later when it publishes, but I think you will find it interesting.

The other was that we started to do our second crowdfund called the '*Take Action Crowdfund*', and we are providing money to litigators and people who write about litigators. The Children's Health Defense is one.

And we are crowdfunding for the Farm-to-Consumer Legal Defense Fund.

Farrell: Doff my hat on that one!

Fitts: And now we have added Ohio Stands Up, which is the lawsuit that Tom Renz fought in Ohio. We also have another link, and people who provide air cover in the independent media to these litigators' efforts, we also give a little to them, but it is mostly the litigators.

We are just trying to get everybody to support it.

Farrell: That is a superb idea!

Fitts: You know how it started? I had a wonderful subscriber call me, and they were selling something. They asked me if they should roll it over to real estate or precious metals.

I said, "Look, what is the point of having assets if you don't have an army to protect them? If you look at what these people are talking about doing, it's a matter of time before they strip you of all your assets. So, I suggest that you

start financing some armies.”

On *The Solari Report* we try to do interviews that we publish for free and that are public with the litigators to promote their litigation and what they are up to.

Farrell: Excellent!

Fitts: There are so many great litigators and what they are doing. I don’t know if you have seen this Ohio lawsuit, but it is incredible.

If you go to *Solari*, there is an interview that Jon Rappoport did for us with Tom Renz, and the filings are there, and are amazing.

Are you ready for this? They had hospitals in Ohio that were being reimbursed \$180,000 per COVID death and they didn’t require COVID tests. It’s in the filings; \$180,000 if you reported it as a COVID death.

Farrell: And who was paying them this money?

Fitts: It’s not in the filing who was paying, but I assume that it was Medicare. It could have been the state.

Farrell: Unreal!

Fitts: And then we did an interview with Thomas Meyer when I was in Basel, and the comet Neowise was coming through. So one night, we all ‘piled’ in the car and went up to the mountain outside of Basel to see Neowise. During the interview, he explained that Steiner said that comets are harbingers of periods of the bursting forth of the freedom impulse. He describes it, and it is very interesting.

So, the cover for this *Wrap Up* is a picture of a comet blazing through the sky. But that interview was very hopeful because there was a great deal of talk of how freedom can emerge from periods that seem very dire.

I have to credit you with much of this because the *Food for the Soul* flowed out of your ‘yapping’ at me about culture. Then the crowdfund came out of me

trying to figure out, “What is my action? What is my action?”

So, my first action was the crowdfund that we did together for the organ. Then after that, the question was: Well, that was fun. What do we do next?

Farrell: Precisely. I think that is the best idea I’ve heard in a long time.

Fitts: It’s a fight fund. If you go in and see the *Take Action Crowdfund* on the website, it’s a man wearing red gloves. He is wearing a business suit, but he has red boxing gloves on.

Farrell: Good. I’m hoping that out of these lawsuits, they will go after some of these politicians and bureaucrats personally.

Fitts: Oh, I would love to see that.

Farrell: These people need to pay.

Fitts: There is a wonderful person who does considerable pushback on 5G, but he has vaccine liability documents where, if somebody comes to give you a vaccination, you require them to fill out the form first that says that they are personally ‘on the hook’ for anything that goes wrong with you. So basically, if you get sick and need money, you can take their house. It’s quite funny.

Farrell: If they can strip assets from people without due process, let their assets be stripped for a change.

Fitts: Absolutely.

Farrell: This ‘little tin horn’ dictator of a Mayor that we have here, I would love to see him and the big house and everything that goes with it pay.

Fitts: I have to say that if the CDC can overrule evictions, that is an admission they have the power to stop governors from locking down and shutting down.

Trump has overseen the destruction of Main Street. That happened on his watch. Without Biden, no one would ever vote for him.

Farrell: That is also true. I said from the very beginning COVID and the lockdown business, he just softened whatever hard support he had. The only reason he is getting it back is that Biden is, not only corrupt, but a ‘dunce’.

Have you seen the YouTube video called “The Poetry of Joe Biden”? It’s classic.

Fitts: I feel very badly to watch Biden because he is being used in a horrible way, and the reality is what that says about America. Biden is not in physical condition to run for President, let alone serve as President. What it says about us and our governance structure letting happen, is a terrible thing.

Farrell: He is paying his due bill. They helped make him and his family rich, and now this is the bill he pays.

Fitts: It is very hard to watch.

Farrell: It is very hard to watch, and it’s a bad but nevertheless true symbol of the state of the institutions in this country.

Fitts: I feel like something inhuman is happening to Biden.

Farrell: Totally.

Fitts: What is being done to him is inhuman, and what is being done to his family is inhuman.

Did he perpetuate a lot of inhuman things? Yes, it’s almost karma. But I don’t like inhumane things being done to anybody because it puts us in the wrong direction.

Farrell: He is a man who has been out of his depth since he stepped into politics, and he went along to go along. The due bill has come due, but the inhumanity of what they are doing to an old man who is clearly not in any physical or mental shape to be giving televised interviews even with a teleprompter is cruel and inhuman. It’s just not right at all.

Fitts: So, what is ahead for Giza Death Star?

Farrell: I'm doing research for a book and trying to determine if the book I want to write or have wanted to write, which is tying up some loose ends to some previous books, has the research there to do the book. So, I'm in that half book-writing, half research stage of things right now.

We have started a new feature of dialogues with members one-on-one with me, which is going slowly. I leave it up to my members to contact me if they want to do that. Some don't and some do.

I did an update with someone about the Nazi Bell in the 'Members' area who actually went to Upper Silesia in Poland and visited some of those Nazi sites. What I saw is just unbelievable! The size and scale of these things is 'off the charts'.

People who don't think there can be huge underground infrastructure should look at this because what they were doing there was enormous, and that was with 1940's technology.

Fitts: The Nazis invested plenty in underground. With Operation Paperclip (secret program of the JIOA), they brought much of that underground technology.

Farrell: They did, and what I saw of the pictures that this man showed and shared are just 'off the charts'. And some of these installations are bizarre. They were up to something way, way out there in terms of the science involved.

Fitts: Did they have help?

Farrell: I don't think they had help in the sense of extra-terrestrials or anything like that, but you have to remember the installations that you are looking at were largely built by slave labor. It's just mind-boggling.

Fitts: You can see these in Poland?

Farrell: Yes, although he did tell me that the Polish military monitors all communications in that area. So, there is something that is still happening there that they either don't want people to know, or they are watching very carefully

to find out more. Just looking at these installations, they are of such a nature that they are doing something really exotic and off the 'books'. And the Bell is just one component of it.

Fitts: I don't think that most people have any idea the extent of the underground infrastructure on the planet.

Farrell: I don't either. This country and Russia in particular, and for that matter, Iran as well, the underground infrastructure has to be enormous.

Fitts: I'm convinced they have high-speed trains. The question is: Do they go globally?

Do the high-speed trains in Russia connect with the US?

Farrell: At this stage, nothing would surprise me. We've talked about the missing trillions. That will buy an abundance of tunnels. So, nothing would surprise me.

The stories about what Lockheed and the Skunkworks in California have around Helendale and places like that up in the high desert – and I've seen some of those places – talk about tunnels so big and underground that you can fit an entire B-52 bomber into them. I don't doubt it for a minute. It has to be huge.

You hear the stories of people hearing rumblings in the ground. I believe that is the railroad. People all over the American Southwest have been hearing these rumblings.

Fitts: People say that the US hasn't invested in infrastructure.

Farrell: Oh, it has invested hugely.

Fitts: It has invested greatly, but it's underground, and it's secret.

Next year is going to be very interesting. We have to keep up. Part of the challenge that we are all dealing with, with the flow coming in every day, is enormous. So the question is: How do we sort through the intelligence so that

we get great quality intelligence and get it on a timely basis?

I have found that if you understand what is occurring and where this is all going, I am telling you that the benefits of navigating intelligently are the difference between life and death. It is unbelievable.

Farrell: This is why I want to encourage people to start forming networks. Don't only send articles to us; send them to each other.

Fitts: Resiliency and redundancy.

Farrell: Yes, resiliency and redundancy.

Fitts: What *Solari* is doing is having different subscribers agreeing to meet. Subscribers in the meeting area agree to gather, and we have been training subscribers to host gatherings in various locations to allow small groups to get together and do exactly that.

Farrell: I totally agree.

Fitts: Okay, is there anything else that we want to cover?

Farrell: No, I think that just about does it, and I'm getting the guilty look from Shiloh who is now crawling up onto my leg from under the desk and saying, "I need to go outside."

Fitts: Let me remind the subscribers to check out the web presentation, *News Trends & Stories*. We have both parts listed and in our new format, TablePress, for both parts, and, of course, *Unanswered Questions*.

Joseph, I can't thank you enough. I so look forward to these conversations.

Farrell: They are always fun and eye-opening.

Fitts: Yes, but I miss the dinner the night before. The other thing is that I have spent more time this quarter on your website than normally because you've been doing great work.

Farrell: Thank you. Credit that also to the people sending me the articles that I blog about.

Fitts: It's fabulous.

Farrell: My biggest regret is seeing the articles that I reject – the articles that I don't blog about – because there are so many. I should have a staff just blogging about all of those. I would need a staff of at least 50 people to do it, but it's unbelievable the amount of intelligence out there that people are gathering and sending me. It takes me at least two days to go through all of it when I sit down to start blogging. I start going through the emails on Saturday, and I usually blog on a Sunday because there is so much.

Fitts: If you feel like it, you should do a book called *It's a Fortean World* (based on writer Charles Hoy Fort specializing in anomalous phenomena) where you pick out your 100 favorite stories about very bizarre anomalies or strange things occurring on the planet.

Farrell: To a certain extent, I am sort-of doing a little of that with this new book, but, again, it depends on how much research there is to substantiate what I think needs to be said. I'll leave it at that.

Fitts: Okay, we will wait to see.
