Catherine Austin Fitts: Welcome, this is Catherine Austin Fitts, and I am recording this on April 27, 2021. I want to have a serious talk with you about Solari Circles.

If possible, make sure that you read the three articles on the *Take Action* section of the web presentation for *Take Action 2021*. You can link to the web presentation from the commentaries at <http://TakeAction2021.Solari.com>. You should read these before you listen if you can.

The first is ‘Loosen Technology’s Grip on Your Mind’ by Corey Lynn. We discussed that last week on *The Solari Report*. It’s part of getting mind control and related addictions and the technology trends out of your life. It’s one thing that a Circle can help each other do, but it really helps to have that done before you get serious about doing a Circle because too much of the technology in your life can absolutely sabotage and destroy any organizational effort, including a circle.

The second is ‘Solari Circles: Take Action Together’ by attorney Carolyn Betts. Carolyn is someone who worked with me at Hamilton Securities and has been through the entire evolution of *Solari* and *The Solari Report*. She has participated in one of the Circles. We were in an Investment Circle together.

The third is ‘With Solari Circles Take Action at the Local Level’ by a former city manager, Gary Heckman. He has written some excellent pieces about local action before. Gary has a wonderful feeling of what it takes to make a municipality go and how citizens can organize and participate in making sure they get the best possible local leadership. He has written an excellent piece, as all three have – Corey, Carolyn, and Gary.

These are three great pieces that can really help you understand some of the important parts of effective action at this time.

What is a Solari Circle? A Solari Circle is a financial action club. It’s designed to help twelve or fewer members take action for their individual and mutual benefit.

The three things that a Solari Circle can do:

- Education or intel. Mr. Global has intelligence agencies. We need to do the same for ourselves. This can be in many different aspects, including: What in the world is going on? What are the changes upon us? What can we do about it?
- Taking action to affect changes in the lives of the members regarding to their finances and all of the different related risks that can affect our finances from health and what is happening locally on a political basis. It can include culture, philanthropy, activities. These days, the financial risk is deep and wide.
- Pooling money for making investments. This can be private equity, it can be the angel network, or it can be an investment club, but it is consistent with acting in a way that supports free and inspired living for the members and hopefully raises our literacy about protecting our finances from organized crime, troublesome bank, corporate conduct and policies, and on and on.

Finance and health right now are very intimately connected. I have an expression that I call ‘the great poisoning’ in which most people and families are exposed to a rising level of toxicity. Whether it’s GMOs, processed foods and sugar, or fluoride, spraying pesticides, plastics, injections, pharmaceuticals, EMF radiation, you-name-it, I do believe that there is great pollution happening on the planet, and I think it’s the number one source of most financial problems for both individuals and families.

Our watchword is ‘disintermediation’; we are trying to intermedicate. We’ve been intermediated by large institutions – whether big corporations or governments or financial intermediaries and institutions. Our goal is to get the ‘big guys’ out of our minds, out of our pocketbooks, out of our balance sheets, out of our wallets, and, if possible, build much more local resiliency and protect individual sovereignty and independence.

Our goal is that you should live a free and inspired life. Much of how you do it and what you do depends on where you are and what you want in this world. We can’t tell you what your purpose is, but the goal is to help each other achieve

it.

A big question is: **Should you do a Solari Circle?** The most precious thing you have right now is your time. You must invest your time effectively and wisely, but before you attempt to organize with others, whether it's a Solari Circle or in any way, you have to make sure that doing so is a wise investment of your time. That means that the scope of what you are going to do is feasible and offers you and the other people personal benefit, that the people are trustworthy and committed to generating that mutual benefit, the management process is practical and competent, and the goals are in balance with skills and time commitment.

One of the biggest mistakes that I see groups of all kinds make is that they have very aggressive goals without sufficient time or resources to achieve them. So, things can get frustrating.

Before you consider doing a Solari Circle, please appreciate that the only reason to do it is that you expect it to increase your ability to live a free and inspired life – both now and in the future – and help others do the same. If it's not going to do that, don't do a circle.

I finished reading a book that a wonderful subscriber recommended by Napoleon Hill, the author of *Think and Grow Rich*. I am going to write a book review on it. It's called *Outwitting the Devil*, and it's something that we will be doing plenty of these days.

In the book, Hill is grilling the devil. He says, "In what way may caution be used most advantageously?" They are discussing caution.

The devil answers, "In the selection of one's associates and in one's method of relating oneself to associates. The reason for this is obvious. One's associates constitute the most important part of one's environment, and environmental influences determine whether one forms the habit of drifting or becoming a non-drifter. The person who exercises due caution in the choice of associates never allows himself to be closely associated with any person who does not bring to him, through the association, some definite mental, spiritual, or economic benefit," at which point Hill asks, "Isn't that method of choosing

associates selfish?”

The devil answers, “It is sensible, and leads to self-determination. It is the desire of every normal person to find material success and happiness. Nothing contributes more to one’s success and happiness than carefully chosen associates. Caution in the selection of associates becomes, therefore, the duty of every person who wishes to become happy and successful. The drifter allows his closest associates to attach themselves to him on their own terms. The non-drifter carefully selects his associates and allows no one to become closely associated with him unless that person contributes some form of helpful influence or bestows some definite benefit.”

When you think about doing a Solari Circle, that is very good advice.

Why should you consider doing a Solari Circle? I would submit to you that right now we have started into a process that I describe as ‘World War III’. This is a war; the war is spiritual, the war is cultural, the war is financial, the war is legal, and the war is biological.

A small, effective group of allies well-organized for individual and mutual benefit can significantly increase their chances of successfully navigating that environment. This is a very dangerous environment, and I think it has the potential to get much more dangerous. That means that there is benefit in organization in dealing with food, with health, with shelter, with energy, with income, with risk, and in many respects, but most of all, crime management.

Let me tell you some of the reasons you should not do a Solari Circle. I’m not here to promote Solari Circles unless it is going to give you energy. If it’s not going to give you energy, I don’t want you to do it whatsoever. There have been many periods in my life when I’ve had to stop organizing and trying to work with other people and go it alone.

Reasons not to do a Solari Circle. There are many situations where you don’t want to do a Solari Circle. Here are some of the reasons you don’t:

- You don’t want to do it because you feel that you ought to do it. Never think that you ought to do anything. Your time is your most precious

asset, and you should only use your time in ways that have a very high return on investment to you.

- You never want to get caught up with the wrong people or too many people. If you haven't heard my discussion of 'The Story of Gideon' with Thomas Meyer, I would recommend it. The moral of the story is that you don't need many people, but you need faithful, competent people. I don't care how small your Circle is; you have to get your Circle down to the people who know how to act in accordance with any kind of process of individual and mutual benefit.
- You don't want to bring in people who increase your risk. There are many people in this environment who are not faithful or they are not competent or they are not ethical, and they will dramatically increase your risk. You can have ten great people and one 'bad dog', and the 'bad dog' will blow up the whole Circle.

I was talking with one great subscriber about Circles, and he said, "They are great if you can survive the dropout stage. That is when you prune out everybody who can't play."

I used to have a partner who would say, "Before you do the deal, get together and send the scared guys home."

So, you have to think very significantly about who is in the Circle and who you can build trust with. Do not do a Circle if you don't have a group of the right people.

I think that for many people, as you will see as we get into this report, the Circles that start now are Circles to get a Circle. You create a group with people in your general area, and meet them and get to know them, and keep your focus small and simple while you see if there are one or more Circles that can emerge from the gathering and the getting together and the meeting of other *Solari Report* subscribers in your area.

Framework. I want to give a framework for the different kinds of Circles. A Circle can be online or in person. I did one Circle by phone. So, you can be

remote, or you can be local, or you can be a combination of both. You can meet online or by phone or in person, or some combination and variation thereof. You could have an online group that supports a group of people who meet locally.

I want to underscore that online has zero privacy, and anything online is monitored. Everything online is read and subject to AI and mind control. So, I would be very, very careful about what you do online.

Your online group may be a way for you to meet other *Solari* subscribers in your general area or region. Once you meet and get to know each other, then you figure out how to get together and communicate by carrier pigeon or other methods. But I would be very careful about how you use online; appreciate that there is no privacy there.

Focus and Functionality. You can be education and intelligence, or you can be action or investment. I think that it is very important to start small and very modestly. There is much that a Circle can do to help get a better understanding of the world, including digesting and helping each other digest much of the different *Solari* materials.

In Carolyn's article, she gives a long list of different ideas of how you could help each other, but you want to keep it practical.

Her first item is to watch documentaries or read *Solari Report* articles together and discuss them. I was part of a group that watched documentaries, and then we would discuss them. It's similar to a book club, but with videos. It was a great way to get to know each other, and it worked.

One of the reasons it worked was that we always had a big pot of soup. So we would have soup, we would watch the documentary, and then we would talk. It was a great way to 'cut the ice' and get to know each other.

There are many topics we are all dealing with that are highly complex. The best Circles are ones where you can get one of everybody. For example, have a doctor, you have a nurse who can help with health material, then you have a scientist who can help with all the different scientific issues, and then a plumber

and an electrician. We had a great one where we had a gun expert who helped us with all the different issues of owning and caring for firearms.

If you can have an attorney and a CPA and a financial person, or an open source IT person, that is fabulous. If you can have a local banker, that is great. So, think of all the different expertise and knowledge you want. If you can get a trustworthy person in all of those different areas, it is remarkable.

It doesn't have to be in the Circle; you can invite people to give you presentations or to give you a lecture. You can hire people to come in and help everybody with their switching to open source software.

There is an amazing amount of ways that you can use a Circle to build the intelligence that you need. If you look at the complexity of being excellent in all of these different areas, there is no way that any one person can do it by themselves.

For the last year as we were grappling with understanding what was happening with COVID-19, the fact that the *Solari Report* had so many smart scientists, doctors, and nurses helped immensely.

Don't discount the notion of the benefits of not being alone. There is a great new movie I recently watched. It's called *The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society* about a group of people who had a book club on the Guernsey Island during World War II when the Germans occupied the island. It was a way of staying human in a very difficult environment.

I had a dinner Circle in Tennessee where we helped each other understand how to live a more resilient life, whether it was designing and planning an orchard or starting a garden. There was a great deal on food and gardening.

I would almost always start with education and intelligence because it's a way of getting to understand each other's point of view and learning more about each other. If you are going to have material benefit for all the people in the group, you need to understand the group and the people. So if you want to start small, it's a great way to begin. I think it's through education and intelligence that you begin to find the actions that benefit everybody in the group.

As you read Carolyn's article, she gives some great examples of the different things a Circle could do to take action. One is a savings club where you literally shift your deposits out of the banking system and put it out on your personal network in what is called 'a hand'. It's a savings process that the immigrants use to build deposits for buying a house or buying a car, and it works very well.

When the litigation started, I always talk about the fact that when the litigation started, I had given or loaned \$250,000 to various individuals, family, and friends. It was that \$250,000 that came back to me over the next eleven years. It was the one source of money that the Department of Justice couldn't shut off because it was in the 'people bank'. The first thing I did when I settled the litigation was take a large amount of the money that came in, and shot it back to the people bank. I said, "I've learned my lesson. It's the people bank that I trust."

We have many subscribers who want help learning about precious metals. I find that doing either a savings club with precious metals or just working on helping each other purchase precious metals is a great topic that lends itself to this kind of action group.

Community action is the topic of Gary Heckman's piece. There is an infinite number of things to be done in any community, and I would start with Gary's piece and some of his links. The real power here comes when you can start to take action locally.

Schooling and children are a big one, particularly with COVID. In many countries and many places, you will have to homeschool or start new schools. The government schools are simply not safe. You don't want your children getting hooked into being dependent on a social life in an environment that is going to teach them all the wrong things and get them developing all the wrong habits.

Another one is food, and I am extremely concerned – both because of price inflation and quality control – about the future of food. I think it's incredibly important to line up your local fresh food sources now.

Health, of course, is important. There all sorts of financial and estate planning ones. Healthcare proxies are a big one. Then, of course, there is bartering and sharing tools or purchasing clubs. I'll talk a little more about that later.

There are an infinite amount of actions that you can take. It comes down to working out what is of immediate importance to the members of the group and what has real benefit.

One that I am very interested in is philanthropy and crowdfunding at a local level. The biggest financial drain on every local area I've ever seen is that the local families raise and educate children for two decades, and then they leave and go off and work for the big corporations or big governments in a way where essentially they are building the prison.

We make an extraordinary investment in our young people, and instead of those young people staying in their communities and contributing to building businesses and activities in those communities, they go off and work for those industries that are basically destroying those communities. So, it's a huge negative return on investment to the community.

If we can provide angel capital or financing and working with local business and local teachers and the local banks to provide the seed capital to get the young people starting businesses on Main Street, or buying the existing businesses and upgrading them, I think that will make it unbelievably attractive for young entrepreneurs to decentralize the economy and integrate new technology locally. That is just a fabulous use of both our investment capital and our philanthropic capital. I think that is what can be done with a bit of crowdfunding to make it possible for the young people to contribute locally. I believe it is critically important.

There is much that a Circle can do if they find and build a relationship with a good local bank. No matter how good a local bank is, there are certain kinds of risks they can't take. But if it teams up with a local Circle that can put a little money on the 'plate' and can take the high-risk positions, there is plenty that can be done. That includes helping to build local food systems. Many of the local farmers don't necessarily have the investment capital or the creditworthiness. But if Circles are in a place that needs food and will buy food, and will take

dividends in food, form a good relationship with good local banks and good local businesspeople, a little seed corn can go a long, long way when you leverage it with different networks and relationships.

One of the things that Carolyn talked about in her article was doing Circles for children. Right now, there is an explosion of parents either switching to homeschooling or looking to start new schools or investing in alternative schools because of what is happening with COVID. I think that organizing Solari Circles for young people is a great idea in some situations.

If you go back 100 to 200 years, you will find that many of the kinds of activities that a Circle might do were done with the children. The kids were an intimate part of the fundamental economic survival and resiliency of a family or a community, and they were intimately involved in all of these activities at a very young age.

You can do a Circle only for children, but you can also involve the children in the Circle that you are doing for adults; you have to make sure that they are trained and brought up to protect the privacy and the secrecy of the trust in a Circle.

The last function, of course, is Investment Circles. There are many different kinds of investment opportunities that a Circle can do.

If they involve securities, then you get into what is defined as an investment club, and there are much stricter rules and regulations if you are dealing with securities.

If you are dealing with local real estate or angel networks, it can be relatively rule-free. It depends on how you do it. I'm not going to go into Investment Circles in detail now. There is plenty of material available about them, and in the library you will find one *Solari Report* on Investment Circles and investment clubs. Carolyn and I have both participated in an investment club that worked very well because we had a very sophisticated project manager who had a great deal of experience with investment clubs and was willing to do a fair amount of the work to get it to go.

You can't pay a member to organize and run an investment club, but you can pay someone – or more than one person - for the education or the action club to do certain functions. For example, you can pay a local chef to come in and cook a dinner for the Circle every time the Circle meets. You can also do a potluck dinner, but I think that organizing and paying a local chef to make a great dinner is a real attraction. Everybody has to eat dinner, and it saves a little time, and it gives you a great home-cooked meal. Food is a real draw. I've found food to really help Circles go. The dinner club we had in Tennessee was a potluck dinner, and it worked very well.

Procedures and Rules. I think it is extremely important to spend time before you organize a Circle with the people that you consider doing it with to talk about what your goals are and what the project management process will be to get clear on who is going to do what and how it will work.

Carolyn had a section on procedures & rules, and I would recommend that you read it carefully. I think it's very important to estimate how much time you are planning on investing – both individually and collectively – and make sure that whatever you are planning on accomplishing you have the resources to do it. You need to keep a very appropriate balance between your goals and the specific actions that you are going to take and what you intend to accomplish and how much time and resources you are going to give it.

If I could say anything, I would say to be prepared to evolve. There is one place where a Circle breaks down, and that is if the rules of privacy you have agreed to aren't followed. Have someone who does not break trust. One of the most important things that a Circle will have to do is if you have someone who breaks the trust, you will need to 'prune' the group, and you are going to have to have a process to do that.

I would spend an appropriate amount of time on understanding what the privacy protocols are and making it very clear to everybody what they are. Then, if they are not respected, you need to deal with it. As I mentioned before, you have to go through the downsizing process to get the scared people to go home.

I think that the greatest opportunity is local action, but it takes a good deal of time to learn how the politics and the resources in your local area work. One of

the things that I've found is that it's a very long, patient process to learn about how the money works around you and how the politics works. One thing I've found is that there is always a major payoff to be had, but it could take a year or two of steady learning before you see the opportunity and before you find it. You have to get an excellent map, and have the patience to look for one or more great opportunities.

The richer your map gets, the higher the chance that you will find an opportunity and the higher chance that you will start to see the risks and the 'land mines'. You are going to stop stepping on them because you have a good feel of what is happening.

I've always thought that there were tremendous benefits from learning about how the money worked in the local area. I found that most people quit and gave up before they got to the point where they hit the opportunities. They didn't have the patience, and they didn't have the faith, and I've never been able to understand why. That's why if you can get a member who has been in civil government or who is familiar with local budgets or is a CPA who does the town books – somebody who knows how the money works locally – and get them involved, it is very beneficial.

If you go through Gary's piece, he has some great ideas on how to get involved. I think that one of the easiest things to do is to identify one or two local leaders who are doing a great job, and ask them what you can do to help. I think it can be as easy as identifying the really talented, capable people who are trying to do a great job of leading their area, and trying to help them. It's amazing how, if you consistently and steadily help them with what they need, particularly getting reelected, it can make a big difference.

Solari Support. Let's say that you have read the materials and you've thought about this, and you've decided, "Okay, I want to start a Circle." Maybe you've been trained by Darlene (Operations Manager) in the last year to organize and meet the people in your area, and you thought, "Let's start a Circle and see what we have here," or maybe you have a group of people in your local area and you said, "Okay, I want to start." What can *Solari* do to support you?

There are two things that we are planning on publishing sometime in the month

of May. The first is working on a more sophisticated software package to replace *Subscriber Input*. Right now, at the website, if you have a comment on the commentary and you are logged in, you can just leave a comment. Many people go to *Subscriber Input* only to discuss. As we have grown, the complexity of the discussion has really gotten beyond the software.

We want to bring up a forum that will allow you to create groups where you can focus on specific discussions. So, if you want to discuss what is going on in Ukraine, you can set up a group that is dedicated to that. That will make it possible for specific discussions and topics to get the kind of focus that they want to get and make it easier for people to find the different discussions that have been going on instead of reading back through the long, long thread.

The second thing is we are bringing up a new website at <http://Connect.Solari.com> specifically for Solari Circles started by and for *Solari Report* subscribers. This is where you can create private groups. The private groups can be created by leaders who have gone through the training with Darlene – either in the last year or in the future. Once those leaders have been through training, they can start a group, and they can invite members. If you are invited as a member, then we will put you on the Connect.Solari.com and make you a user, but you have to go in as a trained leader or as a member who has been invited by a trained leader.

You have to be a *Solari Report* subscriber to be on Connect. If you unsubscribe, then you will be unsubscribed from Connect. This will be a place where groups can start private groups. It can be a private group for that region or that place, or it can be a private group for discussion and learning of any kind that you want. It's your Circle; you decide.

I am hoping that this is designed to support groups who will want to meet in person and locally. We have tried to design these two software packages so that they are as private as possible; they are on our servers. But I have to tell you that everything that is online is – in my opinion – compromised.

There was one person I used to do strategic planning with all of the time. We used to go off in the Redwood forest, and we would go so deep into the Redwood forest that we would find a place where there was no cell signal. I

guess now we will have to go underground or in caves – unless you can find a massive faraday cage. If you can find a place without a cell signal, it's a great place to meet.

Think about how you want to participate in very practical ways. I want to walk through some of the areas where right now and in the next year or two there will be plenty of demand.

Not feeling like we are alone is important, so finding other people who are not in the cult is one of the benefits. I think it's been one of the impulses that have gotten people going through the training and trying to meet locally.

Another is if you look at our article on *Coming Clean*, you need people to talk about, "What is this, and how do I do it?" Of course, the big thing is getting the large institutions and corporations out of our finances and live life in a way that reduces your risk. I find it helps to talk with other people about how to do that. It's all part of getting out of the mind control trance.

Finding a good bank or credit union is something that I get many questions about. We have material on how to find a good local bank, but I think that working with a group locally really helps. If you tell a bank that you have ten people who are looking for a good bank and ask them to give you a presentation, they will be tripping over themselves to do it.

Finding great vendors and tradespeople, particularly like-minded people, is important. I don't want anybody in my home who is not like-minded right now.

Some people need help moving jurisdictions. The reality is that if you look at some jurisdictions right now, some are better than others for a variety of reasons. Many people right now are moving, and they have very good reasons to do so.

I think that it's very important right now if you are in a jurisdiction to find out who your good local leaders are and to engage with them. One thing that the Circle can do is identify one or two really excellent local leaders and see how you can support them.

There is a great poisoning going on, and I think that one of the ways that I've seen *Solari Report* subscribers help each other is learning to understand all of the different ways that we are being assaulted with environmental toxins and helping each other protect ourselves and our families from it. If you look at the health and medical and scientific knowledge needed to do that, it's 'mind-boggling'. I think that organizing to do that is very, very helpful. If you have ten people each reading a book and reporting on it, you can cover much more territory.

I believe one of the most important areas is fresh food, and finding and supporting local farmers and helping each other garden or otherwise creating economic fresh food sources.

One way is to form buying clubs. I'm always amazed by this: If you are in a city and early in the mornings at the terminal markets where all the restaurants are buying, the lower prices are unbelievable if you can purchase in bulk that way. Anybody can walk into the terminal market and start buying, but you have to be able to buy in cartons and crates. It pays to organize to do that.

Part of the food issue is protecting against inflation. While the quality of the food system is going down in many areas, the prices are going up. I think that those prices could absolutely explode over the next two to five years. So, whether it's bulk purchases and buying at the terminal markets, or learning how to grow more locally, I think this is a great way to protect yourself against inflation.

Help with children. I think that trying to bring up children in this environment is very, very tricky and dangerous. If you want your children to be safe mentally, spiritually, and every which way, I think that you have to keep them out of most schools.

I believe that organized crime intimidation is a real problem, whether it's coming through government or coming through the political process or coming through private freelance parties or possibly free-range (parenting) crime. There is still free-range crime. This could include finding legal representation – ideally before you need them. This includes political and employer pressure to take COVID-19 injections and passports.

I think that having a group of people who will always watch your back and not let the system target you is important. The system often targets people who let themselves get isolated. A Circle can provide a witness protection program, and that can't happen if you are alone.

A Circle could be working on self-defense. We had a member in my dinner club in Hardeman County who was a gunsmith, and he helped us with the use and care of firearms. One of the local leaders who you might want to pick out is your local sheriff.

I did a book review earlier on Lynne McTaggart's *The Power of Eight*, and it was about groups of eight people combining prayer and intention to help each other with finance and health issues. There is no reason you cannot combine prayer and intention with what we are doing. If you are interested in that, I would suggest that you read *The Power of Eight*.

Our latest movie on *The Solari Report* is *The War Room*, which is a wonderful movie about the power of prayer. I've seen prayer produce miraculous things; there is no doubt about it.

I received a letter about a year ago from a *Solari Report* subscriber who was trying to fight 5G in Arizona. To continue to fight, she was going to have to go very public, which she was extremely uncomfortable with doing. She asked what she should do, and I told her that she should start a War Room and just do it with prayer.

She wrote me a cryptic note a few weeks ago and said, "I took your advice, and I did a War Room with prayer, and it has been unbelievably effective."

I don't know exactly what happened, but you can fight these things. This is a spiritual war first and foremost, so whatever you are dealing with in the physical realm, you can fight it spiritually.

There is no doubt that the cultural aspects of what we are dealing with are very, very significant. Joseph (Farrell) and I always talk about this in the *Wrap Ups*. I find it is extremely important to maintain a high spiritual culture environment. It

is extremely challenging because we live in a world where there is a concerted effort to debase the culture. I once had a wonderful ally, John Edward Hurley, who said that he was giving a lecture at the Smithsonian in Washington on Southern culture, and somebody in the audience interrupted and said, “What does this have to do with me? Why should I care about this?”

John Edward Hurley turned to him and said, “Culture, young man, is the integration of the divine in everyday life.”

I later said to him that I thought that was the best definition of culture I had ever heard. I said to him, “John Edward Hurley, you forgot to mention that sometimes it can be the integration of the demonic in everyday life.”

I do feel like there is an effort to inject the demonic. I believe that in order to nurture an integration of the divine, it helps to have other people – whether it’s small concerts, small theatre, or readings. These are all things that can be done in a home or out in the Redwood forest, if you can find one. But I think that we have to nurture and rebuild the divine and cleanse out the demonic. I don’t know a better way of doing that than organizing with other people to do that.

One of the reasons I love going to Thomas Meyer’s house is when you walk into this beautiful home, and it’s like a cultural sanctuary. People are showing up and playing Beethoven and Bach on the violin or the piano, and there are marvelous Hungarian meals and long walks in the forest. There are theatre skits and readings and discussions and poetry and on and on. Even the Christmas tree decorations are filled with different stories of the mythologies and the traditions that come with this piece and that piece. It’s quite remarkable.

Anything that we can do to nurture and rebuild the divine and cleanse out the demonic is essential as we organize with other people to take action.

I’m sure you’ve heard this before, but one of my favorite quotes from Jon Rappoport is, “Hopelessness is an op, and it’s planet-wide.”

Two of the greatest tools and methodologies of the people trying to defeat us in World War III and end human liberty on this planet are hopelessness and exhaustion. “It’s hopeless. Just give up and obey.”

One of my favorite scriptures is, “Where two or more are gathered in my name, there am I.”

I believe that it’s the divine energy that can come through a group of people that produces the kinds of miracles we need. So I think that whatever the Solari Circle does, it has to energize your faith walk, and it can do so with practical intelligence and action. To have endurance, we have to take action. It has to be practical, and it has to get results, and, again, it has to have individual and mutual benefit.
